This report represents an accounting of identified priorities in the communities KEXP serves and ways in which KEXP has addressed through March 31, 2022. - 1. **Engagement for Youth and Families:** There is strong interest locally in opportunities for kids, youth, and families to engage as a community with each other and around great music. KEXP responds to this demand throughout the year by organizing and promoting youth and family friendly music shows and events.

Affordability & Gentrification Issues: Housing affordability, homelessness, and the impacts of Covid-19 and gentrification are key areas of concern for artists and music business owners in the Pacific Northwest. With rapid population growth and lack of a range of housing types driving an extremely high cost of housing, these issues are impacting music lovers, industry folx and artists alike. Issues relating to housing affordability and gentrification are addressed through broadcast programming on Sound & Vision (S&V) and elsewhere, as well as in-person programming.

KEXP regularly features stories of healing through music as a part of our Music Heals on-air, online, features on Sound & Vision (S&V) and in-person event series which covers topics such as overcoming cancer, mental health, addiction and recovery, and grief and dying.
