SHOW 10-6-13

GUEST: Judge Tracie Hunter

TOPICS: Judge Tracey Hunter is the Hamilton County Juvenile Judge. She spoke of how she's been unfairly treated by the court system since she's been in office. She mainly feels that this treatment stems from her being African American and female.

SHOW 10-13-13

GUEST: Amy Searcy (Director, Hamilton County Board of Elections)

TOPICS: With the upcoming local elections she talked about the absentee ballot process. She also talked about early voting. She explained that absentee voting and early voting are actually one in the same. She explained the importance of voters knowing which precinct that they are assigned to vote in. She also talked about Ohio's Voter ID laws. If a voter does not have a driver's license, they can use an ID card or utility bill as proof. She also explained the process of voting by mail.

SHOW 10-20-13

GUEST: Crystal Lockett (Owner of Master Design Hair Gallery)

TOPICS: Promoting and upcoming event to raise funds for cancer research. The event will be a one day event at her business where customers (women, men and children) can come in to get a hair cut. Customers can donate any amount they choose. All of the proceeds from the event will go towards cancer research.

GUEST: Alexandria Burnett and LaBron Colvin (SWAGG THE VOTE) SWAGG THE VOTE is an initiative designed to get young people interested and more involved in the voting process.

TOPIC: Their topic was centered on young encouraging young people to vote in the upcoming election.

TOPICS: Promoting and upcoming event called the Black and White Cancer Survivors Ball

GUEST: Raymond T. Faller (Public Defender) and Rosalind Porter (Paralegal)

TOPICS: Discussed the process of criminals having their records expunged.

GUEST: Dwight Tillery (President, CEO of Closing The Health Gap)
TOPICS: Promoting upcoming event called Men's Health Conference.

GUEST: Holly Christmann (Director, Hamilton County Environmental Services)
TOPICS: Talked about the importance of recycling and explained the many different materials that can be recycled. She also talked about some of the items that are made from recycled materials.

GUEST: Kimberly Turnbow (Elite Haircars Specialist)
Promoting that women should transition their hair to natural hairstyles. She promotes that putting chemicals in your hair, does not create a healthy grade of hair.

SHOW 11-10-13

GUEST: P.G. Sittenfeld (Cincinnati City Council Member)
TOPICS: Thanked voters for voting for him last week for his second term on City Council. Sittenfeld received more votes than any other candidate. Sittenfeld was also the highest fundraiser of all of the candidates. He talked about how citizens supported his campaign.

GUEST: Arnetta Whitehead and Rick Richardson (C.A.R. Productions)
Topic: Promoting an upcoming fashion show. The fashion show is to bring awareness to Parkinson's Disease. Most of the proceeds will go towards Parkinson's Disease Research.

SHOW 11-17-13

GUEST: Oscar Robertson (NBA Hall of Famer)
TOPIC: Should college athletes receive some sort of financial compensation? Discussed the state of college basketball and compared today's players to when he played. Talked about minority contractors in Cincinnati. He feels that more African American contractors should get more business. African Americans make up 50% of the city but only get 2% of the city contract work. Talked about donating his kidney to his daughter.

GUEST: Jeffery Blackwell (Cincinnati Police Chief)
TOPICS: Chief Blackwell is the new police chief of Cincinnati. He discussed some possible policy changes within the police department. He discussed officers wearing white hats. He feels that it brings a look of professionalism. He discussed officers working 12 hour shifts. Talked about getting new equipment for the police to do their jobs more efficiently. Talked about his push to get guns out of the hands of young people in Cincinnati.

SHOW 11-24-13

GUEST: LAURE QUINLIVAN (Former City Councilmember) JOHN SNYDER (Chairman,

Alliance For Regional Transit)

TOPICS: Talked about the streetcar. Newly elected Mayor, John Carnley has openly discussed his plan to stop the streetcar from becoming a reality in Cincinnati. Laure and John says that if the city decides to stop the streetcar from being built, the city would lose more money than to complete the project. Laure says that she thinks more Cincinnati business leaders should be more vocal in speaking out in favor of the streetcar.

SHOW 12-1-13

GUEST: Alicia Reece (State Representative 33rd District)

TOPICS: Talked about her efforts to fight Ohio's "Stand Your Ground" proposals. She feels that "Stand Your Ground" laws leads to more profiling by law enforcement.

Talked about Grambling State University financial issues. GSU is Alicia Reece's alma mater. Their athletic budget was cut by 57%.

Talked about the streetcar in Cincinnati and Mayor Cranley's effort to stop the streetcar.

SHOW 12-8-13

GUEST: Donald Nicely (Volunteers of America)

TOPIC: Volunteers of America recently received a grant that allows them to offer support homeless female veterans, and veterans with families. He said they find homeless vets by literally canvassing the city searching for them to offer help. They go into homeless shelters, libraries, churches, Super Jobs, etc. VOA also provides a single individual housing complex for homeless veterans. VOA has offices all over the state of Ohio. They have employment programs and transitional housing and re-entry programs to help vets.

GUEST: Shelly Mathews & Chertann Jenkins (Cincinnati Black Theatre Company)

TOPICS: Promoting an upcoming play title Black Nativity which will be held at Word of Deliverance Church.

SHOW 12-15-13

GUEST: Jim Neil (Hamilton County Sheriff)

TOPICS: Talked about his responsibility of the Sheriff's office. He said that The Hamilton County Sheriff's office will be there to back up any township in Hamilton County. Talked about the Sheriff's office recent audit. Result of the audit proved that staffing levels are low, training is poor and technology is outdated. Said that he wants to increase the staffing levels at the Hamilton County jail.

GUEST: Dr. Emmett O'neal (Urologist)

TOPICS: Talked about a lack of African American Doctors. Dr. O'neal says he is the only African American Urologist in Cincinnati. He says there is a great need for internist. Says that

men do not take the rectal exam often enough. He says many prostate cancers can be detected early if they would have the exams more often.

SHOW 12-22-13

GUEST: Steve Chabot (Congressman)

TOPICS: Talked about Senate passing the budget. He said he voted against the budget because he doesn't like the way the budget is set up. He likes some of the things that are in the budget, but didn't like others. Representative Chabot says that he met Nelson Mandella and he considers it a great honor. He has tried to model some of his beliefs after Nelson Mandella. Talked about the unemployment rates decreasing. Talked about the fact that Obamacare initial rollout suffered. Talked about the fact that people are paying more for health plans through Obamacare. Talked about the Brent Spence bridge potentially becoming a toll bridge in the future. Honored William Mallory Sr. who recently passed. William Mallory was the first African American to serve as a Majority Floor Leader in the Ohio House of Representatives. Mallory held this position longer than any Floor Leader in the history of the state.
