

JUNE 12, 2016 -- Presidential candidate **Sen. Bernie Sanders (I-Vt.)** reacted this morning to the deadly Orlando shooting, telling moderator Chuck Todd, "It's horrific, it's unthinkable. And just hopes go out to all those who were shot that they can recover."

He continued: "We should not be selling automatic weapons which are designed to kill people. We have got to do everything that we can on top of that to make sure that guns do not fall into the hands of people who should not have them, criminals, people who are mentally ill."

Sen. Sanders also shared that he plans to meet with former Sec. Hillary Clinton this Tuesday evening to discuss her campaign because he wants "to get a sense of what kind of platform she will be supporting." Watch the full interview: http://nbcnews.to/1WKoVGU.

**Sen. Jeff Flake (R-Ariz.)** also reacted to the Orlando shooting -- now the deadliest mass shooting in U.S. history: "Obviously a horrible, horrible tragedy. And every one that happens is one too many."

He added: "If it is found out that this person was at least inspired by ISIS, then it'll probably be a terrorism debate. If he wasn't, it may be a gun debate."
