30 minute program

Issues: Veterans Support, Mental Health, Economy

Guests: Ryan Zimmerer and Justin Rye the founder and president of Operation Mutt22

Topic: It is 4th of July weekend and as we celebrate our nation’s birthday and the freedom that we all enjoy thanks to the men and women in the military I wanted to highlight a North Texas nonprofit doing what it can to help our nation’s veterans. Ryan Zimmerer and Justin Rie are the founder and president of Operation Mutt22 a nonprofit that trains service dogs for veterans in need. Both Ryan and Justin are veterans and saw a need for service dogs for veterans dealing with mental health issues and physical disabilities. Operation Mutt22 trains the animals and then provides the service dogs to veterans who have applied for the animals. According to Ryan and Justin the need is great and the impact that the service dogs have on the veterans is huge with some veterans who were not leaving their homes now getting out and socializing and dealing with their issues.

July 9, 2023

Issues: Child Welfare, Human Trafficking, Child Abuse, Economic Issues and Education.

Guest: Kathleen LaValle the President and CEO of Dallas CASA.

Topic: The movie Sound of Freedom is taking the box office by storm. The movie revolves around the issue of child sex trafficking and although the movie is focused on what is happening in foreign countries the North Texas nonprofit Dallas CASA deals with children who have been trafficked here in North Texas. Kathleen joined me talk about the reality of child sex trafficking and human trafficking and what people should know about the issue and how to protect children from this horrible crime. We talked about the work that CASA does and how it helps children by advocating for those who have been abused, abandoned, neglected and how the community can help them with their mission. Coming up on Friday July 14th CASA is kicking off their annual Parade of Playhouses at NorthPark Center which benefits Dallas CASA. We talked about how people can volunteer as Court Appointed Special Advocates and the impact that these volunteers have on the lives of children. We also talked about the outreach they do in the community with education programs in schools and for businesses to hopefully prevent child abuse and neglect .

July 16, 2023

Issues: Health Issues, Education and Economic Issues

Guest: Mark Denizen the Executive Director of the Alzheimer’s Association Dallas and Northeast Texas

Topic: Last week the Food and Drug Administration fully approved the Alzheimer’s drug Lequemi which marks the first time that a drug meant to slow the progression of the disease has been granted full regulatory approval. Mark Denizen who heads up the Alzheimer’s Association Dallas and Northeast Texas joined me to talk about the breakthrough and how it will impact those who have been diagnosed with Alzheimer’s. Mark talked about the research that the Alzheimer’s Association is funding and how it was instrumental in creating Lequemi and how this is just the first step in hopefully finding not just better treatments but

hopefully one day a cure. Mark talked about the increase in the number of cases of Alzheimer's across the country and how the Alzheimer's Association is helping those diagnosed and their families. We talked about their services and programs and we promoted the upcoming Walks to End Alzheimer's which will be held September 30th thru November 4th across North Texas.

Guest: Lindsay Garner the Executive Director of Communities in Schools of Greater Tarrant County

Topic: With school set to start for most North Texans in the next couple of weeks the focus of the program today is on education issues. Lindsay Garner the Executive Director of Communities in Schools of Greater Tarrant County joined me to talk about the work that they do to help students pre-K to 12th grade. They do whatever it takes to keep their students in schools and on the path to graduation and have an excellent success rate. Lindsay talked about the programs they offer from case management to home assessments and we talked about the barriers that the students face including economic issues that are happening at home. We also discussed the mental health services that they offer the students which is a new program aimed at helping those students who are struggling with their mental health following the pandemic.

Guests: Mike Richman the Vice President of Marketing and Patron Services at Broadway Dallas and Kelly Flowers the Founder and CEO of Women Leading Technology.

Topic: With school set to start in a couple of weeks I wanted to highlight Arts in Education and STEM Education, which is Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. Mike Richman with Broadway Dallas joined me for the first part of the program to talk about the community outreach that Broadway Dallas does to introduce theater to students in low socio-economic zip codes and the education programs that they offer to school districts. We talked about the link between arts education and improved scores in school and we also promoted the upcoming Broadway Dallas season. Broadway Dallas is a nonprofit and many people do not realize the work that they do in the community. Kelly Flowers joined me for the second half of the program to talk about her nonprofit Women Leading Technology and the work that they do to bridge the diversity, equity and inclusion gap in communities thru STEAM Education. Women Leading Technology is providing resources and opportunities for girls to pursue a career in STEAM Education

Guest: Kirsten James the Executive Director of Project Transformation

Topic: School is set to begin for the majority of North Texas Students this week and Kirsten James the Executive Director of Project Transformation joined me to talk about the work that they do to transform communities by engaging children, college aged young adults and churches in meaningful ways to improve school attendance and student outcomes. Kirsten talked about their services and programs and the impact they see in the students that they work with and how the college aged kids who work with the children benefit from the work and the community engagement that it encourages.

Issues: Animal Rights and Protection of Animals and Economy

Guest: Maura Davies the Vice President of Marketing and Communications for the SPCA of Texas.

Topic: Coming up on September 9th I Heart Media Dallas is hosting the Love Pup Fest to highlight pet adoptions and Maura Davies from the SPCA joined me to talk about the need for more people to adopt animals to decrease the pet population in area animal shelters. Maura talked about the work that the SPCA of Texas does from adoptions to animal cruelty prevention and how they work tirelessly to get dogs and cats spayed and neutered to make sure that there are fewer unwanted animals roaming the street. We talked about what an incredible resource the website is for all things animals and how new owners can get tips on raising a puppy or a new pet that was just adopted. We also discussed the program that they have to help people who are struggling financially due to the economy to make sure that they can keep their pet. From paying for expensive surgeries to fostering an animal while an owner is in the hospital or deployed in the military.

Topic: It has been two weeks since the deadly wildfires in Hawaii and as the people of Hawaii grieve they are also trying to clean up in the aftermath and rebuild. The North Texas nonprofit Texas Baptist Men is a group of volunteers that always rushes in to help wherever a disaster happens. From hurricanes to tornadoes to wildfires and even war. Rand Jenkins with Texas Baptist Men joined me to talk about the work that they are doing in Hawaii to help families clean up and rebuild and he talked about the history of the nonprofit and how they are always looking for volunteers. We talked about the training that the volunteers go thru and how they go to wherever they are needed nationally, internationally, and locally. We talked about how just this week they helped a church in Richardson that had flooded. We talked about the impact their work has and the feedback they get from the communities they serve.

Guest: Hayley Nenadal the Director of Earth X Film Festival

Topic: With wildfires in Texas forcing the evacuation of people in East Texas and Central Texas and fire fighters watching fires in North Texas the importance of educating the public about the dangers of wildfires is important and educating the public about climate change and how it is impacting our lives. From extreme heat to severe weather our world is changing and one way to educate people is thru the art of film. Hayley Nenadal the Director of Earth X Film Festival joined me to talk about Earth X and the work that they do to educate and find solutions to our changing climate. Hayley is gearing up for two events including the Party for the Planet in Fort Worth on September 8th and the Earth X Film Festival in Dallas on October 20h. Hayley talked about the impact that film has and we talked about how the community can get involved.

Guest: Grainne Owen the Co-founder and Executive Director of Curing Kids Cancer.

Topic: The month of September is Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month and Grainne Owen joined me to talk about what we all should know about pediatric cancers Grainne and her husband Clay creating the nonprofit Curing Kids Cancer following the death of their 8-year-old son Killian who died of acute lymphocytic leukemia. Grainne talked about her family's journey with pediatric cancer and what she wants other families to know about signs and treatments. Curing Kid's Cancer funds groundbreaking research and recently gave Children's Health of North Texas a two-million-dollar endowment for research projects to help find better treatments for pediatric cancers.

September 10, 2023

Issues: Human Trafficking, Crime, Education and Economic Issues

Guests: Bianca Davis the Executive Director of New Friends New Life and John Ramsey with Returned.org

Topic: Every week it seems that there are news stories about law enforcement arresting people involved in a human trafficking ring here in North Texas. This is not a crime that is happening far away but right here in our own backyard. Bianca Davies the Executive Director of New Friends New Life a nonprofit that helps those who have been trafficked joined me to talk about the women and children they serve. We talked a bout the services and programs they offer, and she shared what she thinks more people need to know about this crime including how to spot a possible victim and how to help. We talked about what men can do to combat the crime of human trafficking and sex trafficking. We talked about the education outreach to schools and to parents and caregivers so that they can protect their kids. We also promoted the upcoming New Friends New Life luncheon that will feature Kerry Washington the star of the old tv show Scandal. John Ramsey joined me to talk about the work that Returned dot org is doing to combat child sex trafficking by getting DNA samples of children to hopefully reunite the children with their families. John talked about how Returned dot org came about and the impact that they are having in keeping children safe and out of the hands of traffickers.

Since it's inception it has raised more than 500 million dollars for thousands of our nonprofits. Monica Christopher joined me to talk about the importance of North Texas Giving Day and how people can get involved and helped. We talked about the charities that will benefit and the work they do in our community, and we also talked about Communities Foundation of Texas and how it works with people and businesses to find the best charities to work with. Kevin Hall with the Grant Halliburton Foundation joined me to talk about the impact that North Texas Giving Day has on a charity like the Grant Halliburton Foundation and the work that they do to help young people dealing with mental health issues. Kevin talked about the services and programs that they offer to young people who are struggling and to their parents and their education outreach to schools in North Texas to help students who may be dealing with mental health issues including their peer-to-peer program Hope Squad. We also promoted their upcoming conference When Life Hands You Teenagers.
