Brief description: Interview with Greg Weatherford, Deputy Director of Virginia Energy Sense. This program is the Commonwealth's energy education program under the guidance of the State Corporation Commission. It is designed to educate people on how to reduce their energy usage. For the second year in a row, about 3 in 4 Virginia electricity consumers say their electric bill has increased in the last year. Most report at 10 to 25% increase. Additionally, 80% say that saving money on their electric bill is "very important". That's why Virginia Energy Sense is here to provide consumer with quick ways to save on their electric bill.

During the winter, you can make a big difference by caulking and weatherstripping leaks and cracks around windows and doors. Air leaks and drafts are amonng the biggest money wasters. It could lower your energy bill by 20%! Another tip is to consider using electric blankets. They use 90% less energy than the average portable electric space heater.

Year-round you can take simple steps such as lowering the temperature on your hot water heater, replace incandescent lightbulbs with energy-efficient LEDs, which last 25 times as long. Nine hours of service each day and feel it will increase customer access to healthcare work educational opportunities and shopping in Tappahannock. Thanks to the partnership with VCU Health, the cost of a ride on the Rivah Ride remains only \$1. A new bus shelter has also been added. This one is located at the VCU Health Tappahannock Hospital Medical Office Buildings. Since forest fuels cure during the winter months, the danger of fire is higher in early spring than in summer when the forest and grasses are green with new growth. The 4:00 p.m. Burning Law is an effective tool in the prevention of forest fires. Localities may have more restrictive outdoor burning laws.
