July 6, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues: Immigration, Crime and Violence, Human Trafficking, Drugs and Education

Guest: Vanna Slaughter Director of Immigration and Legal Services for Catholic Charities North Texas.

Topic: Vanna Slaughter joined me to talk about the ongoing crisis on the Texas Mexico border as thousands of undocumented children flood in to the U.S. seeking asylum from their homelands in Central America due to violence in Central America. Vanna talked about why the children are making their way to the United States and the dangers they face not only at home but on their journey to the U.S. she also talked about how the flood of immigrants is affecting our border and the need for comprehensive immigration reform in this country. We talked about misconceptions that people may have and how some people take advantage of undocumented immigrants. We talked about the impact the immigrants have on our economy both positive and negative and we talked about education and healthcare issues as well. Vanna also talked about the work that Catholic Charities does in our area to help with legal aid for immigrant and their other programs that combat poverty in our area.

July 13, 2014

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Education, Economy and Health.

Guests: Cheryl Sutterfield Jones the President and CEO of the Frontiers of Flight Museum in Dallas and Melissa Groves the Executive Director of Legacy Counseling Service.

Topic: Cheryl Sutterfield Jones joined me to talk about the upcoming Moon Day at the nonprofit Frontiers of Flight Museum in Dallas marking the 45th anniversary of the landing on the moon. Moon Day at the museum will feature several educational hands on exhibits for kids and adults alike. The event is in collaboration with the National Space Society of North Texas. Cheryl talked about the importance of promoting space education and science at a time when the American Education system is lagging behind other countries in the so called STEM Education. We also talked about the programs that the museum has year round for kids and adults including space camp and flight school. Melissa Groves joined me to talk about the upcoming Be An Angel Dinner that will benefit Legacy Counseling Service a nonprofit that helps people living with HIV and AIDs and their families. Melissa talked about the need to education young people about the dangers of unsafe sex and the recent rise in sexually transmitted diseases in North Texas. We talked about the different programs and services offered by Legacy.

July 20, 2014

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Healthcare, Education and the Economy

Guests: Dr. Ray Tsai with Children's Medical Center Dallas/Plano and Carol Arnold with the March of Dimes

Topic: Dr. Ray Tsai joined me to talk about the importance of vaccinations as parents get ready to send their kids back to school.. We also talked about misconceptions that people have about vaccinations and Dr. Tsai emphasized that the risks of not getting vaccinated far outweigh any dangers that people may perceive are related to vaccinating your child. We also talked about health concerns in our area including asthma due to poor air quality in North Texas and what parents should know to protect their kids if they have an asthma episode and we talked about the upcoming flu season and how to best prepare your child for the upcoming school year. Carol Arnold joined me to talk about the upcoming benefit baby shower in Fort Worth for needy moms and children in North Texas. We talked about the work that the March of Dimes does in our area to help expectant mothers take care of themselves and their unborn child in an effort to prevent premature births and birth defects.

July 27, 2014

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues, Economy, Education and Military Support

Guest: David Cox the President and CEO of Goodwill Industries of Fort Worth

Topic: David Cox talked about the great work that Goodwill Industries does here in North Texas to help people with special needs and disabilities find employment. Their slogan "Changing Lives through the Power of Work." We talked about how many people think Goodwill is only about their Thrift Shop and that the only time they think about Goodwill is when they are cleaning out their house and want to make donations to Goodwill but the organization does so much more teaming up with local companies to provide opportunities for people in need. Programs include the North Texas Institute for Career Development, and we talked about the Northeast Tarrant Business Opportunities Center and Computer Works. We also promoted the upcoming Goodwill Job and Wellness Fair which will be held in Fort Worth August 7th.

August 3, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Education and Economy and Health

Guests: Jane Didear with the Dallas Independent School District's Community Relations and Communications Department and Gary Huddleston the Director of Consumer Affairs for Kroger, plus Brett Brackett the Founder of the ALS Living Fund and Pete Ouadro the Executive Director of the ALS Living Fund.

Topic: As parents and kids get ready for back to school Jane Didear and Gary Huddleston joined me to talk about our station's Stuff the Bus-Back to School Supply Drive for needy families in North Texas, Jane talked about the importance of helping kids who may not be able to afford back to school supplies because their families are already barely making it month to month with rent, car insurance and buying groceries. Gary Huddleston talked about outreach efforts by his company to help schools in North Texas and how communities and neighborhoods need to do their part to volunteer to help out their area school districts especially now that the economic state of our country has forced so many school districts to cut funding to programs. Brett Brackett and Pete Quadro joined me to talk about the ALS Living Fund a North Texas non profit aimed at helping those in our area living with ALS or Lou Gehrig's Disease. With the ALS Ice Bucket Challenge becoming a viral sensation we wanted to raise awareness about the disease and about the need for quality care in our area.

August 10, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Health, Aging, Economy and Education

Guests: Dr. Diana Kerwin an Alzheimer's Association Board member and Chief of Geriatrics at Texas Health Resources Hospital and Amy Osler from Dallas who has early onset Alzheimer's.

Topic: It is estimated that every 67 seconds someone in the US develops Alzheimer's and as someone who lost her mother to this horrific disease, I wanted to shine a light on the disease and also on the research being done to find a cure to Alzheimer's. Amy Osler from Dallas shared her own personal journey of dealing with early onset Alzheimer's at the age of 43. Dr. Kerwin talked about what everyone should know about Alzheimer's like the signs and symptoms and preventive measures. We also talked about the different programs and services that the Alzheimer's Association of North Texas offers to those people like Amy living with Alzheimer's and also the programs for family members with a loved one with Alzheimer's. We promoted the upcoming Walks to End Alzheimer's and talked about the research projects the walks help to fund.

August 17, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Mental Health Issues and Education

Guests: Benaye Rogers the Executive Director of Contact Crisis Line and Julie Hersch the author of Struck by Living: From Depression to Hope.

Topic: The recent suicide of actor and comedian Robin Williams has shocked the nation and many people do not understand how someone who seemed to have it all, fame, wealth and a loving family could take his own life. Benaye and Julie talked about severe depression and how there is hope for those like Robin Williams who feel hopeless. We talked about services and programs in our area that help those dealing with severe depression and suicidal ideation and we promoted the suicide prevention hotline for anyone dealing with depression. Julie shared her own personal story of trying to commit suicide three times and how the issue is a brain issue that can't simply be helped by telling someone to buck up or hang in there but through medication and talk therapy any other forms of therapy including, in her case, shock therapy there can be hope.

August 24, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Health and Education

Guests: Evelyn Costelo the Executive Director of Wipe Out Kid's Cancer along with Shelly and her 9 year old son Lance a Wipe Out Kid's Cancer Ambassador, and Dr. Richard Wender the Chief Cancer Control Officer with the American Cancer Society. Topic: September will once again be Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month and Evelyn Costelo joined me to talk about the work that Wipe Out Kid's Cancer does here in North Texas to fund research at hospitals across the country with the ultimate goal of finding a cure for pediatric cancers. She also talked about the other programs aimed at helping children with cancer and their families. Shelly and her 9 year old son Lance talked about Lance's battle with cancer and how Wipe Out Kid's Cancer helped Lance and the family with Lance able to get away from the hospital and the doctor's visits for fun activities like Ranger's games, Stars Hockey and Maverick's Basketball games. Evelyn talked about the upcoming Run for the Children which will benefit Wipe Out Kid's Cancer. Dr. Richard Wender the Chief Cancer Control Officer with the American Cancer Society talked about how

research is coming along when it comes to pediatric cancers and he talked about the importance of preventive care when it comes to cancers that affect adults. We talked about the work that the American Cancer Soceity does not only when it comes to research but also the services they provide to cancer patients and we talked about the latest initiative to get more people tested for colon cancer.

August 31, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Crime and Violence, Economy and Education

Guests: Paige Flink the Executive Director of The Family Place and Eric White a Family Place Board Member.

Topic: Once again domestic violence is in the headlines in part due to the recent NFL controversy surrounding Ray Rice of the Baltimore Ravens who reportedly punched his fiancée in an elevator and then dragged her out of the elevator by the hair. The incident was caught on tape and outraged people across the country but what really outraged a lot of people was the fact that initially the NFL had only suspended Ray Rice for two games. The publicity surrounding the case forced the NFL to change their policy when it comes to punishing those involved in domestic abuse. Paige Flink joined me to talk about the issue of domestic violence in our area and around the country and why something needs to be done to raise awareness and let people know that there is help available to them and their children. Eric White talked about the need for men to step up and say enough is enough and that men who abuse women will not be tolerated. Paige talked about the programs offered by the Family Place not just to victims but to the abusers as well. We also promoted the upcoming Trailblazers Luncheon that will benefit the Family Place their programs and their shelter.

September 7, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Military Support, Volunteerism, Teen Pregnancy, Economy and Education.

Guests: Dennis Luellen the Executive Director of Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas and Rachel Branaman the Executive Director of Alley's House and Ashley a teen mom who graduated from the programs offered by Alley's House.

Topic: September 11th is now a National Day of Service and Remembrance and this year Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas an organization that brings volunteers together to improve the lives of homeowners in need including seniors and veterans will bring together nine hundred and eleven volunteers to work on different service projects in South Dallas and at the Veteran's Hospital. The projects include remodeling dilapidated homes owned by seniors and veterans and building ramps for disabled veterans and seniors. Dennis Luellen joined me to talk about the Day of Service and how his organization helps those in need with home projects throughout the year. Rachel Branaman with Alley's House joined me to talk about the issue of teen pregnancy. Recently a unborn fetus was found at Woodrow Wilson High School in Dallas and the scared teen mom reportedly had not confided to anyone because she was ashamed of her situation. Rachel talked about the realities of pregnant teens and how her organization helps teen moms and their children through education and mentoring. Ashley a former teen mom helped by Alley's House shared her personal journey of how Alley's House helped her and how she is a better mom today because of it. We also promoted the upcoming Alley's House Luncheon which will be held October 1st at the House of Blues in Dallas and which will feature guest speaker Barbara Pierce Bush the daughter of the former president.

September 14, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Emergency Preparedness, Education, Health and Military Support

Guests: Anita Foster with the American Red Cross North Texas

Topic: Anita Foster joined me to talk about emergency preparedness. September is Emergency Preparedness Month aimed at raising awareness of the need to be ready as a community for any type of disaster whether it is manmade like the September 11th attacks or a natural disaster like tornadoes or flash floods. Anita talked about emergency kits that families should have in their homes and emergency plans that should be in place and we talked about the readiness of North Texas in case of disaster. We also talked about the work that the Red Cross does in our area not just following a disaster but in helping with the area's blood supply and also in helping military families and helping with first aid classes for babysitters and for parents, swim lessons, and help following home and apartment fires for those who have lost everything.

September 21, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues: Health, Education and Economy

Guest: Dr. John Carlo the Chief Executive Officer of AIDs ARMS of North Texas.

Topic: Our station is once again a presenting sponsor for the upcoming Lifewalk which will benefit AIDs ARMS and the work that they do here in North Texas to help those with HIV and AIDs. Dr. Carlo joined me to talk about the need for the entire community to understand that if you are sexually active, if you are having unprotected sex you are at risk of HIV and AIDs. So many of those who are newly diagnosed never thought they were at risk because they thought that this is a gay person's disease not thinking that if a spouse strays or a partner cheats you are at risk. Dr. Carlo talked about the programs offered by AIDS ARMS and we promoted the upcoming Lifewalk which will take place Sunday, October 5th, at Lee Park in Dallas. We also discussed other health problems including the Ebola virus and what the community should know about transmitable diseases and we talked about the healthcare act and how it is impacting the lives of people in our community.

September 28, 2014 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Guests: Suzanne Stell the Executive Director of Shelton School and Training Center, Jack Madden and Grace Bergess who are students at Shelton and Joy Brandon Donavan and Rhonda Morton Eltiste with the American Cancer Society. Topic: Suzanne Stell joined me to talk about Shelton School and their work with children and adults with dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia and other related learning disorders or learning differences, as they refer to them as. Jack and Grace, students at Shelton talked about living with dyslexia and how Shelton has helped them with their education and how before they thought they were stupid or dumb but thanks to Shelton discovered that they just learn differently. Suzanne talked about October being Learning Disabilities or Learning Differences Awareness Month and the research in to dyslexia and related disorders. Shelton is the world's largest school and training center looking in to learning differences and we talked about their community outreach to those who can not afford to attend the nonprofit school. Joy Brandon Donavan and Rhonda Morton Eltiste talked about Breast Cancer Awareness Month which kicks off on Wednesday and they promoted the upcoming Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk which will be held Saturday, October 4th at the University of Texas Arlington. Rhonda is a breast cancer survivor and she talked about how the American Cancer Society's programs helped her following her diagnosis and Joy talked about the different services that are available to people with cancer here in North Texas through the American Cancer Society.
