October 4, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education and Learning Differences and Teaching in the Age of Covid 19

Guests: Suzanne Stell the Executive Director of the Shelton School and Emma McNairy a senior at Shelton who has dyslexia.. Topic: October is Learning Differences Awareness Month and Suzanne joined me to talk about how Shelton leads the way nationally in helping students with learning differences from dyslexia to ADHD and she talked about how Covid 19 has changed the way educators work with kids with learning differences. Suzanne talked about the research that goes on at the lab at the school to find new ways of teaching students with learning differences at how their method of teaching those with learning differences is shared with public schools here in North Texas and throughout the country and also how families who have kids with learning differences can take part in seminars and classes to help their child even if that child does not go to Shelton. Emma McNairy a senior at Shelton talked about dealing with dyslexia, when she was diagnosed and how it has impacted her life. Suzanne talked about what all parents should know about signs of learning differences and the importance of early intervention so that students don't fall behind or begin to show signs of mental health issues because they feel less than when the truth is they just learn differently.

October 11, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Arts and Culture and Education

Guests: Jennifer Scripps the Director of the Office of Cultural Affairs for the City of Dallas and Terry Loftis the Executive Director of TACA, the Arts Community Alliance

Topic: The Coronavirus pandemic has had a huge impact on the economy across the country with businesses closing down because of the loss of revenue and with events like concerts and live theater productions on hold because of the pandemic arts organizations are among the hardest hit. Jennifer Scripps the Director of the Office of Cultural Affairs for the City of Dallas and Terry Loftis the Executive Director of TACA, the Arts Community Alliance, joined me to talk about the impact that Covid 19 has had on the North Texas Arts community and what is being done to help out nonprofits and other arts organizations. We talked about how arts organizations have adapted to showing art virtually and doing virtual concerts and plays and even drive thru art exhibits at city parking garages. We also talked about how the community has stepped up to help out. We talked about the importance of the arts not just to the economy of North Texas but also how the arts have helped people deal with the pandemic by allowing them to express themselves. The healing power of the arts has long been known especially for those undergoing trauma or dealing with loss. Jennifer and Terry also talked about the impact of the pandemic on arts education and what teachers are doing to make sure that their students still have access to music instruction, art instruction and theater.

October 18, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Abuse Prevention

Guest: Lynn McLean the CEO of Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County.

Topic: Lynn McLean the CEO of the Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County joined me to talk about the upcoming virtual Teddy Bear Ride that will benefit the Children's Advocacy Center and their work with abused and neglected kids in Collin County. The ride will take place on Sunday, October 25th and unlike years past the number of participants is being limited because of the Coronavirus pandemic with other riders being asked to ride virtually and raise awareness and funds for the Advocacy Center. Lynn talked about the impact that the pandemic has had on the number of children being abused because children are being sheltered in abusive homes with no teachers or other outsiders having access to see signs of abuse who can help. Lynn also talked about what we can do during this time to make sure we are checking up on children and she talked about the work that the Advocacy Center does to help children and their families.

October 25, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime Prevention, Economic Issues, and Domestic Violence Awareness

Guest: Paige Flink the Executive Director of the Family Place.

Topic: October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Paige joined me to talk about what we should all know about family violence the signs to be on the lookout for and the impact that this problem has on families and on our community and how the pandemic has only exacerbated the situation with victims being forced to shelter at home with their abuser. Paige talked about the work that the Family Place does to raise awareness about the issue of domestic violence but also to help the victims and their families. We talked about safety planning the abuse hotline and ways to help those who are being abused especially now that people are social distancing how to stay connected so that we can check in to make sure people are safe. We also talked about the Partners Card campaign which will raise funds for the Family Place's services and programs including their transitional living and emergency shelters. We also talked about the increase in dating violence among youth and the need for parents to understand that young women and men can also be the victims of domestic violence and the link between bullying and domestic violence.

November 1. 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues, premature birth and healthy babies and animal rights and protection.

Guests: Dr. Terry Major Kincade a local neonatologist and March of Dimes Board Member and Maura Davies the Vice President of Communications for the SPCA of Texas.

Topic: The month of November is National Prematurity Awareness Month. It is a time to reflect on the nearly 400 thousand babies born pre-term each year in the US and to raise awareness about what moms to be or even women thinking of becoming a mom can do to make sure that they have a healthy baby. Dr. Major Kincade joined me on the phone to talk about the work that the March of Dimes does to educate the public and to fund important research to end pre-term births. We talked about an upcoming online event being presented by the March of Dimes featuring experts on fertility and nutrition and also experts on grief to help those who have lost a baby. The event titled Millennials and Motherhood is aimed at educating women so that they know that they are not alone on the journey with the March of Dimes helping moms thru every stage of the pregnancy journey. We also talked about the research taking place and the advancements that have been made to help babies who are born premature. For the second segment of the program I was joined on the phone by Maura Davies the Vice President of Communications for the SPCA of Texas. The SPCA is gearing up for their annual Strut Your Mutt which is going virtual this year because of the Coronavirus pandemic and Maura talked about how people can get involved to not only raise awareness about animal rights and protection issues but also raise funds for the work that the SPCA does. Since Christmas is right around the corner we also talked about the SPCA of Texas' Home for the Holidays event at North Park Center in Dallas that will try to find forever homes for dogs and cats and how the pandemic has forced them to limit the animals on site but people can see animals virtually. Maura also talked about what everyone should know before getting a pet and teaching responsibility and how to take care of an animal. We talked about the services and programs offered by the SPCA of Texas and how adoption of a pet through the SPCA works. We also talked about their work to raise awareness about spaying and neutering and we talked about their work to protect animals from neglect and abuse.

November 8, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Education and Veterans Issues

Guests: Major Todd Hawks one of the Co-Commanders of the Salvation Army DFW.

Topic: Major Todd Hawks with the Salvation Army North Texas joined me to talk about the issue of helping the needy this holiday season and why the programs offered by the Salvation Army are important especially during this time when the Coronavirus pandemic has left so many people without jobs and at the brink of losing their homes and how they help people get back on their feet. With the holidays right around the corner the Salvation Army has kicked off their biggest fundraisers of the year including the Red Kettle campaign which asks people to donate their change to help the needy and the Angel Tree program which provides holiday gifts for needy kids. This year because of the pandemic they have taken the campaigns virtual with just a few in person locations with the theme this year of Rescue Christmas. We talked about the many programs offered by the Salvation Army throughout the year not just during the holidays that help young people, veterans, the poor and homeless and senior citizens.

November 15, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Health Issues

Guest: Jill Cumnock the CEO of the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas.

Topic: Jill Cumnock with the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas joined me to talk about the Trains at North Park which benefits the Ronald McDonald House. The Trains at North Park are up and running through January 3rd and Jill talked about what people can expect this year and the changes made to accommodate social distancing in an effort to keep everyone safe from the Coronavirus. Jill also talked about the work that the Ronald McDonald House does as a home away from home for families who have a child being treated at one of our many children's hospitals and how the house is able to economically help those families who are already spending so much money on their child's healthcare. We talked about how the house has adapted to the pandemic and how the community can help now that they are not allowed to go into the home to prepare meals for the residents as they have done in the past. This means that the house is having to spend more on meals and also cleaning supplies and how they have had to limit the number of families they can help so as to keep the house safe from the virus. We also talked about the scholarship program they have set up for children who have spent time at the Ronald McDonald House and their siblings so that they can go to college and we talked about the many volunteer opportunities and the ways that the community can help.

November 22, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues, Economic Issues and Education.

Guests: Giselle Patterson the Executive Director of the T. Boone Pickens YMCA in Dallas and Tommy Saxon with Bikes for Mission Arlington.

Topic: It is the Sunday before Thanksgiving and an annual tradition for so many North Texas families is going virtual this year as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic and that is the Turkey Trot which benefits the YMCA. Giselle Patterson the Executive Director of the T. Boone Pickens YMCA in Dallas joined me on the phone to talk about the upcoming virtual Turkey Trot and how people can get involved to not only get out and exercise but also to raise money for the programs offered by the YMCA including their pandemic relief programs for children and families. Giselle talked about how the YMCA has been providing child care services to health care workers on the front lines here in North Texas in the fight against the Coronavirus since the pandemic began and we also talked about their food pantries that have been helping to feed families. We talked about how the pandemic has changed the way they do their fitness classes and how many of their classes have had to go virtual including virtual CPR classes and virtual health education programs to help people dealing with Type 2 Diabetes. For the last segment of the program Tommy Saxon with Bikes for Mission Arlington joined me on the phone to talk about how they are getting ready for the holidays with a bike drive to give the children served by Mission Arlington a bike for Christmas. Tommy talked about the work that Mission Arlington has been doing during the pandemic to feed families and to help those who are struggling during the pandemic.

November 29, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Food Insecurity

Guests: Anna Kurian with the North Texas Food Bank and Iris Midler the founder of Chefs for Farmers.

Topic: This year more than ever as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic the face of hunger in North Texas has changed as more and more families wait for hours in lines for boxes of food. Anna Kurian joined me on the phone to talk about the increase in the number of people who are food insecure in our community as a result of the pandemic and she talked about what we can do to help out our local food pantries. We talked about how so many of the people seeking help this year were former donors who never thought that they would be in a position where they would need help from a food bank but because of the pandemic they have lost their jobs or they have had to take pay cuts and with their normal expenses they are not able to make ends meet. Iris Midler joined me for the last part of the program to talk about the upcoming Chefs for Farmers Wine and Food Festival which this year is raising funds to support those who work in the restaurant and hospitality industry which has been hit hard by the pandemic. The event will take place November 30th thru December 6th with virtual events and some in person events with limited seating so as to practice social distancing. Iris talked about the impact of the pandemic on chefs and farmers and those in the restaurant and hospitality industry and how people can help by buying tickets to the wine and food festival.

December 6, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy, Housing, Education and Community Involvement

Guest: Joli Robinson the Vice President of Government Relations for the Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity.

Topic: With the holidays in full swing I wanted to highlight the work that Habitat for Humanity does to help families find their Home for the Holidays and how even during the pandemic Habitat has not stopped with their mission to help families.. Jolie

talked about how Habitat works and how the nonprofit is not a hand out but a hand up and how families must qualify for the homes and give of their time through sweat equity to build their home alongside Habitat volunteers. We talked about how the families are selected and we talked about their Homeownership Center that is open to everyone to help teach them about home ownership, mortgages, financial literacy classes and home upkeep. We also talked about the advocacy work that Habitat for Humanity does in cities and state governments to lobby for affordable housing and the economic impact that a lack of affordable housing can have on a community. We also talked about the volunteer opportunities for people in North Texas throughout the year and how volunteering at build sites has changed because of the pandemic.

December 13, 2020 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy and Education and Child Safety.

Guests: Karen Hughes the President and CEO of Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps homeless children in our area. Topic: Karen Hughes joined me to talk about the upcoming Day 1 DFW a benefit event that will be held January 1st at Main Event locations in North Texas with limited tickets being sold to make sure that families are safe during the pandemic and how they are also having virtual events for free online with a donation being requested to go towards the programs offered by Vogel Alcove. Vogel Alcove is a nonprofit that helps the youngest victims of poverty in North Texas, homeless children. Karen talked about all the fun activities that will take place at Day 1 DFW but also the importance of an event like this to raise awareness about the issue of homeless children since so many people think the homeless are alcoholics or drug addicts and don't think of the youngest victims and their families. Karen talked about the programs that Vogel has in place to help kids from infant to 15 and their families as well so that the parents can get on their feet and break the cycle of poverty. We talked about the importance of early education for homeless children and how the programs offer a mental safety net for the kids so that they can feel safe and loved and not afraid of their financial circumstances or feel less than other kids. We also talked about how the pandemic has impacted the children's mental health and how Vogel Alcove has stepped in to help the children with their physical and mental health needs.
