

KEXP Quarterly Issues and Program List

April 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020

This report represents an accounting of identified priorities in the communities KEXP serves and ways in which KEXP has addressed through June 30, 2020. Pursuant to the FCC's rules 47 CFR 73.3527 (a) such quarterly lists will be placed within KEXP's public file on January 10, April 10, July 10 and October 10 each year. The following information describes how KEXP has responded to 6 local community priorities from April 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020. Community priorities that KEXP is serving include:

1. Music Discovery and Cultural Literacy
2. Local Music
3. Engagement for Kids and Families
4. Affordability & Gentrification Issues
5. Race, Identity and Gender
6. Health (Mental and Physical)
7. Education

1. **Music Discovery and Cultural Literacy:** KEXP responds to a strong interest from our local community in discovering a broad range of new music as well as access to a diversity of music not readily available on commercial radio or within more rigid formats. As detailed below, KEXP does this through (1) variety mix programming that is curated by our own DJs; (2) specialty shows that allow our audience to explore specific music genres in depth each week; and (3) frequent live in-studio sessions with bands touring through Seattle.

Issues relating to housing affordability and gentrification are addressed through broadcast programming on Sound & Vision and elsewhere, as well as in-person programming.
