Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health, Education and Economy

Guests: Dr. John Carlo the former Medical Director for Dallas County Health and Human Services and the CEO of AIDS ARMS and Al James with the Crohn's Colitis Foundation of North Texas.

Topic: Dr. Carlo joined me to talk about the Ebola crisis in North Texas. This past week a man from Liberia, Africa was hospitalized at Dallas Presbyterian Hospital with Ebola, a highly contagious disease. It is the first case diagnosed in the United States and the diagnosis has led to fear in North Texas that the disease will spread. Dr. Carlo shared the facts about Ebola and how it is transmitted and offered up advice for people on how to protect themselves from the Ebola virus. He also talked about steps that the North Texas medical community as well as local government agencies are taking to protect the public. Dr. Carlo called in from downtown Dallas where he was getting ready for the annual Lifewalk benefitting AIDS ARMS and he discussed the similarities between the reaction to the Aids epidemic and Ebola. Al James joined me in the second segment of the program to talk about the work of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation here in North Texas and he shared information about irritable bowel diseases. Al James also talked about the upcoming Crohn's and Colitis Take Steps Walk in Fort Worth on October 18th.

October 12, 2014

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime and Law Enforcement and Child Safety Issues.

Guest: Lynn Davis the President and CEO of the Dallas Children's Advocacy Center.

Topic: This month we kicked off a campaign here at work to promote the work done by Children's Advocacy Centers and what they do to help sexually abused children in our area. Lynn Davis joined me to talk about their work at the Dallas agency and their services and programs for sexually abused children and their families. We also talked about signs that people should be on the lookout for when dealing with kids and the importance of reporting any suspected abuse. We also talked about the impact of abuse on a community.

October 19, 2014

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Healthcare, Economy, Education.

Guests: Dr. Joyce Mauk the President/CEO and Medical Director of the Child Study Center in Fort Worth and Andrea Reordan whose son Weston has Autism and is being helped by the Child Study Center, and Debbie Sardone with Cleaning for a Reason.

Topic: Dr. Mauk and Andrea joined me to talk about Learning Differences Month and innovative ways that the non profit the Child Study Center has for helping those with learning differences including Autism. Andrea shared her own personal journey with her son Weston and his diagnosis at the age of 2. We talked about signs that a child may have autism or some other learning difference and what steps parents should take and the best way to help a child with learning differences. Autism continues to be the fastest growing serious developmental disability in the US, with more children being diagnosed with autism this year than with diabetes, cancer and AIDs combined. Dr. Mauk talked about the latest research into autism. We also promoted the upcoming Puzzle Scuttle 5K run and walk which will benefit the Child Study Center and their programs and will raise awareness about the issue of autism. The event will be held at TCU in Fort Worth. For the last 10 minutes of the program Debbie Sardone of Cleaning for a Reason joined me to talk about free house cleaning for those who have been diagnosed with Breast Cancer. October is Breast Cancer Awareness and Debbie talked about how with all of the doctors appointments, hospital visits and reaction to treatment so many people dealing with a breast cancer diagnosis do not have time or the inclination to clean their home. We also talked about the work that the American Cancer Society does to help those with breast cancer.

October 26, 2014

Issues Covered: Cyber Security, Identity Theft and Health Issues.

Guests: Ram Guarg a Cyber Security Expert and the founder of Software Assurance and Marla Payne with the National Brain Tumor Society the largest nonprofit dedicated to the brain community in the United States.

Topic: Apple recently unveiled a new App called Apple Pay that allows users to use their iPhones to pay for purchases but with the threat of identity theft just how safe is Apple Pay and as we head in to the holiday season how can North Texans protect themselves from those who may be out to do them harm online. Ram joined me to talk about ways people can protect themselves on line and he also talked about the security risks when online shopping. We also talked about what needs to be done if you have been the victim of identity theft. Marla Payne joined me to talk about the work that the National Brain Tumor Society does here in our area to raise awareness and research dollars for a cure. She also promoted the upcoming 9th Annual Brain Tumor Walk which will take place Saturday, November 8th at Trinity Park in Fort Worth. Marla's husband died of a brain tumor and she

shared her own personal story of her husband's diagnosis and treatment. One of our co-workers is a brain tumor survivor but many are not as lucky and that is why research is so important.

November 2, 2014

Issues Covered: Health, Education and Economy

Guests: Jan Hale with the American Red Cross Blood Services Division, Jennifer Bartkowski the CEO of the Girl Scouts of North Texas and Shawn Wills the Chief Development Officer for CitySquare a nonprofit that helps the poor in our area.

Topic: The holidays are a critical time for blood banks in North Texas as the need for blood rises but the number of donors decreases due to holiday schedules. Jan Hale joined me to talk about the need for blood donors and how one donation can save up to 3 lives. We promoted the upcoming Give and Gobble Blood Drive which will be held on November 24th at Red Cross headquarters in Dallas. Shawn Wills with CitySquare and Jennifer Bartkowski with the Girl Scouts joined me to talk about the November Share the Warmth Blanket Drive where people can donate a blanket or bed linens to help those who are living in transitional housing or at shelters in North Texas. The Girl Scouts are helping to raise awareness about CitySquare by taking a lead role in the blanket drive. Shawn Wills talked about the services and programs offered by CitySquare to make the community stronger and better economically and we talked about ways that North Texans can help.

November 9, 2014

Issues Covered: Military Support, Education, Health and Economy.

Guest: Nekima Booker with the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas and Operation Healthy Reunions a program aimed at helping military men and women returning home and David Hamilton with America's Future Series.

Topic: Tuesday is Veteran's Day and Nekima Booker joined me to talk about how we should honor veterans in our community and to highlight programs available here in North Texas to help our veterans. Nekima talked about the work that the Coalition does to build bridges between local community resources, national resources and veterans and their families so that they can rebuild their lives in the aftermath of war. Nekima talked about the work of Operation Healthy Reunions in dealing with the invisible scars of war and how the program helps veterans dealing with post traumatic stress and also how they help the spouses and children of veterans. David Hamilton joined the conversation to talk about how America's Future Series is working with the Veteran's Coalition of North Central Texas to help get Veterans back to work. We also promoted our company's Show Your Stripes campaign which helps connect employers looking to hire vets with vets in our area in need of employment.

Guests: Jill Cumnock the CEO of the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas, Annie Carter the Community Development Manager of the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas and Dr. Russell Wagner and Orthopedic Surgeon who treats those with chronic arthritis.

Topic: Jill Cumnock with the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas joined me to talk about the Trains at North Park which benefits the Ronald McDonald House. Jill talked about the work that the Ronald McDonald House does as a home away from home for families who have a child being treated at one of our many children's hospitals and how the house is able to economically help those families who are already spending so much money on their child's healthcare. Annie Carter with the Arthritis Foundation and Dr. Russell Wagner joined me to talk about another holiday tradition in North Texas, the annual Jingle Bell Run Walk for Arthritis. The event which will be held December 6th in Fort Worth raises awareness and money for research in to finding a cure for arthritis. Annie talked about the services and programs offered by the Arthritis Foundation and Dr. Wagner shared information on what people should know about the leading cause of disability in this country among Americans over the age of 15.

Topic: Charmaine Solomon and Elizabeth Romo joined me to promote the upcoming Santa Run which benefits My Possibilities, a nonprofit that serves adults with disabilities from autism to down syndrome. Charmaine talked about founding the nonprofit after her son, who deals with a learning disability, graduated from High School and she had no where to take him and she said

she met so many other parents in the same situation so they started My Possibilities as a continuing education center for those with learning differences. Elizabeth talked about the services and programs offered and the need for volunteers to help out. Major Matthews and Pat Patey with the Salvation Army DFW joined me to talk about the issue of helping the needy this holiday season and why the programs offered by the Salvation Army are important and how they help people get back on their feet. With the holidays right around the corner the Salvation Army has kicked off their biggest fundraisers of the year including the Red Kettle campaign which asks people to donate their change to help the needy and the Angel Tree program which provides holiday gifts for needy kids. Major Matthews and Pat Patey talked about the many programs offered by the Salvation Army throughout the year not just during the holidays.

Typically the holidays are one of the most dangerous times of the year on our nation's roadways because of drunk drivers. Ray Carter shared the story of his son who was killed by a drunk driver and how now he and his family speak on behalf of victims to spread the message not to Drink and Drive. Suzette talked about ways people can stay safe and she talked about the charges that face people who are caught drinking and driving. Suzette and Ray also talked about the services and programs offered by MADD to victims and their families.

Guests: Colleen Brinkman with the North Texas Food Bank and Scotty Landry the President and CEO of the Make A Wish Foundation of North Texas,

Colleen Brinkman talked about the work that the North Texas Food Bank does to help feed the hungry in our area and the vast number of services and programs aimed at helping the most vulnerable from children to senior citizens. Scotty talked about the kids and their families who benefit from the wish and how the community can get involved to help grant the wishes

We also talked about those people who want to be fiscally fit in the New Year. Todd talked about the services and programs offered by Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Greater Dallas and their free webinars. The nonprofit's mission is to help people so that they do not go in to debt and they also offer housing counseling. Todd says the best time to reach out to their agency is when you aren't in financial straits but rather before the situation becomes an emergency. He offered tips on finding the best deals in stores and online and how sometimes the best gifts are gifts from the heart that don't cost a thing. We also talked about the importance of educating children about finances.

We talked about how people qualify for a Habitat home and the way the system is a hand up not a hand out. We also talked about the home owner classes they offer for those going thru the program. We also talked about the volunteer opportunities. Suzie Miller joined me to talk about the gift of life. With the holidays now in full swing and people searching for the perfect gift we talked about the gift of organ donation. Currently there are over 100 thousand men, women and children waiting on life saving organ transplants. Suzie talked about the importance of families talking about their wishes concerning organ donation and registering online at Donate Life Texas.

The nonprofit has been in North Texas for 135 years serving as a home for orphaned children and helping the elderly. Other programs offered by Buckner include transitional living facilities for foster kids who are in need of placement and also living arrangements for people living domestic violence situations. Greg talked about what people should think about prior to going through the adoption or foster care process and the number of children here in Texas awaiting foster families or forever homes.

KHKS Appearances and Events for non profits

Throughout the year KHKS helps promote morning show host Kidd Kraddick's non profit Kidd's Kids. The non profit helps send sick kids to Disney World every year. During the 3rd Quarter there were several restaurants who donated part of their proceeds to Kidd's Kids including Raising Cane's Chicken Fingers and Chili's Restaurants.

KHKS' Priscilla Kinkaid serves as the Assistant Director of the US Wounded Soldiers Foundation, a nonprofit whose mission is to provide for the needs of our combat veterans deployed in Iraq and Afghanistan. The foundation helps with clothing and toiletries and also helps out the Fisher House, which is similar to Ronald McDonald Houses, providing a place for military families to stay when they have a loved one in a military hospital.

On Wednesday October 1st Anna de Haro, the Public Affairs Director for I Heart Media Dallas/Fort Worth, emceed the Alley's House Luncheon featuring former First Daughter Barbara Pierce Bush as the keynote speaker. The event raises money for Alley's House which helps teen moms and their children thru mentoring programs and services aimed at breaking the cycle of poverty.

On Saturday October 4th Anna de Haro, the Public Affairs Director for I Heart Media Dallas/Fort Worth, emceed the Alzheimer's Walk at Victory Park in Dallas raising awareness of this debilitating disease and raising funds to find a cure and to help provide funding for the services and programs offered by the Alzheimer's Association in North Texas.
