After an overview of the Second World War, which engulfed the world from 1939 to 1945 and cost at least 50 million lives, inhabitants of four towns - Mobile, Alabama; Sacramento, California; Waterbury, Connecticut; and Luverne, Minnesota - recall their communities on the eve of the conflict. For them, the events overseas seem far away. Their tranquil lives are

shattered by the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, and America is thrust into the great cataclysm. Along with millions of other young men, Sid Phillips and Willie Rushton of Mobile, Ray Leopold of Waterbury and Walter Thompson and Burnett Miller of Sacramento enter the armed forces. In the Philippines, two Americans, Corporal Glenn Frazier and Sascha Weinzheimer (who was eight years old in 1941), are caught up in the Japanese onslaught there, as American and Filipino forces retreat onto Bataan while thousands of civilians are rounded up and imprisoned in Manila. Back home, 110,000 Japanese Americans along the West Coast are forcibly relocated by the government to internment camps. On the East Coast, German U-boats menace Allied shipping offshore. The United States seems unprepared for this kind of total war. Witnessing all of this is Katharine Phillips of Mobile and Al McIntosh, editor of the Rock County Star Herald in Luverne, who chronicles the travails of every family in town. In June 1942, the Navy manages a victory over the Japanese at the Battle of Midway. In August, American land forces, including Sid Phillips of Mobile, face the Japanese army for the first time at Guadalcanal. Abandoned by their fleet with no sea or air support, the men are under constant attack. After six months, the Americans finally prevail and, in the process, stop Japan's expansion in the Pacific.

It began as a hunch in the newsroom of the Hartford Courant and grew to become a major exposé. A Courant investigation revealed shocking mental health care practices within the American armed forces - practices which led to soldiers being medicated without proper oversight; soldiers being redeployed despite suffering from post-traumatic-stress disorder (PTSD); and suicidal soldiers whose warning signs were ignored. Courant journalists Lisa Chedekel and Matthew Kauffman had seen media reports that recruitment standards were being lowered in order to offset personnel shortfalls and they wondered what impact this was having on the military's standards for psychological care of its troops. They learned that pre-deployment screenings were largely ineffective. In fact, only one question of eight on the pre-deployment questionnaire - Question 7 - pertained to mental health. It asks, "During the past year have you sought counseling or care for your mental health? Yes or No." After analyzing data from over 900,000 questionnaires, the Courant reported in 2006 that those who came forward with psychological problems were "rarely referred for evaluations by mental health professionals" and the vast majority of those who answered "yes" to Question 7 were ultimately deployed. Further investigation revealed that the military provides scant resources for people seeking mental health assistance while on active duty. One soldier featured in the Courant report tells Exposé he was referred to a chaplain by a physician's assistant. He says the chaplain told him, "I would feel better once I got over to the desert and starting killing people." Then there was Air Force veteran Warren Henthorn, whose son's warning signs were ignored as well. Army Specialist Jeffrey Henthorn took his own life while serving in Iraq, the Courant reported. Henthorn was one of 22 U.S. Army suicides in Iraq in 2005.

After an overview of the Second World War, which engulfed the world from 1939 to 1945 and cost at least 50 million lives, inhabitants of four towns - Mobile, Alabama; Sacramento, California; Waterbury, Connecticut; and Luverne, Minnesota - recall their communities on the eve of the conflict. For them, the events overseas seem far away. Their tranquil lives are shattered by the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, and America is thrust into the great cataclysm. Along with millions of other young men, Sid Phillips and Willie Rushton of Mobile, Ray Leopold of Waterbury and Walter Thompson and Burnett Miller of Sacramento enter the armed forces. In the Philippines, two Americans, Corporal Glenn Frazier and Sascha Weinzheimer (who was eight years old in 1941), are caught up in the Japanese onslaught there, as American and Filipino forces retreat onto Bataan while thousands of civilians are rounded up and imprisoned in Manila. Back home, 110,000 Japanese Americans along the West Coast are forcibly relocated by the government to internment camps. On the East Coast, German U-boats menace Allied shipping offshore. The United States seems unprepared for this kind of total war. Witnessing all of this is Katharine Phillips of Mobile and Al McIntosh, editor of the Rock County Star Herald in Luverne, who chronicles the travails of every family in town. In June 1942, the Navy manages a victory over the Japanese at the Battle of Midway. In August, American land forces, including Sid Phillips of Mobile, face the Japanese army for the first time at Guadalcanal. Abandoned by their fleet with no sea or air support, the men are under constant attack. After six months, the Americans finally prevail and, in the process, stop Japan's expansion in the Pacific.

It began as a hunch in the newsroom of the Hartford Courant and grew to become a major exposé. A Courant investigation revealed shocking mental health care practices within the American armed forces - practices which led to soldiers being medicated without proper oversight; soldiers being redeployed despite suffering from post-traumatic-stress disorder (PTSD); and suicidal soldiers whose warning signs were ignored. Courant journalists Lisa Chedekel and Matthew Kauffman had seen media reports that recruitment standards were being lowered in order to offset personnel shortfalls and they wondered what impact this was having on the military's standards for psychological care of its troops. They learned that pre-deployment screenings were largely ineffective. In fact, only one question of eight on the pre-deployment questionnaire - Question 7 - pertained to mental health. It asks, "During the past year have you sought counseling or care for your mental health? Yes or No." After analyzing data from over 900,000 questionnaires, the Courant reported in 2006 that those who came forward with psychological problems were "rarely referred for

evaluations by mental health professionals" and the vast majority of those who answered "yes" to Question 7 were ultimately deployed. Further investigation revealed that the military provides scant resources for people seeking mental health assistance while on active duty. One soldier featured in the Courant report tells Exposé he was referred to a chaplain by a physician's assistant. He says the chaplain told him, "I would feel better once I got over to the desert and starting killing people." Then there was Air Force veteran Warren Henthorn, whose son's warning signs were ignored as well. Army Specialist Jeffrey Henthorn took his own life while serving in Iraq, the Courant reported. Henthorn was one of 22 U.S. Army suicides in Iraq in 2005.

In the Philippines, two Americans, Corporal Glenn Frazier and Sascha Weinzheimer (who was eight years old in 1941), are caught up in the Japanese onslaught there, as American and Filipino forces retreat onto Bataan while thousands of civilians are rounded up and imprisoned in Manila. Back home, 110,000 Japanese Americans along the West Coast are forcibly relocated by the government to internment camps. On the East Coast, German U-boats menace Allied shipping offshore. The United States seems unprepared for this kind of total war. Witnessing all of this is Katharine Phillips of Mobile and Al McIntosh, editor of the Rock County Star Herald in Luverne, who chronicles the travails of every family in town. In June 1942, the Navy manages a victory over the Japanese at the Battle of Midway. In August, American land forces, including Sid Phillips of Mobile, face the Japanese army for the first time at Guadalcanal. Abandoned by their fleet with no sea or air support, the men are under constant attack. After six months, the Americans finally prevail and, in the process, stop Japan's expansion in the Pacific.

But the good news is wrong, and it is hours before the correct information reaches the families and the world -- there is only one survivor. The tragedy of the Sago mine disaster garnered the intense attention of the media in early January 2006, but few reporters dug deeper to find out if the deaths of coal miners could have been prevented. Until reporter Ken Ward Jr. and The Charleston Gazette did just that, by pouring over the accident reports involving hundreds of miners. Ward found that most miners do not die in disasters, in the glare of the media spotlight, but one by one, in mining accidents that could have been avoided if mine operators had followed existing regulations and safety rules. "They don't have to die," Ward concluded. "That's what the reports show. That's what the record shows."

Now, the issue has become a political free-for-all, with family lives hanging in the balance. As part of its investigation, NOW interviewed Graeme Frost and his parents. Graeme is a twelve year-old boy whose family has been using SCHIP to pay for his medical expenses following a car accident. After Frost told his story as part of the Democratic weekly radio address at the end of September, he and his family became the targets of right wing attacks. Many are now asking: Did Congressional Republicans assist in a smear campaign?

The Sinai Desert. In the concluding chapter of "Walking the Bible," Bruce Feiler follows the Israelite's 40 year trek through what the Bible calls a "great and terrible wilderness." Feiler experiences the stark reality of the Sinai desert where it's a struggle simply to survive. He finds the locations said to be where God provided water and food for the Israelites - and discovers the secret of the tamarisk tree, which secretes a sweet, honey-like substance called "manna." In the shadow of the mountain believed to be the Biblical Mount Sinai, Feiler visits St. Catherine's Monastery, the oldest operating church in the world. He attends the services, a powerful, unchanged ritual of 1,500 years, and sees what's claimed to be the real "burning bush" in which God spoke to Moses. One of the monks, Texas-born Father Justin, shows him the Monastery's world-renowned library of priceless religious art and manuscripts. Later, when Feiler climbs Mt. Sinai where Moses is said to have received the Ten Commandments, he is struck by the spiritual significance of the land, and its relationship to the people, and to God. As he follows the 40 year route of the Israelites, he visits a local Bedouin family who also derive sustenance from the desert and travels to the "lost city" of Petra in Jordan, where the Israelites may have lived for many years. Nearing the end of Moses' journey, Feiler climbs Mt. Nebo, where God shows Moses the Promised Land the Israelites are about to enter. At the end of his own journey, Feiler realizes that

although Moses is denied entrance himself, it is not the land after all that is important for Moses. It is his meeting with God.
