October 6, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health, Education and Economy

Guests: Dr. Joyce Mauk the President/CEO and Medical Director of the Child Study Center in Fort worth and Molly West whose 6 year old daughter Fern has autism and is a student at the Child Study Center.

Topic: Recently actress Daryl Hanna revealed to People magazine that she was diagnosed with autism as a child and that she still deals with debilitating shyness. Autism continues to be the fastest growing serious developmental disability in the US, with more children being diagnosed with autism this year than with diabetes, cancer and AIDs combined. Dr. Mauk joined me to talk about research into autism and ways that parents can help their kids if they are diagnosed as being on the autism spectrum. Dr. Mauk talked about the services and programs that are offered by the nonprofit school, The Child Study Center in Fort Worth, and their cutting edge approach to help those with autism or developmental disabilities. Molly West talked about her daughter Fern's diagnosis and the progress she has made thanks to the educational programs available to her through the Child Study Center. We also promoted the upcoming Puzzle Scuttle 5K run and walk which will benefit the Child Study Center and their programs and will raise awareness about the issue of autism. The event will be held at TCU in Fort Worth.

October 13, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime and Law Enforcement and Health

Guest: Bobbie Villareal the Executive Director of the Dallas Area Rape Crisis Center.

Topic: Bobbie Villareal joined me to talk about the services and programs offered by the Dallas Area Rape Crisis Center. Recently here in North Texas we have had several high profile stories about rape including the serial rapist in the Fair Park area and the student rapes at the University of Texas at Arlington. Bobbie talked about rape prevention and also about counseling services for victims of rape thru the Crisis Center. Every 2 minutes someone is raped in the US and many victims refuse to report the crime because they are afraid they will be re-victimized by the court system. Bobbie talked about dealing with law enforcement and the judicial system in rape cases.

October 20, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Healthcare, Economy, Education and Military Support

Guests: Dr. Robert Morrow the Senior Medical Director of Blue Cross Blue Shield of Texas and Mike Oswalt the President of the Mesquite Chapter of AMBUCS.

Topic: The Affordable Care Act's initial rollout began on October 1st and although there have been problems with the website people will still need to make sure they enroll by January. Dr. Morrow joined me to talk about the upcoming free "Be Covered Texas" Health Fair that will help people sign up for health insurance and help them navigate the system to see if they are eligible for federal subsidies. The health fair, which will be held on Saturday, October 26 at the Dallas Convention Center, will also offer free health screenings, cooking demonstrations for those with diabetes and heart health issues plus the fair will offer free groceries for the first 1,000 thru the door. Mike Oswalt joined me for the second half of the program to talk about AMBUCs, a non profit dedicated to creating independence for people with disabilities including our returning men and women in the military who were injured in Iraq or Afghanistan. Besides paying for Amtrykes for the disabled to help them get around at home and outside the home AMBUCS also helps students majoring in physical therapy by offering scholarships. Mike and I also promoted the upcoming Pancake Breakfast that will benefit AMBUCs which will be held in December.

October 27, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime and Law Enforcement, Child Welfare, Education and Economy.

Guests: Paige Flink the Executive Director of the Family Place and Christine Cook with Sleep Experts,

Dan Leal, Executive Director of the Child Advocacy Center of Denton County, Kevin Howell the Executive Director of Spokes 4 Hope a nonprofit aimed at helping abused kids, Alton Wells with the Southlake Police Department, Mike Norris with the Keller Police.

Topic: October was Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Paige Flink joined me to talk about the issue of domestic violence and what victims need to know and how the community can help stop domestic violence. Paige talked about the services and programs offered by the Family Place to help victims and their families and about the Family Place's educational outreach to schools in our area to help inform students about the dangers of teen dating violence and to let them know that help is available. We talked about the issue of bullying and Christine Cook joined us to talk about the Share the Warmth campaign which Sleep

Experts is kicking off at the beginning of November and which will run through Thanksgiving. During November the community is asked to donate blankets and comforters to the Family Place for their shelter and transitional housing facilities. People can drop off their donations at area Sleep Experts Stores. Dan Leal, Kevin Howell, Alton Wells and Mike Norris joined me to talk about the upcoming Southlakde DPS and Keller PD Motorcycle Rodeo on November 9th which will benefit Spokes 4 Hope. Spokes 4 Hope is a non profit that donates bikes and other gifts to kids who have been abused. Dan Leal talked about the work that the Children's Advocacy Center of Denton County does to help children who have been abused and the impact that the bicycles can make on the child. Alton Wells and Mike Norris talked about ways that law enforcement is trying to curb the tide of child abuse.

November 3, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy, Health and Education.

Guests: Jan Pruitt the President and CEO of the North Texas Food Bank and Mike Brynn the Director of the Diabetes Association of North Texas' Step Out DFW: The Walk to Stop Diabetes.

Topic: With Thanksgiving and Christmas right around the corner this is the time of year when so many people think about helping those in need by donating gifts or by conducting food drives. Jan Pruitt joined me to talk about the need for food donations to the North Texas Food Bank and the services and programs that the food bank offers including the after school snack program, the help for seniors, the back pack program to make sure that kids have food over the week end or during holidays. Jan talked about the impact that recent cuts to the food stamp or SNAP program at the federal level have had on our local economy and how it has been a drain on area food pantries. Mike Brynn joined me for the second half of the program to talk about November being Diabetes Awareness Month and to promote the Walk to Stop Diabetes which will be held November 9th at Quik Trip Park in Grand Prairie. The event will raise funds for the local chapter of the Diabetes Association and help them in their effort to assist those with diabetes, the money will also go to research for a cure to diabetes.

November 10, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Military Support, Education and Health.

Guest: Nekima Booker with the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas and Operation Healthy Reunions a program offered by Mental Health America of Greater Dallas.

Topic: Tomorrow is Veteran's Day and Nekima Booker joined me to talk about how we should honor veterans in our community and to highlight programs available here in North Texas to help our veterans. Nekima talked about the work that the Coalition does to build bridges between local community resources, national resources and veterans and their families so that they can rebuild their lives in the aftermath of war. Nekima talked about the work of Operation Healthy Reunions in dealing with the invisible scars of war and how the program helps veterans dealing with post traumatic stress and also how they help the spouses and children of veterans.

November 17, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health, Economy and Education

Guests: Jill Comnock the CEO of the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas and Claire Raggio the Chair of the Trains at North Park and Kathy Doyle Thomas with Half Price Books Community Outreach.

Topic: Jill Cumnock with the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas and Claire Raggio joined me to talk about the Trains at North Park which benefits the Ronald McDonald House. Jill talked about the work that the Ronald McDonald House does as a home away from home for families who have a child being treated at one of our many children's hospitals and how the house is able to economically help those families who are already spending so much money on their child's healthcare. Kathy Doyle Thomas joined me to promote the upcoming Booksgiving Day at Half Price Books which will be held on Saturday, November 23rd at all Half Price Books stores. Every child who comes to the store at 1pm will receive a free book and will be able to take part in a free story time at the store. The goal is to promote reading and literacy.

November 24, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Economy and Health.

Guests: Major Ward Matthews with the DFW Metroplex Command of the Salvation Army, Pat Patey with the Salvation Army North Texas, Martha Earngey with the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas and Dr. Hugo Sanchez an orthopedic surgeon. Topic: Major Matthews and Pat Patey with the Salvation Army DFW joined me to talk about the issue of helping the needy this holiday season and why the programs offered by the Salvation Army are important and how they help people get back on their feet. With the holidays right around the corner the Salvation Army has kicked off their biggest fundraisers of the year including the Red Kettle campaign which asks people to donate their change to help the needy and the Angel Tree program which provides holiday gifts for needy kids. Major Matthews and Pat Patey talked about the many programs offered by the Salvation Army throughout the year not just during the holidays.

The annual Fort Worth Jingle Bell Run and Walk for Arthritis will be held on Saturday, December 7th^t in Fort Worth and Martha and Dr. Sanchez joined me to promote the walk which raises not only awareness but funds for research and for programs offered by the Arthritis Foundation. Martha shared her personal battle with arthritis and the debilitating effects that the disease has on people's lives. Arthritis is the leading cause of disability among Americans over the age of 15, with 1 in 5 people suffering from some sort of arthritis.

December 1, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health, Economy and Education.

Guests: Scotty Landry the President and CEO of the Make A Wish Foundation of North Texas and Jennifer Scripts the Vice President of Revenue and Operations for the Perot Museum of Science and Nature.

Topic: Scott Landry joined me to talk about Macy's Annual Believe Campaign, which benefits the Make A Wish Foundation. For every letter that a child writes to Santa Claus that is dropped off at any Macy's store, Macy's will donate one dollar to the Make A Wish Foundation, a nonprofit that grants the wishes of children with life threatening illnesses here in North Texas. Scotty talked about the kids and their families who benefit from the wish and how the community can get involved to help grant the wishes. Jennifer Scripts with the Perot Museum of Nature and Science joined me to talk about the amazing exhibits at the museum, which is celebrating it's one year anniversary today. Jennifer talked about the importance of a museum like the Perot Museum for education and also the economic impact the museum has had on the downtown Dallas area. We talked about the museums community outreach and their goal of getting more students interested in Science and Math.

December 8, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Drugs and Alcohol, Crime and Law Enforcement and the Economy.

Guests: Jeff Miracle the Executive Director of Mothers Against Drunk Driving of North Texas and Dr. Alonzo Peterson the Executive Director of Giving Hope Inc, a nonprofit in Denton that helps the homeless.

Topic: Jeff Miracle joined me to talk about the issue of drunk driving and with Christmas and New Year's Eve coming up and so many people expected to make the party circuit the program was aimed at raising awareness of drinking and driving, with the theme of "If you're going to celebrate Designate." Typically the holidays are one of the most dangerous times of the year on our nation's roadways because of drunk drivers. Jeff Miracle talked about ways people can stay safe and he talked about the charges that face people who are caught drinking and driving. Jeff also talked about the services and programs offered by MADD to victims and their families. Dr. Alonzo Peterson joined me to talk about the work that Giving Hope Inc does to help the homeless in Denton County and we talked about the Blanket the City event that is being held at Crownover Middle School in Denton with students from the school spending the night in the schools gym to highlight the issue of homelessness and accepting donations for Giving Hope Inc.

December 15, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Welfare, Economy and Education.

Guest: Greg Eubanks the area Vice President for National Operations for Buckner International.

Topic: With the Holidays being all about spending time with family I decided to highlight the issue of adoption and foster care. Greg Eubanks joined me to talk about the adoption and foster care programs offered by Buckner International. The nonprofit has been in North Texas for 134 years serving as a home for orphaned children and helping the elderly. Other programs offered by Buckner include transitional living facilities for foster kids who are in need of placement and also living arrangements for people living domestic violence situations. Greg talked about what people should think about prior to going through the adoption or foster care process and the number of children here in Texas awaiting foster families or forever homes.

December 22, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health and Education

Guest: Pam Silvestri with the Southwest Transplant Allliance here in North Texas.

Topic: The gift of life. With the holidays now in full swing and people searching for the perfect gift we talked about the gift of organ donation. Currently there are over 100 thousand men, women and children waiting on life saving organ transplants. Pam talked about the importance of families talking about their wishes concerning organ donation and registering online at Donate Life Texas. Pam also shared her own personal story of donating a kidney to a friend who might otherwise have died had it not been for Pam's donation.

December 29, 2013 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy, Health, Military Support, Child Welfare and Education.

Guest: Larry James the CEO and President of CitySquare a nonprofit that has been battling poverty in North Texas for 25 years. Topic: This year's Heart of Dallas Bowl which will pit North Texas against UNLV at the Cotton Bowl on January 1st will benefit CitySquare so Larry James joined me to talk about the important work that CitySquare does to tackle the issue of poverty from every angle. The categories that CitySquare helps include Hunger, Housing, Health and Hope. Larry talked about the issue of poverty and how so many people in our area are living in poverty without people realizing it. CitySquare helps the homeless with job training and transitional housing, they also help kids who are aging out of the foster care system, they help those who are food insecure in our area thru their food pantry and they help with healthcare for the uninsured and underinsured. Larry talked about the public policy work that CitySquare does to insure that laws are in place to protect those in need.

KHKS Appearances and Events for non profits

Throughout the year KHKS helps promote morning show host Kidd Kraddick's non profit Kidd's Kids. The non profit helps send sick kids to Disney World every year. During the 3rd Quarter there were several restaurants who donated part of their proceeds to Kidd's Kids including Raising Cane's Chicken Fingers and Chili's Restaurants.

KHKS' Priscilla Kinkaid serves as the Assistant Director of the US Wounded Soldiers Foundation, a nonprofit whose mission is to provide for the needs of our combat veterans deployed in Iraq and Afghanistan. The foundation helps with clothing and toiletries and also helps out the Fisher House, which is similar to Ronald McDonald Houses, providing a place for military families to stay when they have a loved one in a military hospital.
