The Commission is requesting KDHE thoroughly investigate how the proposed facility would affect the water supply in the area. Duration, 2 minutes.

Story on the affiliation of the Hiawatha Community Hospital and Atchison-based Amberwell Health, which is to provide patients in northeast Kansas with improved access to a full spectrum of health care services. The decision to affiliate the two rural healthcare systems was announced March 4. Duration, 2 minutes.

Feature on healthy eating--broadcast March 13 at 7 and 8 am and 12 p.m. K-State Research and Extension nutrition specialist Sandy Procter discussed the importance of eating healthy and the new Dietary Guidelines for Americans. March is “National Nutrition Month.” Duration, 4 minutes.

News story about a proposal from the Atchison USD 409 Board of Education to close Central School and assign all effected students to the Roosevelt facilities. A public hearing on the proposal has been set for February 18. Duration, 2 minutes.

KAIR Country News—broadcast February 3 at 6, 7 & 8 am and 12 & 5 p.m. News story about South Brown County USD 430's plans to survey district patrons regarding their perceptions related to district facilities. The USD 430 Board of Education is considering needed facilities improvements in the district and a potential bond election to finance those improvements. Duration, 2 minutes

KAIR Country News—broadcast February 19 at 6, 7 & 8 am and 12 & p.m. Story on a public hearing held on the proposed closure of Atchison's Central School and relocation of the school's students to the Roosevelt building. Duration, 2 minutes, 30 secs.

Story on the USD 409 Board of Education voting to close Atchison's Central School at the end of the current school year, with the about 45-50 K-12 students to be relocated to the Roosevelt Building at the Atchison Middle School for the next school year. Part 1 of 2 part series----broadcast February 15 on KAIR newscasts at 6,7, and 8 a.m. and 12 noon and 5 pm on KAIR Country News. Joshua Wolf, a history professor, and selected spokesman for the organization Atchison United, provided background regarding his February 8 address to the Board of Education of USD 409 regarding Atchison United's push to see the Atchison High School stop using the Redmen mascot due to cultural sensitivity, despite the school board's 2018 vote to retain the mascot. Part 2 of 2 part series—broadcast February 17 on KAIR newscasts at 6,7, and 8 a.m. and 12 noon and 5 p.m. Joshua Wolf, a history professor, and selected spokesman for the organization Atchison United, explained the historical context of the term “redmen,” and related titles, saying the term is a pejorative, used to dehumanize Native Americans, which is why Atchison United is working to see the USD 409 Board of Education retire the Atchison High School Redmen mascot. Duration, 3:48.

Story on a mascot educational presentation and public input forum held by the Atchison USD 409 Board of Education on the district's Native American-themed mascots. Nine individuals addressed the board, calling for the controversial mascots to be dropped. Duration, 2 minutes.

Story about the fate of the Atchison school district's Native American-themed mascots to be decided at the USD 409 Board of Education's meeting in April. Additional public input was received on the mascots at the board's April 8th meeting. Duration, 2 minutes.
