April 7, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Abuse Prevention, Economic Issues, Drugs and Alcohol and Community Involvement.

Guests: Kathleen La Valle the President and CEO of Dallas CASA and Vallerie Dontes a CASA Volunteer.

Topic: The month of April is Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention Month and Kathleen La Valle and Vallerie Dontes joined me to talk about the work that CASA, Court Appointed Special Advocates does to help children who have been abused and neglected in our community. We talked about the need for CASA volunteers to help out the children who have been taken from their families and placed in the foster care system and how these volunteers are often times the only constant for years in the lives of the children under the state's care. Vallerie talked about how she became a volunteer, the training and how by helping the children she feels that she has made a difference rather than being someone who sits on the sidelines and wonders when will someone help these kids who have been abused and neglected. Kathleen talked about the work that CASA does and the impact that they are having in our community and we talked about what we all need to know about the signs of abuse and the best ways to prevent abuse.

April 14, 2019

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Animal Welfare Issues, Economy, Health Issues and Community Involvement

Guests: Maura Davies the Vice President of Communications for the SPCA of Texas and Victoria Albrecht the Marketing and Communications Manager for the SPCA of Texas and Hannah Beatty with Komen North Texas.

Topic: April is Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Month and in an effort to raise awareness about animal rights issues I invited Maura Davies and Victoria Albrecht with the SPCA of Texas to join me to talk about the services and programs that they have in place to help animals who have been abused and to raise awareness about the issue and to educate the public. We also promoted the upcoming Race To End Animal Cruelty which will benefit the SPCA. Strutt Your Mutt will be held in Dallas on May 11<sup>th</sup> and the race raises funds for the programs offered by the SPCA so that they can continue to take care of animals who are up for adoption and the funds help with spay and neuter programs to reduce the number of unwanted animals. For my second segment of the program I was joined by Hannah Beatty with Komen North Texas who joined me to talk about the Komen Race for the Cure North Texas which will be held Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup> at the Star in Frisco. The event raises funds for breast cancer research and for the programs offered by Komen North Texas to women and men who have been diagnosed with breast cancer. Hannah talked about the upcoming event and encouraged people to get involved and sign up for the Race and we also talked about the ongoing research being funded by Komen and also about the programs that help people affected by breast cancer here in North Texas.

April 21, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Alcohol and Drug Abuse Awareness and Treatment, Mental Health Issues.

Guest: Dr. Shailendra Chavda with USMD Irving an Internal Medicine Doctor who specializes in addiction.

Topic: April is Alcohol Awareness Month and with the rise in the number of people affected by alcohol abuse and opioid addiction Dr. Chavda joined me to talk about ways to deal with a loved one who is addicted to alcohol or drugs and how addiction affects the body and a person's health. We talked about reversible affects and non-reversible affects and we talked about best treatment options and how loved ones can approach an addict so that they will be open to treatment. We talked about AA and Alanon and we discussed the genetic predisposition to addiction and how to get healthy when dealing with addiction.

April 28, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: LGBTO Rights, Health Issues, Economic Issues and Crime and Violence.

Guests: Rafael McDonald and Leslie McMurray with Resource Center Dallas.

Topic: Rafael and Leslie joined me to talk about the work that Resource Center does to help those in the LGBTQ community here in North Texas. Two weeks ago 23 year old Muhlaysia Booker a transsexual woman was beaten in front of a crowd of people outside of a Dallas apartment complex following a traffic incident. The crime was caught on tape and garnered national attention and brought to light the dangers that many in the LGBTQ community face each and every day. Rafael and Leslie talked about how the attack on Ms. Booker is not considered a hate crime because the trans community is not protected by our laws and so Leslie will be speaking in Austin before lawmakers tomorrow to try and get the trans community listed as a protected class. Leslie is a trans woman and shared her own personal story. Rafael and Leslie talked about programs helping gays and trans people from children to seniors and they talked about the advocacy work that Resource Center does locally at the state level and at the national level to promote LGBTQ rights.

May 5, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Parenting, Child Welfare Issues, Education and Economic Issues and Mental Health Issues

Guest: Paul Gravely the Executive Director of The Parenting Center in Fort Worth

Topic: Next Sunday is Mother's Day and Paul Gravely joined me to talk about the work that The Parenting Center in Fort Worth does to help mothers and fathers become better parents. Paul spoke of their co-parenting classes that help parents who are divorced and who may be dealing with issues that are detrimental to the child's welfare because of arguments and using the child as a bargaining chip in the divorce. We also spoke of their HEAL program and their parenting hotline as well as their programs aimed at helping parents of children with physical and developmental disabilities. We talked about the Parenting Centers outreach to schools to help students learn about parenting and about issues that they may face as children when they have issues with their parents. We discussed that the work that they do is not just for people on the low socio economic scale but is open to all parents in the region as a support and as a resource.

May 12, 2109

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Welfare Issues, Economic Issues, Education, Foster Care and Adoption

Guests: Allicia Graham Frye the CEO of Jonathan's Place, Elizabeth Mosman the Director of Foster Care and Adoption. Topic: The month of May is Foster Care Awareness Month and since today is Mother's Day I asked Allicia, and Elizabeth to join me to talk about the importance of people stepping up to become foster parents and also the importance of adopting through foster care. Allicia talked about the work that Jonathan's Place does as an emergency shelter for kids who are taken from their families due to neglect and abuse and how Jonathan's Place helps those kids and we talked about their other programs aimed at helping the kids with education and mental health. We talked about their foster care and adoption programs and Elizabeth talked about educational classes for fostering and adopting and we talked about ways the community can help Jonathan's Place throughout the year.

May 19, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues, Hoarding and Community Involvement and Economic Issues.

Guests: Bonnie Cook the Executive Director of Mental Health America of Greater Dallas and Sgt Patrick Sowers with Operation Once in a Lifetime and Rock the Troops.

Topic: May is Mental Health Awareness Month and Bonnie Cook joined me to talk about the importance of people talking about their mental health issues and the importance of knowing that there are resources available to anyone struggling with depression, schizophrenia, bi-polar disorder or a multitude of other mental health issues and that their loved ones know that there are resources for them as well. Bonnie talked about the programs that Mental Health America of Greater Dallas offers to people in our area including the We Help Ourselves program targeted at youth and programs for senior citizens. We also talked about the upcoming hoarding conference being held in Dallas on June 6<sup>th</sup> and what people who are dealing with a hoarder need to know about the issue. For the second half of the program I was joined by Sgt. Patrick Sowers the founder of Operation Once in a

Lifetime a nonprofit that helps make the dreams of U.S. soldiers and their families come true. Sgt. Sowers talked about how he came up with the idea of a Make a Wish type of nonprofit for military members to help soldiers and their families go on vacation or to go visit a loved one or sometimes it is helping with bills so that someone doesn't lose a home. On May 25<sup>th</sup> the nonprofit will have a fundraiser called Rock The Troops to raise awareness and money for the programs and we promoted the event on the program.

May 26, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Military and Veteran support services and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues.

Guest: Steve Smith the Executive Director of FARM Farmers Assisting Returning Military and Tammy Richards the CEO of Volunteer Now.

Topic: It is Memorial Week end a time to remember those who have fallen while protecting our country and this week end in Dallas the annual Carry the Load March will once again be held at Reverchon Park in Dallas. The March begins this afternoon at 4 and ends tomorrow, Memorial Day at 12:16pm. One of the beneficiaries of this year's Carry the Load March is the nonprofit FARM Farmers Assisting Returning Military. The nonprofit was co-founded by Steve Smith and he talked about the work that FARM is doing to help veterans deal with mental health issues while also teaching them how to garden and farm and how they are also helping to find work and careers for the veterans. Steve shared his own personal struggles as a veteran and how he dealt with depression and PTSD and how he found "dirty therapy" to be extremely helpful and thought it would help other veterans and it has. We discussed the programs they have from FARM 101 to internships with area farmers and how they also work with other area nonprofits to find best practices for veterans who are struggling. We also talked about ways to honor the military over the Memorial Day week end. Tammy Richards joined me to talk about the upcoming Voly in the Park a volunteer festival that will highlight the good that is done when people volunteer in their community. More than 75 nonprofits will be on hand in Dallas for the Voly in the Park event. Tammy also shared the economic impact that volunteer hours have on a community and how Volunteer Now connects those who want to volunteer with a whole slew of agencies looking for volunteers.

June 2, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Guests: Linda Goelzer with Carter Blood Care.

Topic: Linda Goelzer joined me to talk about the upcoming Summer Blood Drive which will take place June 17<sup>th</sup> through June 22nd at various locations around the Metroplex. It is estimated that every two seconds someone in the US needs blood and during the summer months when people head out of town for vacation and high school students are out of school for summer break the need for blood donors rises. Linda talked about the work that Carter Blood Care does in our area to educate people about the need for blood and how to help out and encouraged people to donate blood or to hold blood drives at their churches, schools or place of business this summer. We talked about misconceptions about giving blood and who is eligible to donate and how many people are impacted by one donation since blood is used for burn patients, patients undergoing chemotherapy and victims of car accidents or gunshots.

June 9, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issue Covered: Economic Issues, Food Insecurity and Education.

Guests: Jennifer Pewitt the Associate Vice President over Aquatics for the Dallas YMCA and Betty Ewing Dicken the founder and Director of Signature an Art and Music Exhition that benefits Artists and Musicians in Recovery.

Topic: With many children now on summer vacation and swimming season in full swing I wanted to do a program about water safety especially since it is estimated that every day in the U.S. ten people drown and recently country star Granger Smith lost his toddler son in a drowning accident in the family's backyard. Jennifer talked about water safety and what every parent should know, when the best time to teach kids how to swim is and when they should be talking to their kids about water safety, we talked about precautions around pools, lakes and oceans and even around bathtubs because children can drown in just a few inches of water. Jennifer talked about the YMCA programs on water safety but also their other programs to families from sports to summer recreation and programs for senior citizens. Betty Ewing Dicken joined me for the last ten minutes of the program to talk about the upcoming Art and Music Exhibition that will be held in Dallas on June 14th that benefits Artists and Musicians in Recovery a nonprofit that helps people recovering from alcohol and drug addictions. We talked about the benefits of the arts in recovery and the work that the nonprofit does to help those who are struggling.

June 16, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Men's Health and Education and Community Involvement.

Guests: Dr. Suman Donepudi a family medicine physician with USMD in Frisco and Michael Moore the founder of the nonprofit Moore Time Ranch.

Topic: Today is Father's Day and Dr. Donepudi joined me to talk about men's health issues and what all men need to know about taking care of their health. We talked about signs and symptoms of heart disease and cancers that affect men like prostate cancer, testicular cancer. We also talked about low testosterone levels or Low T and how it can affect men in different ways and what to do if you have Low T and we also talked about mental health issues and stress reducers for men and the part that families play in making sure that the men in their lives take care of themselves. Michael Moore joined me to talk about the work that the nonprofit Moore Time Ranch is doing to help young men who are struggling with school or with family issues and how men in our community can step up to act as surrogates for young men who don't have a father figure in their life and importance of community in building young men into the leaders of tomorrow. Michael shared the education and mental health programs that Moore Time Ranch offers and he talked about mentorship opportunities.

June 23, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Home Ownership, Housing, Economic Issues.

Guest: Tosha Herron Bruff the Vice President of Government Relations for Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity.

Topic: The month of June is National Homeownership Month. It is a time to reflect on the impact that home ownership has on a family, a neighborhood and on the economy as a whole but for many the dream of homeownership seems beyond their reach and that is where nonprofits like Habitat for Humanity can help. Habitat for Humanity works with families to find a path to home ownership with the clients of Habitat putting in their own sweat equity to get in to a home but also they need to prove that they have good credit and that they make enough to sustain a home. Habitat has education classes for families even those who don't qualify to get a home can learn how to take steps to get in to a home and how to maintain a home. We also talked about the advocacy that Habitat does with lawmakers at the state level and the national level to make sure that there is affordable housing in cities and how the issue of affordable housing impacts the economy with many companies deciding not to move to an area if there isn't enough affordable housing for their workforce.

June 30, 2019

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Support for Law Enforcement

Guest: Jacob Schick the Executive Director of 22 Kill

Topic: It is the Sunday before the 4<sup>th</sup> of July and as we all get ready to celebrate our nation's independence we also need to reflect on the freedoms we enjoy thanks to the sacrifices that our military and their families have made. Jacob Schick the Executive Director of the nonprofit 22 Kill joined me to talk about how his agency is helping with the mental health needs of our veterans. 22 Kill was started as a result of the alarming number of suicides amongst our veterans with national statistics showing that on average every day 22 veterans take their own life. 22 Kill raises awareness about the suicide epidemic plaguing our country's veterans and offers support programs that provide services to our vets so that they can overcome depression and anxiety. Jacob shared his own personal journey. He was severely injured in Iraq and lost his leg to combat but it was the invisible wounds of battle that almost cost him his life and that is why he is committed to helping those who are dealing with suicidal thoughts. We also let people know that if they are in crisis that there is help and how 22 Kill can be a resource for those veterans who feel hopeless.
