April 5, 2015

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues, Child Abuse and Parenting Skills.

Guests: Carol Lucky the CEO of The Child and Family Guidance Center in Dallas and Jennifer Williams the Center's Public Relations Manager.

Topic: With the recent crash of German Wings Flight 9525 which was caused by a pilot who was reportedly dealing with severe depression I wanted to highlight mental health issues and programs in North Texas aimed at helping those with mental health problems from severe depression to schizophrenia. Carol Lucky and Jennifer Williams joined me to talk about the programs offered by The Child and Family Guidance Center a North Texas nonprofit whose goal is to equip children, adults and families

with the skills and resources needed to reduce the effects of mental illness, child abuse, family violence and high risk behaviors. Carol and Jennifer weighed in on signs that people should be on the look out for to protect loved ones and others from those dealing with mental health issues and we talked about the German Wings tragedy. We also talked about the programs offered by the Center for people dealing with anger management and their parenting classes as well.

April 12, 2015

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Abuse, Economy, Mental Health Issues and Crime & Violence.

Guests: Dan Leal with the Children's Advocacy Center of Denton County and Kevin Howell the founder of 411 Angel and a board member of the Children's Advocacy Center of Denton County.

Topic: April is Child Abuse Awareness Month and the community is asked to Stand Up for Children and educate themselves about child abuse so that if they suspect someone is being abused they can report it. Dan Leal and Kevin Howell talked about the work that the Children's Advocacy Center does in North Texas in conjunction with law enforcement agencies and how they help children who have been the victims of abuse. We also promoted the upcoming Academy of Country Music Motorcycle Rally which will be held on Saturday, April 18<sup>th</sup> in Carrollton. The event will benefit child abuse prevention programs like those offered by the Children's Advocacy Center.

April 19, 2015

Issues Covered: Economic issues and Financial Literacy

Guests: Todd Mark the Vice President of Education for Navicore Solutions a nonprofit that offers credit counseling and debt management solutions to those in need and Al James and Lauren Barros with the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of North Texas. Topic: The month of April is Financial Literacy Month. It is a time to educate the public about what they need to know when it comes to debt management, budgets, purchasing a home and also how to stay in that home without going into foreclosure. Todd Mark joined me to talk about the services and programs offered by the nonprofit Navicore Solutions to those in need here in our area and how it is important for people to reach out for help before their debts get out of hand. We also talked about planning for financial goals like college or retirement. Al James and Lauren Barros joined me to talk about the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of North Texas and their services and programs for those living with these diseases. Lauren shared her own story of living with Crohn's and how it has impacted her life. We also promoted the upcoming Crohn's and Colitis Walk in North Texas which will take place on Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>.

April 26, 2015

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Hunger Prevention

Guests: Colleen Brinkman with the North Texas Food Bank, Master Sgt. Bridget Sonsel and Coby Gray the Regional Vice President of Development for the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas.

Topic. Colleen Brinkman joined me to talk about the upcoming Taste of the NFL which will benefit the North Texas Food Banks summer food programs for kids. The school year is winding down and summer is a critical time for the food banks in our area since so many students who benefit from free breakfast and lunch programs will not be getting the meals that they normally do during the school year. Colleen talked about the reality of food insecurity in our area and how many people don't realize that this issue affects their friends and neighbors. We also discussed the many other programs offered by the food bank to help people including helping people who are being released from the prison system by teaching them skills to help them in the food industry. Master Sgt. Bridget Sonsel of Fort Worth and Coby Gray with the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas joined me to promote the upcoming Arthritis Walk which will help raise awareness about Arthritis and raise money for research and for the programs and services offered by the Foundation here in our area. Bridget was diagnosed with rheumatoid arthritis and she shared her story and also how many veterans who are returning from war zones are suffering from osteo arthritis because of the wear and tear on their joints from active service.

May 3, 2015 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Drug and Alcohol Abuse, Crime and Violence and Health issues.

Guests:.Becky Vance and Carrie Stevens with the Collin County Substance Abuse Coalition, April Culver the Executive Director of Challenge Air DFW and Jess Thompson a volunteer with Challenge Air.

Topic: Recently there has been a push to legalize marijuana across the country with many states legalizing the drug for medicinal purposes and others as a revenue source but many in the Substance Abuse Prevention field feel like this is not good for our country and they want to highlight the impact that legalization can have on our youth since marijuana is considered a gateway drug to other more addictive drugs. Becky Vance and Carrie Stevens joined me to talk about the work that their organization does in our area to inform the community and to help people who are addicted to drugs and alcohol. They also promoted the upcoming forum that will take place in Frisco concerning designer drugs. The forum will feature keynote speaker Eric Brown who lost his son Montana to a designer drug overdose when Montana was a freshman at Frisco High School. April Culver and Jess Thompson joined me to talk about the work that Challenge Air DFW does to help kids with disabilities and with life threatening illnesses by introducing the children to aviation. Challenge Air gives children with special needs the gift of flight free of charge to the children and their families with young kids learning to fly from experience pilots.

May 10, 2015 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Education

Topic: Today is Mother's Day and I Heart Media aired a special thanking America's Teachers. The program aired across the

country.

May 17, 2015 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues and Pet Adoption Awareness and Spay and Neutering as well as Animal Protection. Guests: Vanita Halliburton the founder and CEO of the Grant Halliburton Foundation, Mark Verma the President of Paws in the City and Bonnie Hill the founder of the Spay and Neuter Network.

Topic: May in Mental Health Awareness Month aimed at raising awareness about mental health issues and reducing the stigma of mental health issues so that people will get the help that they need. Vanita Halliburton joined me to talk about new online resources aimed at helping North Texans find the help they need. Vanita also talked about the work that the Grant Halliburton Foundation does to promote awareness and understanding of teen and young adult mental health issues. We also talked about mental health help for those in the aftermath of the recent deadly tornadoes and floods that hit our area this month and how people should reach out for help and not be afraid to ask for that help. Mark Verma and Bonnie Hill joined me to promote the upcoming Top Hat and Tails which will benefit Paws in the City a nonprofit that rescues unwanted dogs and cars and finds homes for them. We also talked about Bonnie's Spay and Neuter Network and how they are making an impact on the population of unwanted pets in our area thru their free spay and neuter services.

May 24, 2015 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Support for Veterans.

Guests: Nekima Booker with the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas and Marquette Stevenson with Montrel Living a nonprofit that houses homeless veterans.

Topic: It is Memorial Week End and as we honor the men and women who have fallen in the line of duty we also honor those who have served our country. Nekima Booker with the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas and Marquette Stevenson with Montrel Living joined me to talk about the issues that face our veterans when they come home and how the Veterans Coalition is trying to take care of the needs of our veterans whether it be mental health services, financial literacy education, job placement and training or housing services. Marquette talked about the crisis among female veterans who are finding themselves homeless with children and the need for housing so that they can stay with their children. We talked about ways the community can help veterans and honor those who have sacrificed so much.

May 31, 2015 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues, Education and Breast Cancer Awareness and Prevention.

Guests: Peggy Marshall the CEO of The Art Station in Fort Worth, Hanna Beaty with Komen North Texas and Nekia Hammond Blakely a breast cancer survivor.

Topic: Peggy Marshall joined me to talk about the work done at The Art Station, a nonprofit in Fort Worth that offers up art therapy as a way to deal with mental health issues from depression, to grief to PTSD for our returning veterans, to dealing with child abuse trauma. Hanna Beaty and Nekia Hammond Blakely joined me to talk about the upcoming Komen Race for the Cure in Plano which will take place Saturday, June 13<sup>th</sup>. The event raises awareness about breast cancer and raises funds for Komen North Texas and the services and programs they offer for those who have been diagnosed with breast cancer and their families. Nekia who was diagnosed with breast cancer as a teenager shared her story and talked about what everyone needs to know about taking care of their health, the signs they should be on the lookout for and the need for yearly exams and the need for self exams.

June 7, 2015 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issue Covered: Health issue

Guests: Linda Goelzer with Carter Blood Care and Lewis Alexander with the Diabetes Association of North Texas. Topic: Linda Goelzer joined me to talk about the upcoming Summer Blood Drive which will take place June 15th through June 20th at various locations around the Metroplex. It is estimated that every two seconds someone in the US needs blood and during the summer months when people head out of town for vacation the need for blood donors rises. Linda talked about the work that Carter Blood Care does in our area and encouraged people to donate blood or to hold blood drives at their churches, schools or place of business this summer. Lewis Alexander joined me for the second half of the program to talk about the upcoming DFW Tour de Cure which benefits the Diabetes Association of North Texas and the work that they do to help those living with diabetes. The event will take place at Texas Motor Speedway on Saturday, June 20th and is open to bicycle riders of all skill levels. Lewis, who has Type 2 Diabetes, talked about how he manages his disease and how the Diabetes Association helped him and has helped others in raising awareness and raising dollars for research.

June 14, 2015 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues, Mental Health Issues and Prejudice.

Guests: Cece Cox the Executive Director of The Resource Center in Dallas, Leslie McMurray a volunteer with The Resource Center and a Transgender Woman, and Scotty Landry the President and CEO of the Make A Wish Foundation of North Texas. Topic: The recent announcement by former Olympic Athlete Bruce Jenner that he was transitioning into a woman and that he would now like to be known as Caitlyn Jenner has raised awareness about Transgender people and started a conversation about people who like Bruce Jenner are not comfortable in their own skin and who have gender identity issues. Cece Cox and Leslie McMurray joined me to talk about how The Resource Center in Dallas helps transgender people in our area with support services and mental health services. Leslie who is a transgender woman shared her journey and talked about the issues she dealt with before transitioning and how her family has dealt with her transition from a man into a woman. Scotty Landry with the Make A Wish Foundation of North Texas joined me for the second segment of the program to promote the upcoming Dave and Busters Golf Tournament that will benefit the Make A Wish Foundation. We talked about the mission of the foundation to grant the wishes of children with life threatening illnesses and the impact that those wishes have on the child and their families.

June 21, 2015 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Fatherhood, Parenting Issues, Economic Issues and Family Life.

Guest: Doug Clark the President of Fathers for Equal Rights.

Topic: Today is Father's Day and Doug Clark joined me to talk about the importance of a father's presence in their child's life. He talked about the work that his nonprofit, Fathers For Equal Rights, does in our area to help dads who are going through a

divorce and who are fighting for custody or dealing with child support issues. Doug talked about putting the child first and working with mothers and extended family members to make sure that the father stays involved in their child's life and that there is no parental alienation taking place. He discussed legal issues that face fathers who are divorced and who do not have custody of their kids and the rights that every father should know about.

Issues Covered: Support for Military Veterans, Senior Citizens, Economic Issues and Housing.

Guest: Dennis Luellen the Executive Director for Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas

Topic: It is the Sunday before July 4<sup>th</sup> and as a way to honor the men and women who ensure our freedom by serving our country we highlighted a local organization doing what it can to help North Texas veterans. Dennis Luellen the Executive Director of Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas joined me to talk about the work that the non-profit does here in our area fixing and remodeling homes for veterans and for senior citizens who are unable to do so themselves. According to Dennis some of the homes need to be outfitted with handicapped ramps and other accessories to make the home more user friendly for the disabled. The organization recently teamed up with the Homes for Heroes program and is currently taking applications from veterans to have their home remodeled. The projects will begin on September 11<sup>th</sup> with 60 homes in 60 days for veterans and their families with the project culminating with a project being wrapped up on Veteran's Day.
