October 1, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Health Issue Guest: Leanne Young the Executive Director of the Brain Performance Institute at UT Southwestern Medical Center.

Topic: The brand new Brain Performance Institute which is part of UT Southwestern Medical Center is opening up on October 19th and will focus on research in to brain health issues, including Alzheimer's, Parkinson's and Traumatic Brain injuries. Leanne talked about not only the research that is taking place in North Texas but also the therapy that takes place to help people with brain issues or brain trauma. The institute also focuses on giving people the strategies and tools so that they can maintain their brain. The institute gives brain physicals to assess where people are when it comes to their brain health and they also offer cognitive training to help people improve their brain health. The institute also helps people with developmental delays such as autism and Asperger's and they offer mindfulness training to help people destress since stress has been shown to affect brain health.

October 8, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education and Learning Differences

Guests: Suzanne Stell the Executive Director of the Shelton School and Kat Freudenthal a student from Shelton who has dyslexia and Kristi Wiley the Director of Development for Aids Outreach Center in Fort Worth.

Topic: October is Learning Differences Awareness Month and Suzanne joined me to talk about how Shelton leads the way nationally in helping students with learning differences from dyslexia to ADHD. She talked about the research that goes on at the lab at the school to find new ways of teaching students with learning differences and Kat Freudenthal talked about dealing with dyslexia, when she was diagnosed and how it has impacted her life. Suzanne talked about community outreach programs that Shelton has to help parents teach their kids if they don't go to Shelton. Kristi Wiley joined me for the second segment of the program to talk about the work that Aids Outreach does in Tarrant County to help those impacted by Aids and HIV and we promoted the upcoming Hope Walk which will take place in Forth Worth on October 22nd.

October 15, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Abuse Prevention and Health Issues.

Guests: Lynn McClean with the Collin County Children's Advocacy Center and Julie Fleshman and Dr. Muhammad Shaalan Beg with the Pancreatic Cancer Network.

Topic: This week North Texans have been horrified to hear of the case of a 4 year old Sharyn Matthews. The little Richardson girl who has been missing after her father forced her out of their home when she refused to reportedly drink her milk. The case has once again highlighted the issue of child abuse and Lynn McClean joined me to talk about what we all need to know about child abuse prevention and how as a community we can help stop it and protect kids. Lynn talked about the many programs that the Collin County Children's Advocacy Center has in place to help victims of abuse and how they work with child protective services and with law enforcement in the best interests of the child. We also promoted the upcoming Teddy Bear Ride that will benefit the advocacy center. The Teddy Bear ride raises awareness and funds for the center and will be held on Sunday, October 29th in Frisco. Julie Fleshman and Dr. Beg joined me for the second segment of the program to promote the Purple Stride Walk that will take place on November 11th at Klyde Warren Park in Dallas. Pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliests forms of cancer and Julie and Dr. Beg talked about what people should know about signs and symptoms and how research is coming along.

October 22, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime Prevention, Economic Issues, and Domestic Violence Awareness

Guest: Paige Flink the Executive Director of the Family Place.

Topic: October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Paige joined me to talk about what we should all know about family violence the signs and impact that this problem has on families and on our community. Paige talked about the work that the Family Place does to raise awareness about the issue of domestic violence but also to help the victims and their families. We talked about safety planning, on the abuse hotline and ways to help those who are being abused. We also talked about the Partners Card campaign which will raise funds for the Family Place's services and programs including their transitional living and emergency shelters. Last month the city of Plano was rocked by the mass murder of nine people who were gathered at the home of 27 year old Meredith Hight who is in the process of getting a divorce from her abuser and he showed up and gunned everyone down. More and more experts on the issue of domestic violence say there is a link between abusers and mass murder and so it is important to focus on keeping guns out the hands of those arrested or charged with domestic violence and how vigilant we all need to be. It will take the entire community to put an end to domestic violence.

October 29, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Education

A special I Heart Media program dealing with learning differences.

November 5, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Veterans Issues and Military Support and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues Guests: Tudi Giordano the President of Honor Flight DFW and Terry Kasen the VP of Honor Flight

Topic: It is the Sunday before Veteran's Day and so we highlighted programs in North Texas that help our veterans. Tudi and Terry joined me to talk about Honor Flight DFW which takes veterans from World War 2, the Korean War and the Viet Nam War to Washington DC free of charge so that the veterans can be honored for their service and see the war memorials that were built in their honor in our nation's capital. We talked about how the veterans are chosen and how much it means to them to be able to go to DC. We also talked about how the community can help Honor Flight with their mission. Steve Smith the Executive Director of FARM, Farmers Assisting Returning Military, joined me for the second segment of the program. FARM was started by Steve, who is an army veteran, and a fellow veteran who were looking for ways to help returning vets who were dealing with PTSD and having trouble adjusting to civilian life. Steve talked about the programs available to veterans through FARM for mental health but also to help put together a business plan if the veteran decides he wants to become a farmer and also how the community can help FARM.

November 12, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues, Economic Issues and Community Involvement.

Guests: Angela Bynum the Community Engagement Director for the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas and Lyndsay Hightower who has arthritis and Chaz Parker the CEO of Christian Community Action.

Topic: The holidays are rapidly approaching which means its time once again for the annual Jingle Bell Run Walk benefiting the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas. Angela Bynum and Lyndsay Hightower joined me to promote the Jingle Bell Run/Walk but they also talked about what we all need to know about arthritis, the number one cause of disability in the US. We talked about the different types of arthritis, the symptoms, the medications and both Angela and Lyndsay talked about living with arthritis and the importance of research. The Jingle Bell Run Walk is set to take place in Fort Worth on December 2nd, Chaz Parker the CEO of Christian Community Action joined me to talk about the work that they do to help those in need in our community through their many programs including housing, mentorship, job training, emergency crisis management, and the thrift store that raises funds for those programs. We talked about how the community can help during the holidays.

November 19, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Economy, Education and Health and Economic Issues.

Guest: Jill Comnock the CEO of the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas.

Topic: Jill Cumnock with the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas joined me to talk about the Trains at North Park which benefits the Ronald McDonald House. Jill talked about the work that the Ronald McDonald House does as a home away from home for families who have a child being treated at one of our many children's hospitals and how the house is able to economically help those families who are already spending so much money on their child's healthcare. We also talked about the scholarship program they have set up for children who have spent time at the Ronald McDonald House and their siblings so that they can go to college and we talked about the many volunteer opportunities and the ways that the community can help.

November 26, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Animal Rights and Education.

Guests: Anna Kurian with the North Texas Food Bank and Mark Verma with Paws in the City.

Topic: The holidays are a time when we all try to give back to the community and one way to give back is to help out the North Texas Food Bank with can food drives or online donations. Anna Kurian talked about the work that the North Texas Food Bank does to help feed the hungry in our area and the vast number of services and programs aimed at helping the most vulnerable from children to senior citizens. For the second segment of the program Mark Verma with Paws in the City joined me to talk about the importance to adopt not shop when looking for pets for loved ones during the holidays. Mark talked about the need for foster parents for dogs who are looking for forever homes and we also talked about end of year giving and how that can help Paws in the City and their mission of finding a home for animals who are in shelters.

Guests: Major John Rich the Commander with the Salvation Army DFW and Pat Patey the Communications Director with the Salvation Army DFW.

Topic: Major Rich and Pat Patey with the Salvation Army DFW joined me to talk about the issue of helping the needy this holiday season and why the programs offered by the Salvation Army are important and how they help people get back on their feet. With the holidays right around the corner the Salvation Army has kicked off their biggest fundraisers of the year including the Red Kettle campaign which asks people to donate their change to help the needy and the Angel Tree program which provides holiday gifts for needy kids. Major Rich and Pat Patey talked about the many programs offered by the Salvation Army throughout the year not just during the holidays and we also talked about donor fatigue in the wake of Hurricane Harvey relief efforts and the other disasters and how this has impacted the donations for so many charities here in North Texas and how many angels on the Angel Tree are still looking for someone to adopt them.

Guests: Keri Marie Sutherland the Development Director with Habitat and Nancy Rodriguez with Family Service for Habitat and Kristin Logue who is working on her home thanks to Habitat.

Topic: Keri Marie, Nancy and Kristin joined me to talk about Habitat for Humanity the nonprofit that helps low income families get into homes by giving them a hand up not a hand out. Keri Marie and Nancy explained how Habitat for Humanity works and how families must have good credit and show responsibility by putting in classroom hours to learn how to be a homeowner and by putting in sweat equity. We talked about the impact that Habitat has on the local economy, on neighborhoods and Kristin shared her own experience of getting into a Habitat Home and how the experience has helped her be a more responsible citizen to the community.

December 17, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy and Education and Child Safety.

Guest: Karen Hughes the President and CEO of Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps homeless children in our area.

Topic: Karen Hughes joined me to talk about the upcoming Day 1 Dallas a benefit event that will be held January 1st at Fair Park in Dallas that will raise funds for Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps the youngest victims of poverty in North Texas, homeless children. Karen talked about all the fun activities that will take place at Day 1 Dallas but also the importance of an event like this to raise awareness about the issue of homeless children since so many people think the homeless are alcoholics or drug addicts and don't think of the youngest victims and their families. Karen talked about the programs that Vogel has in place to help kids from infant to 15 and their families as well so that the parents can get on their feet and break the cycle of poverty.

Marcos and Julie talked about waiting for the transplant, what it was like before the transplant and how Marcos is doing now thanks to the gift that one family made.

Issues Covered: Community Involvement and Disaster Preparedness and Veterans Issues.

Guests: Tammy Richards the President of Volunteer Now and Anita Foster and Dennis Clancey with Team Rubicon. Topic: It's the end of the year and as we reflect on everything that happened in 2017 it is hard to imagine not focusing on all those people who volunteered to step up following Hurricane Harvey, Maria and Irma. So today we focused on volunteering. Tammy Richards joined me to talk about Volunteer Now a nonprofit that connects people with volunteer opportunities here in North Texas and the need for volunteers and the impact that volunteer hours have on our community. We talked about all the different ways that people can give back for an hour, a day, or as an ongoing volunteer.
