January 7, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Financial Literacy and Caregiving Guests: Gregg Murset a financial expert featured on network financial shows and Carolyn Roney a volunteer with AARP's Caregiving support unit.

Topic: January is Financial Wellness Month and as people head in to the new year many decide to not only get physically fit but also fiscally fit so Greg Murset joined me to talk about ways of getting out of debt and setting financial goals. It is estimated that the majority of people do not have savings or an emergency plan and Greg talked about the importance of setting aside money in case of a life crisis. He gave tips on budget planning and also how to encourage your kids to become money wise. Carolyn Roney

joined me in the second half of the show to talk about caregiving. As the population gets older many people are having to make important decisions about grandparents or parents and Carolyn talked about the support that AARP, The American Association of Retired People, can give to those who find themselves as caregivers. We talked about setting up powers of attorney, talking to elderly loved ones about their long term care wishes and also respite for caregivers. Carolyn shared her own story of caring for her parents and how AARP's program called Prepare to Care helped her navigate the system.

January 14, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Child Abuse Prevention and Volunteering Guest: Kathleen LaValle the Executive Director of Dallas CASA Topic: Martin Luther King Jr. Day is coming up tomorrow January 15<sup>th</sup> and since the King family has long requested that MLK Day be a day on rather than a day off I wanted to highlight an agency that depends solely on volunteers to protect the most vulnerable in our community, children. Kathleen La Valle is the executive director of Dallas CASA Court Appointed Special Advocates and she joined me to talk about the growing need of volunteers to help children navigate the system when it comes to court proceedings and the foster care system. Kathleen talked about the work that CASA does, what sorts of volunteers they are in need of and the training seminars that are offered every month to people in North Texas interested in becoming a CASA volunteer. We talked about the impact that CASA has and we also promoted the Annual Casino Party Gala that will raise funds

for the services and programs offered by CASA. The Gala will be held on Saturday, January 20<sup>th</sup> and we also promoted the upcoming Prom Dress Drive that will provide prom dresses and tuxes to those teenagers served by CASA who are in the foster care system.

January 21, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Animal Rights, Economy and Education Guest: Jacob Carty Communications Manager for Spay Neuter Network North Texas.

Topic: Jacob Carty joined me to talk about raising awareness about spaying and neutering pets. The Spay Neuter Network, a North Texas nonprofit, has once again kicked off a campaign titled "Happy Neuter Year" to encourage people to spay and neuter with low cost spay and neuter services throughout the month of January. Jacob talked about the services and programs offered by the Spay Neuter Network including their mobile unit that goes into North Texas zip codes that animal rights activists have determined are the areas where the most animal surrenders take place. We talked about educating the public about the impact that spaying and neutering has on the number of unwanted animals.

January 28, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Homelessness

Guest: Reverend Bob Sweeney the Executive Director of Dallas Life

Topic: It's once again time for the Souper Bowl of Caring a yearly food drive aimed at raising awareness about those who are food insecure in our area ahead of the Super Bowl which is a day when American consume the most amount of food second only to Thanksgiving. Reverend Bob Sweeney joined me to talk about the work that Dallas Life does in our area to help the homeless who have lost everything either due to addiction, unemployment, health issues or divorce. Reverend Sweeney talked about the services and programs that they have in place to help the homeless get medical help and economic help as well as educational help so that they can join the workforce and become self-sufficientWe also promoted the food drive through the Souper Bowl of Caring that will benefit Dallas Life that is running now thru Super Bowl Sunday and how people can get involved.

February 4, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Domestic Violence and Crime Prevention

#### Guest: Jan Langbein the Executive Director of Genesis Women's Shelter

Topic: It is Super Bowl Sunday and as the NFL gets ready to crown their national champions we tackled a subject that the NFL and others have been trying to highlight ahead of the big game and that is the issue of domestic violence. The NFL has been under scrutiny for a number of years for its handling of domestic violence cases involving NFL players and since every minute 20 people are victims of intimate partner violence and every day three women die from it we wanted to raise awareness as well as let those in our community who may be victims know that they are not alone. Jan Langbein talked about the work that Genesis Women's Shelter does in our area to help women, men and children and we talked about signs to be on the look out for, safety planning and tips for those who find themselves with a loved one who is a victim. We talked about education programs and prevention. We also discussed ways that the community can help Genesis and other domestic violence agencies who are helping those in our community dealing with violence.

February 11, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issue covered: Health Issues and Economic Issues

Guests: Melissa Cameron the Executive Director of the American Heart Association and Dr. Richard Ammar a cardiologist on staff at Texas Health Allen and Lyn Berman the Executive Director of Attitudes and Attire.

Topic: It's the Sunday before Valentine's Day and with heart decorations everywhere it is no wonder that the month of February is Hearth Health Awareness Month. Dr. Ammar and Melissa Cameron with the American Heart Association of North Texas joined me to talk about what we all need to know about heart health, how to take care of ourselves and what to be on the look out for when it comes to signs of a heart attack or stroke. We talked about the importance of diet and exercise and we talked about the research that is ongoing that the Heart Association helps fund to find better treatments and better medications. Heart disease remains the number one killer of men and women. For the second half of the program I was joined by Lyn Berman the Executive Director of Attitudes and Attire a nonprofit that helps women who are facing life challenges such as domestic violence, homelessness, addiction or divorce and who find themselves in need of mentoring and self-esteem classes. Attitudes and Attire helps these women with workshops on resumes and interviewing and dressing for success. We also promoted the upcoming Attitudes and Attire Fashion Show and Luncheon which will be held February 23<sup>rd</sup> in Dallas and which benefits the programs offered by the agency including their hopeful smiles program and their Boots to Heels program which helps female veterans.

February 18, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues

Guests: Kimberly Martinez the Executive Director of The Elisa Project and Vanita Halliburton the Founder and Executive Director of the Grant Halliburton Foundation.

Topic: In the wake of another horrific school shooting which claimed the lives of 17 students in Parkland, Florida we highlighted the issue of mental health and how families can deal with a loved one whether young or old battling demons. Vanita Halliburton joined me to talk about the work that the Grant Halliburton Foundation does to help youth who are dealing with mental health issues like depression, bi-polar disorder and schizophrenia. We talked about their school education programs that deal with social media pressures, bullying, dating violence in teens and we talked about their support groups for kids and parents alike. Kim Martinez joined me to talk about the work that The Elisa Project does to help those battling another type of mental health issue, eating disorders. February is Eating Disorders Awareness Month and Kim and I talked about what parents and kids should know, how to get help and the need for early intervention. We discussed the services offered by The Elisa Project and how the organization came about following the death of Elisa McCall a Dallas teenager who died as a result of anorexia and bulimia. We also promoted the upcoming luncheon that benefits The Elisa Project that will be held on February 28<sup>th</sup>.

February 25, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Education and Economic Issues Guest: Abby Williams the founder and Executive Director of United To Learn. Topic: This coming Friday, March 2<sup>nd</sup> on what would have been Dr. Seuss's birthday schools around the metroplex will celebrate Dr. Seuss Reading Day and United Way of Dallas is seeking volunteers to read to students from kindergarden to 5<sup>th</sup> grade and then on Saturday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> United To Learn is having a volunteer event at schools around Dallas aimed at fixing up learning spaces and playgrounds. Abby Williams joined me to talk about the importance of community leaders and citizens alike with or without kids to get involved in area schools to help create a better learning environment for kids especially in low income areas of our community. Abby talked about how United To Learn helps schools and students so that they have a better chance of graduating and going on to college. Abby shared the impact that the organization has had so far and how more schools in our area are asking for United To Learn volunteers to come and help them out.

March 4, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Education and Health Issues Guest: Belinda Southgate with Explore Horizon

Guest: Belinda Southgate with Explore Horizons, Tami.Lamb a local writer judging the upcoming Young Writers Competition, Brittney Reyes with Explore Horizons, Dr. Ruben Velz a Nephrologist and Amanda Crowley with the National Kidney Foundation of North Texas.

Topic: Explore Horizons has kicked off their annual Young Writers Competition which is free and open to students across the Metroplex and Belinda Southgate, Britnney Reyes and Tani Lamb joined me to talk about the importance of such a competition, how students and schools can get involved and we talked about the workshops that are being held to help students learn to write and discover the creative writer within. Dr. Velez and Amanda Crowley joined me to talk about kidney health. World Kidney Day is March 8<sup>th</sup> a time to raise awareness about kidney disease and let people know about kidney health and how to protect their kidneys.

We talked about the recent report released on Thursday, on the State of Women in North Texas which outlined the gap between women and men's pay in our area and rise in women needing welfare. Tom Landis the owner of Howdy Homemade Ice Cream in Dallas joined me to talk about his business model which hires people with special needs. March is also Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month and in an effort to raise awareness about all that people with special needs can do I wanted to highlight the economic plan that Tom has in place and how it impacts the families of those with a loved one with special needs.

March 18, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues: Education, Economy, Community Involvement. Guests: Marissa Leach the Development Director of Just Say Yes and Kara DuBois with Just Say Yes.

Topic: Marissa Leach and Kara Bray with Just Say Yes joined me to talk about their nonprofit that helps to equip teenagers with the skills they need to succeed. Just Say Yes provides classroom curriculums as well as a peer to peer mentor program to schools and teaches students how to deal with a range of issues from bullying prevention, dropout prevention, drug and alcohol abuse and media influences. Just Say Yes also has a number of speakers who will come to the schools to provide inspiration and motivation. Marissa and Kara also promoted the upcoming Tell Your STory Gala which will raise money for Just Say Yes' programs. This year's speaker will be Jenna Bush Hager the daughter of former President George W. Bush and a contributor to NBC's Today Show.

The March of Dimes mission is to make sure that all babies are born healthy and funds research into premature births and also supports those families who have a preemie. Joseph and Kelly shared their own personal journey of delivering premature twins one of which died in the NICU unit and they talked about their introduction to the work that the March of Dimes does because of their ordeal. Their surviving son is now 11 years old and they do all that they can to raise awareness about the March of Dimes. Mark Bott joined me to talk about two upcoming Child Safety events one in Carrollton on March 31<sup>st</sup> and the other in Frisco on April 7<sup>th</sup> that will focus on keeping children safe from danger. Mark Bott talked about Operation Safe Kid and the kits that will be available for free at the upcoming events. The kits include fingerprints a picture of your child and safety tips so that you can work with your child on safety scenarios. The upcoming events will feature law enforcement on site to educate parents but they will also have fun family activities during the Operation Safe Kid events.
