Topic: A federal judge in Texas granted 35 Navy service members' court motion challenging the Pentagon's COVID-19 vaccine mandate with religious exemptions Monday. Mike Berry, who is representing the Navy SEALs on behalf of First Liberty Institute, told the Daily Caller News Foundation that the ruling is a win for religious freedom. He

added: "If religious freedom means anything, it must mean that those who are sworn to protect our freedoms should not be forced to lose those very same freedoms." In his decision to grant the preliminary injunction, Judge Reed O'Connor of the Northern District of Texas called the Navy's 6-phase, 50-step religious accommodation process "theater." Title: Federal Court Hands Victory To Opponents Of Vaccine Mandates

Topic: Head Start employees will not be required to get a COVID-19 vaccine to keep their job, according to a federal court ruling Saturday. A federal district court handed a victory to the 24 states who sued them over the requirement that Head Start employees get a COVID-19 vaccine. Judge Terry Doughty said the move by President Joe Biden unlawfully bypassed the powers of Congress. The rule required universal masking for Head Start children two years and older, and it mandated that all staffers, contractors and volunteers be vaccinated against COVID-19 by Jan. 31. Head Start includes preschool programs for 3 and 4 year old children, while Early Head Start programs are for infants, toddlers and pregnant women to "promote the school readiness of children ages birth to 5 from low-income families by supporting their development in a comprehensive way," according to its website. Sixty-three percent of patients hospitalized with COVID-19 in South Africa during the surge had "incidental" COVID-19 diagnoses, meaning they were admitted to the hospital for a separate reason and tested positive for the virus once there. Topic: A major American insurance company, which is in the business of accurate data about deaths, announces that Americans in the 18-64 age bracket are dying in unprecedented numbers. Davison said the increase in deaths represents "huge, huge numbers," and that it's not elderly people who are dying, but "primarily working-age people 18 to 64". "And what we saw just in third quarter, we're seeing it continue into fourth quarter, is that death rates are up 40% over what they were pre-pandemic," he said. For Prudential, they have had a massive 87% increase in death benefits paid comparing the third quarter of 2020 to the third quarter of 2021. Such a detailed breakdown wasn't available for New York Life, but their 2021 year to date (1 Jan to 30 Sept) death benefit payout is up by 27%. Examining Pacific Life documents identifies multiple units. for Pacific Life the year to date claims are up by only 12%. but for a subsidiary, Pacific Life and Annuity, claims are up by over 80%.
