January 1, 2022 through March 31, 2022

January 2, 2022

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues and the impact of Covid 19 and the pandemic on our mental health.

Guest: Bonnie Cook the Executive Director of Mental Health America of Greater Dallas

Topic: It's a new year but we are still dealing with a surge in Covid cases as a new variant takes over and the ongoing pandemic is having a huge impact on our mental health. Bonnie Cook joined me to talk about how people can get mentally fit in the new year and how they can take care of themselves and their loved ones during times of stress whether due to the pandemic or due to economic stressors. the mental health of young people with an increase in the number of suicides among young people. Bonnie talked about the work that Mental Health America of Greater Dallas does to help those who are struggling with depression, anxiety, bi-polar disorder and other mental health issues. We talked about their programs for young people and young kids and about how their mental health screenings which are free to people in North Texas went from a couple of hundred a month to over 700 screenings a month. We also promoted their upcoming Adolescent Symposium which focuses on mental health issues facing teenagers and adolescents.

January 9, 2022

Issues Covered: Education and Mentoring and Economic Issues

Guest: Jenny Harper the Market President of Big Brothers Big Sisters Greater Dallas

Topic: The month of January is National Mentoring Month, a time set aside to raise awareness about the importance of mentoring and the impact that it has on the lives of young people. Jenny Harper from Big Brothers Big Sisters Greater Dallas joined me to talk about mentoring in the age of Covid 19 and how they have actually increased the number of mentors because it is easier for people to take part in some of their virtual programs. We talked about who can become a big and how the organization finds the littles and how they connect them with their mentor. Jenny talked about the time commitment that they expect from those who volunteer to be Bigs and the impact that the Bigs have on the lives of young people. Jenny shared Bigs in Blue which pairs a little with someone in law enforcement and Operation Bigs which helps children who have a parent in the military and also their program that helps those who have an incarcerated parent. They even have a program that partners people in retirement, assisted living and senior groups with young people and how it helps all of those involved.

January 16, 2022

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Human Trafficking and Economic Issues

Guest: Carla Shellis the Founder of Bochy's Place a safe haven for victims of human trafficking

Topic: The month of January is National Human Trafficking Prevention Month a time to raise awareness about the issue of human trafficking and to educate the public about the reality of this crime and how prevalent it is here in North Texas. Carla Shellis joined me to talk about her nonprofit Bochy's Place and the work that they do to help teens and women who are being trafficked find safety and to help them rebuild their lives. Carla talked about what we should be on the lookout for in our neighborhoods, in our grocery stores, at the mall and on planes for signs that someone is being trafficked whether it is a woman or a young man. We also talked about what makes someone vulnerable to traffickers and the threat that the internet poses. We also talked about the economic issues that make someone vulnerable and that also keeps someone in the life as a victim of sexual exploitation.

January 23, 2022

Issues Covered: Education and Economic Issues and the impact that Covid is having on our education system.

Guests: Maillil Acosta the Senior Managing Director of Corps Leadership and Development for Teach for America DFW and Jacob Carty with Spay Neuter Network.

Topic: The Coronavirus pandemic has had such a huge impact on the nation's economy and on our education system with many teachers leaving the profession and that has created a huge teacher shortage across the country including here in North Texas. Maillil Acosta with Teach for America DFW joined me on the program to talk about the work that they are doing to place teachers in some of the most underserved, low income schools to make sure that every child has the opportunity to learn. We talked about the educational equity gap and the impact that it has on a communities economy and we also talked about the results that Teach for America is seeing in the districts that they are serving. We also talked about the importance of their focus on social emotional learning to deal with the rise in anxiety and depression in young people as a result of the pandemic. Maillil also talked about the need for people to join Teach for America and how the community can help school districts. Jacob Carty joined me for the second part of the program to talk about the work that the Spay Neuter Network is doing in North Texas to curb the number of unwanted animals in our area and he talked about their low cost to no cost rabies vaccine services and their spay and neutering services and their mobile clinic that goes to underserved areas where cities have found the highest number of animal surrenders.

January 30, 2022

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Food Insecurity

Guests: Ann Marie Krautheim the CEO, President and Chief Wellness Officer of GenYouth and Anna Kurian with the North Texas Food Bank

Topic: My first guest on the program was Ann Marie Krautheim with GenYouth which is America's largest in school health and wellness program. Gen Youth gearing up for the Taste of the NFL ahead of the Super Bowl which will feature celebrity chefs cooking up their favorite dishes for football watching parties. The event will raise money for Gen Youth and their end student hunger fund. Ann Marie joined me to talk about the work that GenYouth does in school districts around the country and how they are tackling food insecurity in children and how they also highlight the need for students to be physically active with their Fuel Up to Play 60 programs. We also talked about their programs to inspire children and how they are working on mental health programs for children. Anna Kurian with the North Texas Food Bank joined me for the second half of the program to talk about the ongoing need here in North Texas due to rising food prices and rising gas prices. We talked about how the economic situation is forcing more and more people to reach out to food pantries and how the community can help the food bank during this time with donations and with volunteer hours. Anna also talked about the programs that the North Texas Food Bank has to help the elderly, veterans, and children.

February 6, 2022

Issues Covered: Domestic Violence and Economic Issues

Guest: Jan Langbein the CEO of Genesis Women's Shelter

Topic: It has been a week since a New York police officer was gunned down while answering a domestic violence call and his death once again highlights the danger that law enforcement officers encounter every day when answering a domestic violence call. Jan Langbein joined me to talk about the issue domestic violence and what we all need to know about this crime and how women and men who are victims should know that there is help available for them. We talked about signs that we can be on the look out for, what to do if you suspect that someone is being abused and how to steer them towards agencies like Genesis that can help them. Jan talked about the services and programs that they offer for victims of domestic violence and their children and she talked about ways the community can help.

February 13, 2022

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues covered: Mental Health Issues, Education and Economic Issues

Guests: Amy Halliburton and TJ Griffin with the Grant Halliburton Foundation

Topic: It is Super Bowl Sunday and Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott may not have made it to the big game but he was up for the Walter Payton award for his work in raising awareness about mental health issues and suicide prevention in memory of his brother who died by suicide. Today we are going to highlight the issue of mental health among young people and Amy Halliburton and TJ Griffin with the Grant Halliburton foundation join me to talk about the work that they are doing to help young people and their families who are facing anxiety, depression and other mental health issues. Amy talked about their Bounce Back

program and the Mental Health Navigation line which lets people find resources. TJ promoted the upcoming Beacon of Hope luncheon which will benefit the foundation and will feature keynote speaker Zak Williams the son of the late Robin Williams who died by suicide. We also talked about their community engagement efforts in schools and with community groups that work with young people in teaching kids about bullying prevention and resilience.

February 20, 2022

Issues Covered: Mental Health and Music Therapy and Education

Guests: Jim Newton the founder of Kidlinks and Sara Chigani a board certified music therapist

Topic: Jim Newton with Kidlinks and Sara Chigani a board certified music therapist joined me to talk about the work that Kidlinks does to help children who are hospitalized or who are traumatized thru music therapy. Jim talked about their therapeutic music entertainment program and the age group that they work with and the impact that they are making. He also talked about how families can go online for free music therapy programs. Sara talked about the changes she sees when she is working with a child dealing with a health issue or with a trauma. Research has shown that music therapy can help manage pain and discomfort, reduce anxiety and stress and can help with socialization and self-expression as well as help with speech and language and motor skills. We also talked about the upcoming benefit The Symphony of Chefs which will raise funds for Kidlinks and that will be held on February 28th.

February 27, 2022

Issues Covered: Discrimination and Bigotry and Hate Crimes

Guests: Rob Crane the co-founder of Together We Dine and Together We Can who is the moderator of the Dallas Bar Association's upcoming panel discussion Restoring Hope and Moving Forward in Reconciliation and Kirsten James the Executive Director of Project Transformation.

Topic: Last month all eyes were on a synagogue in Colleyville after a terrorist stormed in during services and held the rabbi of the synagoe and several congregants hostage because of their Jewish faith. In the aftermath of the attack the Dallas Bar Association along with Faith Forward Dallas decided to do a public forum to talk about hate in our community and how to come together and bring all faiths together in hope and reconciliation. Rob Crane talked about the public forum and how people could participate and also the programs designed to help people understand people of other faiths and not come from a place of fear. We talked combatting anti-semitism and racial discrimination. My next guest was Kirsten James the Executive Director of Project Transformation a nonprofit that works in underserved communities to mentor kids and to help with homework and literacy. Kirsten talked about their literacy programs at churches in underserved communities and about their summer camps that focus on literacy and the importance of improving literacy rates in children K-5th grade.

March 6, 2022

Issues Covered: Economic Issues, Education and Women's Rights

Guest: Miki Woodward the President and CEO of Texas Women's Foundation

Topic: March 8th is International Women's Day, a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. Miki Woodward joined me to talk about how the Texas Women's Foundation works towards advancing economic security and leadership opportunities for women and girls in North Texas and we talked about the impact that Covid 19 has had on women in the workforce with more and more women leaving the workforce to take care of kids who were not able to go to school because of the pandemic and no child care to care for the children while they worked. We talked about the economic hurdles women must deal with in the workforce due to the lack of equal pay for equal work and we talked about how helping women helps families since so many families in North Texas are headed up by single moms. We talked about the impact that inequality has on our economy as a whole and how the foundation helps girls follow their educational goals.

March 13, 2022

Issues Covered: STEM Education and Economic Issues and the Perot Museum of Nature and Science

Guest: Dr. Linda Silver the CEO of the Perot Museum of Nature and Science

Topic: Dr. Silver joined me to talk about everything that is going on at the Perot Museum ahead of Spring Break in North Texas. We talked about the impact that the pandemic has had on the museum and how finally things are opening back up. We talked about the exhibits currently at the Perot Museum that help kids with STEM Education from the Legos exhibit to the Let's Get Robotic program happening during Spring Break 2022. We also discussed the museums community outreach with their Tech Truck Fleet that goes to underserved zip codes to teach kids about Science, Technology and Math and to engage young students

to become interested in science. We also talked about the museum's efforts in helping North Texas educators thru their online programs that offer up curriculum to school districts.

March 20, 2022

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues: Emergency Preparedness, Economic Issues and Blood Supply

Guest: Dan Halyburton with the American Red Cross North Texas

Topic: The Spring Storm season kicked off earlier than usual with tornadoes ripping across the area this past week leaving a path of destruction and highlighting once again the need for people to have a safety plan. Dan Halyburton with the American Red Cross North Texas joined me to talk about how the Red Cross helped during the storms that swept across our area and we talked about how to be Red Cross ready for spring storms such as tornadoes, hail and high wind. We talked about the Red Cross Emergency App that has all the information you need and provides instant access to weather alerts. We also talked about the impact that the pandemic has had on our area's blood supply which is dangerously low right now and how people can help by donating blood at any Red Cross Blood Center. Dan also shared other programs that the Red Cross offers to help people in North Texas and how those programs have been impacted by the covid 19 pandemic from training and certification classes to swim classes. We also talked about their April Home Fires Sound the Alarm Campaign aimed at getting people to install smoke detectors for fire safety.

March 27, 2022

Issues Covered: Combatting Discrimination and Bigotry

Guest: Cheryl Drazin the Vice President of the Anti Defamation League's Central Division

Topic: More and more we are seeing instances of hate crimes across our country with the FBI reporting that hate crimes are at their highest level in 12 years and hate crimes against Asians is up by 339 percent. Cheryl Drazin with the ADL joined me to talk about the work that the ADL does to fight against discrimination and how they are combatting online hate and discrimination and the advocacy they are doing at the local and national level to make sure that laws protect people. We also talked about the upcoming Walk Against Hate in Dallas at the American Airlines Center in Dallas on April 3rd and how people can get involved and raise their voices against bigotry and bullying. We talked about the ADL's education programs for schools called No Place for Hate and the curriculum available online for educators and we talked about how the ADL is the global leader in exposing extremism and the efforts that they have to help people around the world who are facing discrimination including the people of Ukraine who are currently at war with Russia.
