Issues Covered: Animal Rights and Protection and Education

Guest: Jacob Carty the Communications Manager for the Spay Neuter Network of North Texas.

Topic: January kicks off Happy Neuter Year for the Spay Neuter Network of North Texas and Jacob Carty joined me to talk about how pet owners need to know the facts about spaying and neutering their pets and how it can not only help decrease the number of unwanted animals but it also helps the health of the pet. Jacob talked about the education programs that the Spay Neuter Network offers to the community and about their no cost and cost spay neuter services for low income families. We talked about their mobile unit that targets zip codes in North Texas that have the most unwanted pets surrendered to the SPCA and the Humane Society. The need for rabies vaccines and microchips in pets and since a lot of people received pets for Christmas we spoke of the importance of doing your homework when it comes to pet ownership so that you are a responsible pet owner and we also talked about cracking down on puppy mills, dealing with feral cat populations in North Texas and the importance of adopt

Issues Covered: Financial Literacy and the Economy and Education Guest: Todd Mark Executive Director of Friends of Consumer Freedom

Topic: Todd Mark joined me to talk about financial goals in the New Year since so many people use the new year to get fiscally fit. We talked about the work that the nonprofit Friends of Consumer Freedom does in North Texas to help people who are struggling to get out of debt and how they help people get on the right track. We talked about their education programs within the community and online that help people with homebuying goals, education goals and with investment goals. We also talked about the importance of reaching out to a nonprofit rather than money lenders or scams that offer to help you get out of debt but instead you ended up paying more money. We discussed ways to improve credit scores and establishing a budget and emergency funds

January 20, 2019 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Community Involvement, Education, the Economy, Housing and Mentoring.

Guests: Bill Chinn the Market President of Big Brothers Big Sisters North Texas and Jenny Harper the Director of Programs for Big Brothers Big Sisters and Reverend Bob Sweeney the Executive Director of Dallas Life.

Topic: The month of January is National Mentoring Month and so I invited Bill and Jenny with Big Brothers Big Sisters an organization that specializing in mentoring to be on the program to talk about the importance of mentoring and how the community can help mentor a child in need. Bill and Jenny talked about the need for Big Brothers and Big Sisters and how much of an impact people can make when they become a Big. We talked about how the organization pairs up the mentors with their mentees and the activities that people can do when they become a Big. We talked about Operation Bigs which is bigs for children of military families and we talked about the school programs where the bigs get together with their little only on school grounds and we also talked about Bigs in Blue a program that gets police involved since so many kids only interaction with police is when a member of their family is in trouble with the law. The Reverend Bob Sweeney joined me for the second segment of the program to talk about the Souper Bowl of Caring a yearly food drive aimed at raising awareness about those who are food insecure in our area ahead of the Super Bowl which is a day when American consume the most amount of food second only to Thanksgiving. Reverend Bob Sweeney joined me to talk about the work that Dallas Life does in our area to help the homeless who have lost everything either due to addiction, unemployment, health issues or divorce. Reverend Sweeney talked about the services and programs that they have in place to help the homeless get medical help and economic help as well as educational help so that they can join the workforce and become self-sufficient. We also promoted the food drive through the Souper Bowl of Caring that will benefit Dallas Life that is running now thru Super Bowl Sunday and how people can get involved.

January 27, 2019 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Sex Trafficking and Abuse and Intolerance and Crime.

Guests: Kim Robinson the CEO of New Friends New Life and Mary Pat Higgins the Executive Director of the Dallas Holocaust Museum.

Topic: The month of January is Slavery and Human Trafficking Awareness Month and since most people think this crime only happens in third world countries and not here in the US I wanted to have Kim Robinson the CEO of New Friends New Life, a nonprofit that helps the victims of human trafficking, come in to share the reality of this crime and how it is happening here in North Texas. We talked about the work that New Friends New Life does to help the victims of this crime and their services and programs and we talked about ways the community can help in the fight against human trafficking especially men, we discussed the youth education program that New Friends New Life has that goes into schools to help young people understand the dangers and we also highlighted ways that people can spot someone who may be the victim of human trafficking. For the second segment of the program I was joined by Mary Pat Higgins the Executive Director of the Dallas Holocaust Museum since today, January 27th, is International Holocaust Remembrance Day I wanted to have Mary Pat in to talk about the work that the Dallas Holocaust Museum does to educate the public and to honor the victims of the holocaust. The Museum also operates the Center for Education and Tolerance and Mary Pat shared the work that they do in the community and we talked about the exhibits that they currently have including The Story of Anne Frank Exhibit.

February 3. 2019 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education, Mentoring, Economy, Support for Veterans

Guests: Former Dallas Cowboy Chad Hennings and Lynn Berman the Excutive Director of Attitudes and Attire Topic: It is Super Bowl Sunday and as the NFL gets ready to crown their national champions former Dallas Cowboy Chad Hennings joined me to talk about the ways the NFL gives back to the communities that they play in. Chad is gearing up for the annual Cowboys and Cowboys Gala which benefits Sky Ranch a nonprofit that provides education programs, retreats and summer camp programs for youth in our area. The gala is one of the biggest fundraisers for Sky Ranch and Chad talked about the great work that the nonprofit does to help kids including their TRU Camp which is for children of incarcerated parents, also their leadership camps and outdoor education programs. The gala will raise funds for scholarships and will feature current and former Dallas Cowboys as well as cowboys from the rodeo circuit coming together for a great cause. For the second half of the program I was joined by Lyn Berman the Executive Director of Attitudes and Attire a nonprofit that helps women who are facing life challenges such as domestic violence, homelessness, addiction or divorce and who find themselves in need of mentoring and self-esteem classes. Attitudes and Attire helps these women with workshops on resumes and interviewing and dressing for success. We also promoted the upcoming Attitudes and Attire Fashion Show and Luncheon which will be held February 22nd in Dallas and which benefits the programs offered by the agency including their hopeful smiles program and their Boots to Heels program which helps female veterans.

February 10, 2019 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issue covered: Health Issues and Economic Issues

Guest: Jennifer Steyers a counselor and relationship expert here in North Texas.

Topic: It's the Sunday before Valentine's Day and so today we are talking about relationships and how to not only find one but how to maintain a good relationship with your partner. Jennifer Steyers has been voted by Match dot com as the top matchmaker and relationship expert in DFW for over five years and as a relationship counselor and coach she joined me to talk about ways to keep the love alive and how to heal wounds in a relationship so that the couple can become stronger. We talked about communication tips, when couples should seek outside help, anger issues, jealousy issues and expectations and managing them so that you can create a true partnership.

February 17, 2019 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education, Reading and Writing, Economic Issues and health issues.

Guests: Gwen Cox the Director of Explore Horizons in Garland and Murray Richter a local author who will be the judge for an upcoming writing competition, Michelle Squires with Get Your Rear in Gear and Dr. Vihn Trang with Texas Oncology. Topic: Coming up on March 2nd it's National Read Across America Day and for those who have difficulty reading Explore Horizons tutoring centers offers help for families and they also offer free seminars in schools to encourage the love of learning and coming up they will have their free young writers awards competition which is open to all children ages four to fourteen with free writing classes offered at their locations for children to get involved. Gwen Cox talked about the competition along with author Murray Richter and we discussed the importance of getting kids to read and write and how Explore Horizons instills a love for both thru their workshops and how often times kids who thought they would never be good at writing end up finding their passion. Murray talked about how he first became a writer and what he tells would be writers on how to create their own path as story tellers. For the second segment of the program I was joined by Michelle Squires and Dr. Vihn Trang to talk about the upcoming Get Your Rear in Gear 5K that will benefit the Colon Cancer Coalition. We talked about March being Colon Cancer Awareness Month and Michelle shared her own story of losing her grandmother to colon cancer and almost losing her mom and why it is important to know what to be on the look out for. Dr. Trang talked about the rise in colon cancer in young people and we talked about research as well and the work that the Colon Cancer Coalition does to help those diagnosed with the disease and also their research projects.

We talked about their numerous programs to help families as well as the individuals with delays, the desperate need for services, who can receive help, residential services and community services we also talked about the programs that Lifepath Systems has in place to help those with substance abuse issues and mental health challenges.

I recently went to speak at a career fair and was surprised at the number of students who were thinking of joining the military after high school and so I asked the sergeants to join me to talk about their work as recruitment officers, what they want students to know, what they want parents to know, the qualifications they are looking for and I asked the sergeants to share their own story of how they got in to the marine corps.

March 17, 2019 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Education, Economy, Community Involvement, Emergency Preparedness.

Guest: Jenny Hanson with the American Red Cross North Texas

Topic: March is Red Cross Month a time to raise awareness about all that the Red Cross does in our community and our country and since the spring storm season is quickly approaching I asked Jenny Hanson to join me to talk about how North Texans can be Red Cross Ready ahead of spring storms that have already impacted several communities in North Texas due to hail storms this past week. Jenny talked about making sure you have a kit in your home and a plan in case of a tornado or severe weather, we talked about mistakes that people make during storms and what to do if the worst should happen. We talked about all the other programs that the Red Cross has including their blood services which supplies blood to local hospitals and relies on local blood donors to help, we talked about the upcoming Sound the Alarm Campaign at the end of April that will install free fire alarms in homes since the Red Cross helps so many families who have been impacted by an apartment or home fire, we talked about their first aid classes and swim classes and we talked about the need for volunteers.

Issues Covered: Health Issues and Child Safety Issues.

Guests: Dr. Alisa Rich the Chief Executive Officer of Wipe Out Kids Cancer and Dalton Stewart with Jersey Mikes.

Topic: Coming up on Wednesday, March 27th it's Jersey Mike's Day of Giving with 100 percent of sales going to Wipe Out Kids

Cancer so today I was joined by Dr. Rich the CEO of Wipe Out Kids Cancer and by Dalton Stewart with Jersey Mikes North Texas. We talked about the programs that Wipe Out Kids Cancer has in place for families impacted by pediatric cancers and the research that is funded by money raised by Wipe Out Kids Cancer. Dr. Rich talked about what every family should know about pediatric cancer and the importance of the research and Dalton talked about why he believes in the charity and why he dedicates his Day of giving to this charity. It is estimated that every day 43 American families hear the words "Your child has cancer" and Wipe Out Kids Cancer envisions a day when no child dies as a result of a cancer diagnosis.

March 31, 2019 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues and Child Safety Issues.

Guests: Robert Hinkle with the March of Dimes Fort Worth and Megan Gonzalez the Dallas March for Babies Ambassador Mother.

Topic: The March of Dimes March for Babies will be held Saturday, April ^{13th} in Fort Worth and on Saturday, May 4th in Dallas and Robert Hinkle and Megan Gonzalez joined me to talk about the upcoming walks and the importance of raising funds for the March of Dimes. The March of Dimes mission is to make sure that all babies are born healthy and funds research into premature births and also supports those families who have a preemie. Megan shared her own personal journey of delivering a premature baby boy at 23 weeks and talked about the health struggles her son Gustavo faced but how thanks to the research done by the March of Dimes her son was able to survive due to new and advanced treatment. We promoted the walk in Fort Worth and Dallas and talked about how the community can help and why the work that the March of Dimes does is so important. For the second segment of the program I was joined by Jacquelin Leach the Executive Director of the Crohns and Colitis Foundation of North Texas and Madelyn Medina who suffers from ulcerative colitis. Jacqueline and Madelyn joined me to promote the upcoming Take Steps Walk that will benefit the Crohns and Colitis Foundation and their services and programs for people like Madelyn who are struggling with IBD. Jacqueline talked about the work that CCFA does and research and Madelyn shared her story of discovering at the age of 18 that she had ulcerative colitis and how that has impacted her life and why she is working so hard with CCFA to find better medical options and medications and to ultimately find a cure.
