Issues Covered: Economy and Education

Guest: Todd Mark the Executive Vice President of Education for Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Greater Dallas.

Topic: Todd Mark joined me to talk about ways that people can become fiscally fit in the New Year. We talked about the services and programs offered by the nonprofit Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Greater Dallas to those who are in debt or who are facing foreclosure but also services for those people looking to buy a house, create a budget for a new purchase like a new car or for their college education, and we talked about their services for retirement planning and promoted their free webinars that are conducted throughout the year to help people with their finances.

Issues Covered Community Involvement, Education and the Economy

Guests: Tammy Richards CEO of the Volunteer Center of North Texas and Andrew Gagliano the Communications Manager for the Volunteer Center.

Topic: The Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday has been declared a "Day On rather than a Day Off" encouraging people to volunteer in their community and so Tammy Richards and Andrew Gagliano joined me to talk about how the Volunteer Center connects volunteers with hundreds of non-profits in our area. We talked about the impact that volunteer hours have on a communities economy and how students are learning the importance of donating your time to your community with more and more colleges looking at students transcripts to see if that student has volunteered.

Issues Covered: Human Trafficking, Crime and Law Enforcement and Child Abuse

Guests: Katie Pedigo the Executive Director of New Friends New Life.

Topic: Katie joined me to talk about New Friends New Life a nonprofit in Dallas that helps girls and young women who have been the victims of sex trafficking. Katie talked about the programs offered by New Friends New Life to help those women who have had to prostitute themselves to survive including mental health programs and educational programs to help the women find new lives. January is Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention month and with the Super Bowl coming up on February 2nd people should know that sex trafficking increases around large sporting events like the Super Bowl.

January 26, 2014

Issues Covered: Health Related Issue and the Economy

Guests: Dr. Diana Kerwin an Alzheimer's Association Board member and Chief of Geriatrics at Texas Health Resources Hospital and Susan Yost with the Alzheimer's Association North Texas, and Robert Heppenstall the North Texas Director of the Souper Bowl of Caring.

Topic: It is estimated that every 68 seconds someone in the US develops Alzheimer's and as someone who lost her mother to this horrific disease 5 years ago today, January 26th, I wanted to shine a light on the disease and also on the research being done to find a cure to Alzheimer's. Dr. Kerwin talked about what everyone should know about Alzheimer's like the signs and symptoms and preventive measures. Susan Yost and Dr. Kerwin also talked about the work that the Alzheimer's Association does in our area to help those dealing with Alzheimer's, their families and caregivers. We also promoted the 24 hour helpline for families and the support groups for people living with Alzheimer's. Robert Heppenstall joined me at the end of the program to talk about the Souper Bowl of Caring a national youth led movement in schools, churches and community organizations all coming together to collect food for our area food banks and food pantries.

February 2, 2014

Issues Covered: Addiction and Education

Guests: Dr. Harold C. Urschel the author of "Healing the Addicted Brain" and Linda Paulk with Sky Ranch a nonprofit camp for kids in Texas.

Topic: Dr. Urschel joined me to talk about addiction. Today is Super Bowl Sunday and it is estimated that more bets are placed on the Super Bowl than any other sporting event and although gambling doesn't have to be a problem there are people who are addicted to gambling much as they would be addicted to drugs, alcohol or food. Dr. Urschel talked about the science of addiction and how using a medical and 12 step approach can help heal the addicted brain. Dr. Urschel also gave advice to families dealing with a loved one who is an addict. Linda Paulk joined me to talk about Sky Ranch a non profit camp for kids from around Texas. We talked about the programs offered at the camp to help kids deal with life issues and we also talked about Sky Ranch's program aimed at sending the kids of parents who are incarcerated to Sky Ranch. We also promoted the upcoming Cowboys and Cowboys Benefit for Sky Ranch which features former Dallas Cowboys as well as real Rodeo Cowboys.

February 9, 2014

Issue covered: Heart Health Awareness

Guests: Dr. Annika Illum a Cardiologist with Texas Health Plano, Claire Leigh Kinzy the Senior Director of Marketing and Communications for the American Heart Association of North Texas and Jennifer Prinze and Sara Stewart with Mended Little Hearts.

Topic: February is Heart Health Awareness Month and Dr. Illum talked about what every one should know about heart disease including the signs of a heart attack and how they are different for men and women and we talked about the importance of diet and exercise when it comes to heart health. Claire Leigh Kinzy talked about the work that the American Heart Association does to further research into heart disease and the programs and services offered to people who have heart disease in our area. Jennifer Prinze and Sara Stewart joined me to talk about Mended Little Hearts a nonprofit that focuses on babies and congenital heart defects. Both Jennifer and Sara have children born with heart defects and they want to raise awareness about congenital heart defects as well as raise awareness about Mended Little Hearts and how this organization helps families who have a child hospitalized with a heart defect.

February 16, 2014

Issues Covered: Health Related Issues including Eating Disorders and physical and mental disabilities.

Guests: Kimberly Martinez the Executive Director of the Elisa Project and Anita Stephenson and Shea Needham with Ability Connection Texas.

Topic: Earlier this month the NBC TV Show The Biggest Loser crowned it's winner Rachel Frederickson who went from 260 pounds at the start of the season to just 105 pounds on the Finale and that sparked a debate about whether or not Rachel is suffering from an eating disorder. Kimberly Martinez the Executive Director of the local nonprofit The Elisa Project joined me to talk about eating disorders and what people should be on the lookout for. Kimberly also talked about the work that the Elisa Project does to help those dealing with eating disorders and their families. Anita Stephenson and Shea Needham joined me to talk about the work that Ability Connection does to help children and adults with disabilities here in North Texas. It is estimated that 1 in 5 people in the US will at some point have a disability. We also promoted the upcoming Ability Walk which will benefit Ability Connection Texas. The walk will be held at the Dallas Zoo on March 1st and will feature organizations providing services to those with disabilities.

February 23, 2014

Issues Covered: Economy and Education and Military Support

Guests: Lyn Berman the Executive Director of Attitudes and Attire a nonprofit that helps women seeking self sufficiency and Jenny Altick a former addict who received help through Attitudes and Attire.

Topic: Lyn Berman the Founder and Executive Director of the non profit Attitudes and Attire joined me to talk about the work that the non profit does here in North Texas to help women attain self sufficiency. Many of the clients of Attitudes and Attire are single moms who have hit hard times, some are recovering addicts and others are out of the prison system. We also talked about their new program Boots to Heels which helps military women who are returning to civilian life adjust to their new norm and we promoted the upcoming Attitudes and Attire Fashion Show and Luncheon which will be held at Dallas Market Hall on February 27th. Jenny Altick talked about how Attitudes and Attire helped her after she was arrested and set to mandatory rehab thru the justice system. Jenny shared her personal journey and how thanks to Attitudes and Attire she is now clean and sober and working as a graphics designer a job she thought she would never get because of her past.

March 2, 2014

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues including Multiple Sclerosis and Pediatric Cancers as well as Economic Issues.

Guests: Jerry Su the CEO of the Firefly Run, Lori Waggoner the Senior Director of Development for Annual and Community Support at Children's Medical Center, Dr. Nancy Monson and Leah Weatherl the Vice President of Development for the North Texas Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.

Topic: Jerry Su and Lori Waggoner joined me to talk about the upcoming Firefly Run which will be held in Plano's Campus at Legacy. The unique night time run will benefit Children's Medical Center and Lori Waggoner talked about the nonprofit hospital and how it helps families in our community and how the hospital is also responsible for cutting edge research. The hospital, as a not for profit, relies on the help of the community to help those families who have financial needs. Dr. Nancy Monson and Leah Weatherl joined me for the second segment of the program to promote MS Awareness week which starts on March 3rd. Dr. Monson talked about the groundbreaking research being done at UT Southwestern into this debilitating disease and how soon researchers are confident they will be able to come up with a vaccine. Leah Weatherl, who has MS, talked about her diagnosis and about the programs that are offered by the MS Society to help people like her and their families dealing with MS.

March 9, 2014

Issues Covered: Education, Literacy, Health Issues and Economy.

Guests: Lisa Hembry the CEO of Literacy Instruction for Texas and Shannon Hilgart the Executive Director of the Aids Outreach Center in Fort Worth.

Topic: The month of March is Reading Month and Lisa Hembry with Literacy Instruction for Texas joined me to talk about the importance of reading and literacy. We talked about illiteracies impact on the economy and we promoted the programs offered by LIFT to adults in our community who cannot read. We talked about their GED and ESL classes and the LIFT a Paw for literacy program that pairs therapy dogs with at risk youth. Shannon Hilgart joined me to talk about the Tarrant County Aid's Walk which is coming up Sunday, March 22nd. The walk will benefit Aids Outreach of Tarrant County and Shannon talked about the programs and services offered by Aids Outreach. She also talked about the misconception that a lot of people have that there is now a cure for Aids, which there is not, but that misconception puts more people at risk because they have unsafe sex. We are all at risk for HIV and Aids if we do not practice safe sex and many people still think it is a gay man's disease but the rate for women is on the rise and the rate among young teens and the elderly is also on the rise.

Issues: Grief and depression and Education and Economics as well as Gang Violence

Guests: Leslie Lingnell the founder and Executive Director of Camp Sol, Sara Tusant a Dallas mother who lost her 2 year old son Solomon in a drowning accident, Dolores Sosa Green the Executive Director of the Trinity River Mission and Vicente Argueta a Senior who is helped by TRM.

Topic: Leslie Lingnell and Sara Tusant joined me to talk about Camp Sol a non profit here in North Texas that provides support to families who have experienced the death of a child. Sara lost her 2 year old son three years ago in a horrific drowning accident and talked about how she and her family have been helped by Camp Sol's retreats and annual programs. Leslie talked about the importance of having a camp where families can be with other families that understand and she also talked about grief counseling and healing that helps families stay together rather than fall apart after a tragedy like the loss of a child. We also promoted the upcoming Camp Sol Heart and Soul 5K which will be held in Plano on Saturday, April 10th. Dolores Sosa Green and Vicente Argueta joined me to talk about the Trinity River Mission TRM... Tutor Read and Mentor... a volunteer based community learning center that helps kids in economically disadvantaged areas of West Dallas stay in school and broadens their horizons. Vicente who is a senior in High School talked about the Believe and Achieve Program that he has been part of since middle school and how the program has helped him stay out of gangs and plan a brighter future.

March 23, 2014

Issues Covered: Health Related Issues, Education and Economics.

Guests: Martha Blaine the Executive Director of Community Council of Greater Dallas and Bill Firpi with the Diabetes Association of North Texas.

Topic: Martha Blaine joined me to talk about the work that the Community Council of Greater Dallas does in our area to connect people with social services from programs for the aging to education programs aimed at the youth in our area. Martha talked about the upcoming Get Kidz Fit Festival, a free family event for all of North Texas, aimed at educating the public about the health benefits of eating right and exercising. The festival will be held at Dallas Market Hall on Saturday, April 5th and will feature fun activities for the kids as well as educational activities for parents and their kids. We also talked about the Social Services Hotline 2-1-1 and the March 31st deadline for people to sign up for the Affordable Care Act's health insurance plans. The Community Council is helping people with navigators who are available by phone to help them sign up. Bill Firpi joined me to talk about Diabetes Alert Day which is coming up on Tuesday, March 25th. Bill has type 2 Diabetes and he shared his personal journey with the disease and how he was able to get his diabetes under control by losing 100 pounds thru diet and exercise.

Topic: Spring storm season officially kicks off in North Texas in April and T.D. Smyers with the Red Cross North Texas joined me to talk about emergency preparedness. April 3rd will mark the 3rd anniversary of the tornadoes that swept across our area leaving a path of destruction and this year the Red Cross North Texas is opening up a Digital Operations Center that will make responding to emergencies and disasters in our area more efficient and will help better connect people with services. T.D. talked about how we should all be prepared for storms like the ones that hit us on April 3rd but also other disasters. Every year North Texas suffers devastating losses due to tornadoes, hail damage, lightning strikes and high winds and the best way to be prepared is to follow the guidelines on the Red Cross' website so that you can have an emergency kit in your home. T.D. also talked about all the other programs offered by the Red Cross including swimming lessons, CPR training, Military Assistance and, of course, help after someone has lost their home to a fire. We also encouraged listeners to volunteer for the Red Cross

KHKS Appearances and Events for non profits

Throughout the year KHKS helps promote morning show host Kidd Kraddick's non profit Kidd's Kids. The non profit helps send sick kids to Disney World every year. During the 3rd Quarter there were several restaurants who donated part of their proceeds to Kidd's Kids including Raising Cane's Chicken Fingers and Chili's Restaurants.

KHKS' Priscilla Kinkaid serves as the Assistant Director of the US Wounded Soldiers Foundation, a nonprofit whose mission is to provide for the needs of our combat veterans deployed in Iraq and Afghanistan. The foundation helps with clothing and toiletries and also helps out the Fisher House, which is similar to Ronald McDonald Houses, providing a place for military families to stay when they have a loved one in a military hospital.

KHKS' Priscilla Kinkaid is a member of the Plano ISD PTA and a member of the Plano West JROTC booster club.

On Tuesday, January 14th Anna de Haro was on hand for a special volunteer event at LIFT, Literacy Instruction for Texas, a Dallas nonprofit that helps adults learn to read in our area as well as helping people with their GED and with English as a second language classes. The event was aimed at raising awareness in the community about how people can get involved with the nonprofit.

KHKS helped Shryse, a woman from White Settlement, who has been battling ovarian cancer for several years, the cancer has spread to her gastric system, liver and her brain. Doctors have given her about 3-4 months while still continuing on radiation and chemo. On top of her battles with cancer, her house burned down in August. She, her 2 kids Ashtyn 11 (girl) and Kaleb 3 (boy)) and her fiancé moved in with Shryse's mom, but in November her fiancé left her. Shryse's 2 best friends reached out to KISS FM in January to tell us her story, and mentioned Shryse has always wanted to go to Vegas. KISS FM stepped up and sent Shryse and her two friends on an unforgettable trip to Las Vegas for 3 days to create lasting memories.

Anna de Haro, CCM&E Public Affairs Director Dallas/Fort Worth attended the 1st Quarter Ascertainment meeting with Community Leaders on Wednesday, January 29, 2011 at the offices of Cumulus Media Dallas/Fort Worth. The purpose of the meeting was to ask community leaders what they consider to be the main issues and concerns of the North Texas community.

Speakers:

***Lynn Davis the Executive Director of the Dallas Children's Advocacy Center. The mission of the Dallas Children's Advocacy Center (DCAC) is to improve the lives of abused children in Dallas County and to provide national leadership on child abuse issues. The issues of most importance to Lynn Davis involved Child Safety, Crime and Violence against children, mental and physical health issues and education.

***Rachel Branaman the Executive Director of Alley's House a nonprofit that helps teen moms and their children through mentoring, education and support resources. Rachel talked about the importance of educating youth about sex and the dangers of unprotected sex. The issues of concern for Rachel in the community are education, child safety, economic issues and healthcare.
