1) SAWHORSE REVOLUTION

Great program that gets young people interested and involved in construction and design. Youth carpentry projects include the first "tiny homes" for homeless in our community. The industry is facing a lack of skilled young workers, believed to be the result of focus on higher education and diminishing of skills/trade programs in middle and high schools. www.sawhorserevolution.org

2) WA STATE COUNCIL OF FIREFIGHTERS BURN FOUNDATION

An organization created by firefighters for firefighters. Agenda is on the promotion and education of burn injury prevention. They also offer services to victims and families of victims following major (and often high profile) burn injuries. Used to raise a lot of money by selling the annual firefighters calendar, but with sales down, looking to other creative revenue sources. www.wscffb.org

3) COMPASS HOUSING ALLIANCE

Providing *housing*, shelter and support for homeless and low-income people in Seattle and the Puget Sound region. Seattle and King County are in the midst of a "state of emergency" of homelessness. Compass is working on the ground and with policy makers to find solutions and support this vulnerable population. Over the years they have had to become experts on behavioral health, as one UW study showed 80% of the aging, homeless population had dementia. www.compasshousingalliance.org

4) RAINIER SCHOLARS

Rainier Scholars cultivates the academic potential and leadership skills of hard-working, low-income students of color. By creating access to transformative educational opportunities and providing comprehensive support to scholars and families, we increase college graduation rates and empower new generations of leaders.

JULY 3, 2016 – In a Sunday exclusive interview with moderator Chuck Todd, **Sen. Tom Cotton (R-Ark.)** refused to support Republican presumptive nominee Donald Trump, saying that "Donald Trump can ultimately make the case for himself."

Cotton also told Todd that the tarmac meeting between Attorney General Lynch and former president Bill Clinton earlier this week "raises questions about political interference in this investigation." Watch the full interview: <http://nbcnews.to/29gwssY>.

Democratic presumptive nominee Hillary Clinton exclusively spoke with Todd yesterday in her first interview since her voluntary interview with the FBI about her emails as Secretary of State, telling him that she's "been eager" to speak with the FBI and that, in regard to the controversial tarmac meeting, "hindsight is 20/20." Labor Sec. Tom Perez, who has widely been speculated as a possible VP pick for Clinton, also exclusively joined this morning's program in his personal, political capacity, sharing that "we want to make sure that when we negotiate with Mexico and Vietnam and others that we have the strongest protections for workers that we've ever had....The President and Secretary Clinton have a disagreement on whether T.P.P. has gone that far." JULY 10, 2016 -- On a special edition of "Meet the Press with Chuck Todd" this morning, **Homeland Security Sec. Jeh Johnson** responded to former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani's comments that Black Lives Matter makes "it seem like all police are against blacks," telling Todd: "Let's all dial back the overheated political rhetoric."

Sec. Johnson also told Todd that, "yes," he has had the talk with his son that many African-American fathers say they have; **New York City Police Commissioner Bill Bratton** added, "I've had conversations with my son, who's now 45, as a police officer, about the importance of compliance."

Bratton also addressed his department turning down a request from Republican presumptive nominee Donald Trump's security personnel for Trump to address a roll call: "We turned down that request...We don't allow the department to be used, if you will, as a backdrop to those types of campaigns." "We're in a very, very critical point in the history of this country," **Charles Ramsey**, former commissioner of the Philadelphia Police Department, told Todd. "You've got two conventions coming up that are going

to be very, very challenging to handle. And I don't think they are going to go without some incident taking place.”

For the first time in nearly two years, a Republican senator and Democratic senator appeared on the network broadcast together. This morning, **Sen. Cory Booker (D-N.J.)** and **Sen. Bob Corker (R-Tenn.)** - both former mayors -- discussed the deadly shooting in Dallas.

Sen. Booker called on the nation to do more to support police officers, adding: “There's few groups as I've ever seen in America that show the daily courage, especially urban police officers, where there's a lot of gun violence.”

“Millennials in our country today probably are more embracing of diversity than any generation we've had,” argued Sen. Corker. “It's my hope, again, after this tremendous crisis that's occurred, this tragedy, that our country will focus more on unity and not division. July 17, 2016 – In a special edition of “Meet the Press with Chuck Todd” in Cleveland ahead of the Republican National Convention, **Republican National Committee Chair Reince Priebus** discussed the party’s 2013 autopsy report after former Gov. Romney’s presidential loss: “The autopsy really is about engaging in black, Hispanic, Asian communities, being a full-time party, investing in data and also, watching your mouth” which Republican presumptive nominee Donald Trump has “done much better at.”

Priebus also responded to the inclusion of conversion therapy on the party platform, telling Todd that “there was an amendment on that issue” and that “it is not in the final platform.”

The Blaze’s Glenn Beck also joined the program, noting that “both parties are so out of touch with the American people” and questioning “Why all of a sudden are these people who were so strongly against Clinton or so strongly against Trump now suddenly on the Clinton train, on the Trump train?”

The show then pivoted to the tumultuous week abroad with incidents in Nice and Turkey with **Secretary of State John Kerry**, who joined the show from Luxembourg. He responded to recent domestic and international events like Orlando and Nice, telling Todd: “Those events, actually, are efforts by ISIL to try to prove relevance and to try to frighten people more.” He added: “We’ve taken 130 of their major leaders off the battlefield. We are making progress.”
