April 4, 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30-minute program

Issues Covered: Child Abuse Prevention Month, Education and Community Involvement and the Impact that Coronavirus has had on children who are stuck at home with their abusers.

Guest: Kathleen LaValle the President and CEO of Dallas CASA.

Topic: The month of April is Child Abuse Prevention Month and so Kathleen LaValle from Dallas CASA joined me to talk about what we all need to be on the lookout for when it comes to child abuse. Tragically during the Covid 19 pandemic there has been an increase in the number of children who have been hospitalized as a result of abuse and Kathleen talked about what they have encountered here in North Texas and how many new children have come under their care. Kathleen talked about the stressors that have led to parents and/or caregivers taking out their anger and fear on children in their care and we talked about how since many kids are not going to school the teachers and counselors who were the first line of defense in helping abused kids are no longer seeing the children. Kathleen spoke of the work that CASA does to help children who have been abused and neglected and how the community can get involved to help and how they can become CASA volunteers to help children who are navigating the child welfare system. We spoke of the requirements for volunteers and the impact that the CASA volunteers make and the future for children who have been abused and neglected.

April 11, 2021

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues, Education Issues and Economic Issues.

Guests: Alexandria Lee with the We Love U Foundation and Kirsten James the Executive Director of Project Transformation North Texas.

Topic: Alexandria Lee with the We Love U Foundation joined me for the first part of the program to talk about the largetst mobile blood drive in North Texas which is taking place on April 11<sup>th</sup> at AT&T Stadium in Arlington. The blood drive is aimed at helping to replenish the blood supply in North Texas which is at critical levels due to the winter storm and the coronavirus pandemic which has kept regular blood donors from donating blood. Alexandria talked about the work that the We Love U Foundation does and the importance of giving back to your community. Kirsten James with Project Transformation North Texas joined me for the second half of the program to talk about the work they do to provide educational help to underserved communities in North Texas and we talked about the Covid learning slide caused by school closures and the education gap that meant that some students didn't have access to computers or wifi to keep up with their classes. Kirsten talked about their literacy and homework assistance and what they are seeing in school districts around North Texas as a result of the pandemic and how educators have adapted to their new normal. We also promoted the upcoming online luncheon that will raise funds for Project Transformation and their summer learning programs that are aimed at helping students get back at grade level reading.

April 18, 2021

Issues Covered: Education Issues and Economic Issues

Guest: Marcia Page the President and CEO of Education is Freedom a nonprofit that provides college career and life readiness programs to middle and high schoolers in underserved communities.

Topic: With more and more educators concerned with the Covid learning slide I am highlighting organizations in North Texas doing what they can to make sure that students do not fall behind. Marcia Page the President and CEO of Education is Freedom

joined me to talk about the work that they are doing to help students in underserved communities and what they are seeing first hand as a result of the pandemic and the impact that online schooling had on certain students. Marcia talked about their scholar programs, their homework help, their workforce readiness program that gets students who are not planning to seek a higher education ready for the real word. We also talked about their community connection which emphasizes the importance of volunteering in your community to help your neighbors in need.

April 25. 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Animal Rights and Protection, Economic Issues and Education

Guest: Maura Davies the Vice President of Marketing and Communications for the SPCA of Texas.

Topic: The Month of April has been Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Month, a time to raise awareness about important issues facing animals and how we can protect them. The issue became all the more relevant earlier this month here in North Texas when Dallas Police arrested a 20 year old man and charged him with killing two puppies. The killings were captured on video. Maura Davies joined me on the phone to talk about the work that the SPCA of Texas does to help prevent animal cruelty by raising awareness and educating the public as well as teaching people to report abuse of animals. Maura talked about the upcoming Strut Your Mutt the Race to End Animal Cruelty which will take place virtually and socially distanced in Dallas May 6<sup>th</sup> thru the 8<sup>th</sup> and how the funds raised by the event help fund the services and programs offered by the SPCA of Texas including their adopting services. Maura also talked about the need for foster pet parents and how many shelters are at capacity, we talked about spay and neuter services and the need to fix pets so that we can reduce the number of unwanted animals.

May 2, 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues and Covid's impact on nonprofits

Guest: Kara Altenbaumer Price with the March of Dimes North Texas

Topic: Mother's day is coming up next Sunday and we are focusing on the health of mother's to be by highlighting the work of the March of Dimes. Kara Altenbaumer Price joined me to talk about her own personal journey of having not one but two children born premature and how the March of Dimes helped her and also how the medicines that the March of Dimes helped develop was instrumental in the positive outcomes for her two sons. We promoted the upcoming March for Babies which will be virtual this year because of the Covid 19 pandemic and how the money raised goes towards vital research in to why babies are born pre-mature but also into research in to women's health. As we have learned in the past year, miracles can happen and cures are possible when money is directed towards research like the Covid 19 vaccine. We talked about Covid's impact on nonprofits and how Covid affects women who are pregnant and the safety of the vaccine for pregnant women and research being done in to that.

May 9, 2021 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues and Education

Guest: Vanita Halliburton the CEO and co-founder of the Grant Halliburton Foundation

Topic: The month of May is Mental Health Awareness Month and with the pandemic putting a strain on those with mental health issues it is more important than ever to highlight the work of nonprofits committed to helping to raise awareness about mental health issues and committed to helping those who are struggling. Vanita Halliburton joined me to talk about the work that the Grant Halliburton Foundation is doing at this time to help families with a loved one with mental health issues and the work they do to help youth who are struggling with depression, bipolar disorder or schizophrenia. Vanita talked about the impact that the pandemic has had on people and the rise in suicide something that Vanita knows about all to well because she lost her son to suicide. We also talked about the importance of teaching children resilience so that they can weather the ups and downs in life and learn the skills to deal with struggles and erasing the stigma of seeking help.

May 16, 2021 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Child Abuse and Neglect, Foster Care and Adoption thru Foster Care System and Preventing Human Trafficking.

Guests: Allicia Frye the CEO of Jonathan's Place and Jennifer Maddox the Director of Foster Care and Adoption and Shella Kiser a foster parent who adopted thru Jonathan's Place.

Topic: The month of May is Foster Care Awareness Month and Allicia, and Jennifer and Shella joined me to talk about the importance of people stepping up to become foster parents and also the importance of adopting through foster care but also the impact that the coronavirus has had on the work that they are doing and the increase in the number of children entering foster care because they are being abused at home during stay at home orders. Allicia talked about the work that Jonathan's Place does as an emergency shelter for kids who are taken from their families due to neglect and abuse and how Jonathan's Place helps those kids and we talked about their other programs aimed at helping the kids with education and mental health. We talked about their foster care and adoption programs and Jennifer talked about educational classes for fostering and adopting and we talked about ways the community can help Jonathan's Place throughout the year. Shella shared her own personal journey of growing up in the foster care system herself and how when she married she knew that she would adopt thru the foster care system and also serve as a foster parent. Allicia also talked about their Safe Place program which aims to keep runaways off the streets and safe so that they do not become victims of human trafficking.

May 23. 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Military and Veteran Support, Economic issues, Education and Mental Health

Guest: Stephen Holley the Co-founder and CEO of Carry the Load

Topic: Next week end is Memorial Week end and as a way to remind people of the true meaning of Memorial Day as a way to remember those who died in service to our country I wanted to highlight the upcoming Carry the Load Memorial March which will take place at Reverchon Park in Dallas on Sunday, May 30<sup>th</sup> and Monday, May 31<sup>st</sup>. Stephen Holley the co-founder and CEO of Carry the Load joined me to talk about his own stint as a Navy Seal and how he created the nonprofit as a way to restore the true meaning of Memorial Day but also as a nonprofit to help military families and veterans who are returning to a new normal as a result of their service and the wounds they carry both physical and mental. Stephen talked about the many programs and services offered by Carry the Load and the numerous nonprofits here locally that benefit from the Memorial March. He also talked about their effort to inspire patriotism in our nation's youth.

May 30, 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Military and Veteran support services and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues.

Guest: Jacob Schick the Executive Director of 22 Kill

Topic:.It is Memorial Week end a time to remember those who have fallen while protecting our country and this week end in Dallas the annual Carry the Load March will once again be held at Reverchon Park in Dallas and this year the march is once again an in person event. The March raises awareness of the true meaning of Memorial Day and also raises money for charities helping our military and first responders. One of the beneficiaries of this year's Carry the Load March is the nonprofit 22 Kill. Jacob Schick is the Executive Director of the nonprofit 22 Kill and he joined me to talk about how his agency is helping with the mental health needs of our veterans which are now being impacted by the effects of stay at home orders. 22 Kill was started as a result of the alarming number of suicides amongst our veterans with national statistics showing that on average every day 22 veterans take their own life. 22 Kill raises awareness about the suicide epidemic plaguing our country's veterans and offers support programs that provide services to our vets so that they can overcome depression and anxiety. Jacob shared his own personal journey. He was severely injured in Iraq and lost his leg to combat but it was the invisible wounds of battle that almost cost him his life and that is why he is committed to helping those who are dealing with suicidal thoughts. We also let people know that if they are in crisis that there is help and how 22 Kill can be a resource for those veterans who feel hopeless.

June 6, 2021 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issue and the desperate need for blood in North Texas as a result of the pandemic.

Guest: Linda Goelzer with Carter Blood Care.

Topic: Linda Goelzer joined me to talk about the impact that the coronavirus pandemic has had on our blood supply with the supply currently at a critical level since many of the blood drives that they rely on for a constant supply have been canceled as a result of the pandemic. The critical shortage makes this year's summer blood drive more important than ever. The Summer Blood Drive will take place June 21<sup>st</sup> through June 26th at various locations around the Metroplex. It is estimated that every two seconds someone in the US needs blood. Linda talked about the work that Carter Blood Care does in our area to educate people about the need for blood and how to help out and encouraged people to donate blood or to hold blood drives at their churches, schools or place of business this summer with Carter Blood Care since they can take the necessary precautions to make sure that social distancing guidelines are adhered to. We talked about misconceptions about giving blood and who is eligible to donate and how many people are impacted by one donation since blood is used for burn patients, patients undergoing chemotherapy and victims of car accidents or gunshots.

June 13, 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issue Covered: Health Issue and Education and Coronavirus Pandemics impact on those with immunocompromised systems. Guests: Jacqueline Leech the Executive Director of the Crohns and Colitis Foundation of North Texas and Landon Stephens one of the honored heroes for this year's Take Steps Walk.

Topic: The Crohns and Colitis Foundation is gearing up for an in person Take Steps Walk at the Fort Worth Zoo on June 27<sup>th</sup> and after taking a hit with their fundraising efforts due to the pandemic the upcoming Walk is a very big deal. Jacqueline Leech joined me to talk about how the work that the foundation does was impacted by the pandemic and how they adapted to help their patients and the families of those with IBD. We also talked about the research that continues and Landon Stephens joined me on the phone to talk about his own personal journey with Crohns disease. He was diagnosed at the age of 10 after dealing with bowel issues for several years and not knowing what was going on. He talked about his surgeries and his treatments and how now his younger brother has also been diagnosed. Landon shared with the Crohns and Colitis Foundation means to him and his family and how they have helped them and we promoted the upcoming Take Steps Walk and the importance of an in person event.

June 20, 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Community Involvement and Men's Health Issues

Guests: Dr. Edmund Vu with MedExpress Urgent Care in Dallas and Tammy Richards the CEO of Volunteer Now. Topic: Father's Day is a perfect time to highlight men's health issues and Dr. Vu joined me for the first part of the program to talk about men's health and what men and the people who love them should be thinking about and taking care of from annual checkups to prostate exams and heart and colon health. Dr. Vu talked about how the majority of men put off their regular exams and how that puts them at risk for poor outcomes because often times they are diagnosed at later stages of disease. We talked about measures that men can take to improve their health. Tammy Richards joined me for the second part of the program to talk about the importance of volunteering during the summer months and the need for volunteers in the wake of the pandemic with more and more nonprofits needing help from volunteers. We talked about the economic impact that volunteering has and how easy it is to volunteer with Volunteer Now's Voly dot org website which provides thousands of volunteer opportunities so that people can find a good match. We also talked about their work matching people to community service projects and their thrift store to help nonprofits and the background check program that helps nonprofits. Summer is a perfect time for people to volunteer especially students looking to build up their college applications.

June 27. 2021

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Men's Health and Education and Community Involvement.

Guests: Todd Mark the Executive Director of Friends of Consumer Freedom.

Topic: The month of June is National Homeownership Month. It is a time to reflect on the impact that home ownership has on a family, a neighborhood and on the economy as a whole but for many the dream of homeownership seems beyond their reach and that is where nonprofits like Friends of Consumer Freedom can help by setting up a plan and a budget to help people get in to a home. Todd Mark joined me to talk about the current housing market and how difficult it has been for first time home buyers because homes are going for well over asking price and he talked about how Friends of Consumer Freedom can help people so that they can improve their credit and improve their standing so that they can get in to a home. We also talked about the importance of affordable housing in North Texas because if people are not able to find a home it decreases the pool of employees for businesses in a specific area. Todd also talked about financial literacy classes offered by his nonprofit and budgeting and getting out of debt programs.
