30 minute program

Issues Covered: Animal Rights, Economy and Education

Guest: Jacob Carty Communications Manager for Spay Neuter Network North Texas.

Topic: Jacob Carty joined me to talk about raising awareness about spaying and neutering pets. The Spay Neuter Network, a North Texas nonprofit, has kicked off a campaign titled "Happy Neuter Year" to encourage people to spay and neuter with low cost spay and neuter services throughout the month of January. Jacob talked about the services and programs offered by the Spay Neuter Network including their mobile unit that goes into North Texas zip codes that animal rights activists have determined are the areas where the most animal surrenders take place. We talked about educating the public about the impact that spaying and neutering has on the number of unwanted animals.

January 8, 2017

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Homelessness.

Guest: Reverend Bob Sweeney the Executive Director of Dallas Life, the largest homeless shelter in North Texas.

Topic: Reverend Bob Sweeney joined me to talk about the work that Dallas Life does in our area to help the homeless who have lost everything either due to addiction, unemployment, health issues or divorce. Reverend Sweeney talked about the services and programs that they have in place to help the homeless get medical help and economic help as well as educational help so that they can join the workforce and become self-sufficient. We also talked about the housing first approach to homelessness that Reverend Sweeney believes does not address the root causes of homelessness however the approach has had much success in the state of Utah getting homeless people off the streets. We also promoted the food drive through the Souper Bowl of Caring that will benefit Dallas Life that is running now thru Super Bowl Sunday.

January 15, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime and Law Enforcement, Economic Issues, Education and Racial Discrimination.

Guest: Dr. Alex Del Carmen the Head of the School of Criminology, Criminal Justice and Strategic Studies at Tarleton State University in Fort Worth.

Topic: It is MLK week end and the issue of racial tension between police and the people they are charged with protecting especially those of color is at an all-time high across the US and so Dr. Del Carmen joined me to talk about community policing and ways that police are trying to reach out to the communities they serve so that they can work together to make neighborhoods safer. We also discussed the recent terror attack in Fort Lauderdale and protecting airports and high profile areas from attack and the need for better mental health care services to keep guns out of the hands of those who would do us harm because of their mental illness. Dr. Del Carmen also talked about policing in the era of Facebook Live and how he is training police recruits and students to deal with having a camera on them 24/7 and we talked about the recent incident in Fort Worth involving a police officer who was caught on Facebook Live tazing a woman who had called police after her son was hit by a neighbor for littering and best practices for officers in dealing with volatile situations.

January 22, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education, Mentoring, Economic Issues.

Guests: Dolores Sosa Green the Executive Director of the Trinity River Mission and Amber Green the Youth Alumni Manager at Trinity River Mission.

Topic: The month of January is National Mentoring Month aimed at encouraging people to mentor students at area schools and one nonprofit here in North Texas that relies on volunteer mentors to help low income students is the Trinity River Mission an after school program in West Dallas. Dolores and Amber joined me to talk about the programs and services provided by TRM, Tutor Read Mentor, and the impact that their programs have on the area and the families that they help and the graduation success rate that they have and how the high school drop out rate in their area has gone down thanks in part to their work. Amber received after school homework help at TRM and became the first in her family to graduate from high school and college and she now works as the Youth and Alumni Manager at the nonprofit. She talked about what the TRM Believe and Achieve Program meant to her and she encouraged people to become mentors. I also spent time in the program intro and outro talking about community efforts to help the family of fallen Little Elm detective Jerry Walker who was gunned down this week by a suspect brandishing a gun in a Little Elm neighborhood.

January 29, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Education. Guest: Snowe Saxman a Financial Literacy Expert.

Topic: For many North Texans the New Year is a time to start thinking about being physically fit and becoming fiscally fit. Best-selling author Snowe Saxman known as the money oracle joined me on the program to talk about financial tips so that people can get out of debt and clean up their finances. We talked about budgeting, saving for emergencies, how to deal with student loan debt and how to make sure you educate yourself before buying a home so that you don't find yourself in a financial mess. We talked about ways to work with credit card companies and debt collectors and she talked about investing best practices.

February 5, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health issue, Sports Related Injuries and Economic Issues.

Guest: Kelly Cruse the Executive Director of New Friends New Life

Topic: It is Super Bowl Sunday and as the NFL gets ready to crown their national champions we tackled a subject that the NFL and others have been trying to highlight ahead of the big game and that is the issue of human trafficking. Kelly Cruse joined me talk about the reality of human trafficking in North Texas, a problem that most people mistakenly believe only happens in third world countries, with Dallas' sex trade estimated as being a 99 million dollar a year business and many of those involved are trafficked women. Kelly Cruse talked about how New Friends New Life helps those who are victims and how they aim to educate the public about the situation and how to spot victims and report to authorities if they suspect someone is a victim of human trafficking. We also promoted the upcoming New Friends New Life luncheon that will take place in May that will feature actor Ashton Kutcher an advocate for victims of human trafficking.

February 12, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issue covered: Mental Health Issues and Education and Suicide Prevention.

Guests: Vanita Halliburton the Founder and President of the Grant Halliburton Foundation and Sierra Sanchez the Senior Program Coordinator with the Grant Halliburton Foundation.

Topic: Recently a North Texas student who had been bullied ran away and the incident once again raised awareness of the issue of bullying and also mental health issues among our youth. Vanita Halliburton and Sierra Sanchez joined me to talk about methods that teenagers and young adults can cope when dealing with life's daily challenges from bullying to depression and school pressure. We talked about the programs that the Grant Halliburton Foundation has to promote mental well being and their services for teens and for families including parents. Raising awareness about mental health issues is extremely important and Sierra talked about the community outreach that the Foundation does at schools and at churches. We talked about suicide prevention and the signs that loved ones should be on the look out for and we also promoted the upcoming Beacon of Hope Luncheon in Dallas that will benefit the Grant Halliburton Foundation.

February 19, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Developmental Disabilities, Education and Health Issues.

Guest: Brooke Dieterlen the Executive Director of the ARC of North Texas.

Topic: March is Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month and Brooke joined me to talk about the services and programs that the ARC of North Texas offers to people with Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities including day care programs for those who have aged out of the school system but still need care so that their parents can go to work, we talked about their spring break and summer camps and their life skills classes as well as their guardianship programs for people with developmental disabilities whose parents have passed away and there is no one to care for them. The ARC also offers safety courses for those who are developmentally or intellectually disabled. We also promoted the upcoming Gala which will raise funds for the ARC and the March for Respect which will be held at Main Street Garden in downtown Dallas on March 25th aimed at raising awareness about showing love and respect for those with developmental disabilities from down syndrome, autism, Asperger's and more. Brooke also talked about the advocacy that the ARC does with the state legislature and to the federal government.

February 26, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Animal Rights and Protection, Education and Economic Issues.

Guest: Maura Davies the Communications Director for the SPCA of Texas.

Topic: February is Shelter Pet Adoption Month and February 28th is World Spay Day set aside to highlight the importance of

spaying and neutering animals so as to decrease the population of unwanted dogs and cats and to limit the number of animals that are euthanized every year because they do not have homes. Maura Davies joined me to talk about the SPCA of Texas and their services and programs to provide homes for homeless pets and to educate the public about taking care of animals and we talked about spaying and neutering and their programs targeting those areas in North Texas that have the highest number of surrendered animals to area animal shelters. We talked about the classes for new pet owners and their grief support groups for those who have lost a pet and programs aimed at teaching kids about the need to take care of animals and prevent animal cruelty.

March 5, 2017

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime and Violence, Racial Discrimination, Law Enforcement and Human Rights.

Guest: Collette Flanagan the Founder of Mother's Against Police Brutality.

Topic: Coming up on Saturday, March 11th in Dallas the 2nd Annual Clinton R. Allen: Youth Speak Out Against Police Brutality Event will be held to draw attention to the issue of policing in our area and how police need to be held accountable when they gun down someone who is innocent and how they must be better trained to deal with volatile situations so that every encounter with someone, especially of color, doesn't end up with someone being shot. Collette Flanagan began her nonprofit Mother's Against Police Brutality following the death of her son Clinton in 2013 and although police had at first said it was a justifiable shooting it turns out after investigation that Clinton was innocent and that the officer overreacted shooting Clinton multiple times. Collette talked about the efforts her organization has made with the Justice Department to provide better training for police and she talked about community policing as a way of bridging the gap between police and those that they serve.

March 12, 2017

Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues, Education, Economy.

Guests: Dr. Durado Brooks the Managing Director of Cancer Control Intervention for the American Cancer Society and Cynt Marshall a survivor of colon cancer.

Topic: March is Colon Cancer Awareness Month and Dr. Brooks and Cynt Marshall joined me to talk about what we all need to know about colon cancer, the signs, symptoms, and therapies and also how to prevent colon cancer. Dr. Brooks also talked about the American Cancer Society's campaign to get more people screened for colon cancer since it is the most preventable form of cancer when caught early. We talked about screening methods and we talked about programs and services offered by the American Cancer Society to those who have been diagnosed with cancer of any kind. Cynt shared her own personal journey with colon cancer and how she was diagnosed thanks to her company AT&T's healthy initiative which encouraged employees to get screened. Cynt talked about how all companies should work towards a healthy workforce by encouraging healthy lifestyles and yearly checkups.

March 26, 2017 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic, Education, Human Rights and Refugees.

Guests: Liz Curfman the Refugee Ministry Director for Northwest Community Center and Jean Congera an African Refugee who now serves as a community leader for Northwest Community Center.

Topic: There has been a lot of talk about refugees and banning them from coming to the US during the Trump Administration and so in an effort to shine a light on refugee programs in North Texas I invited Liz and Jean with the Northwest Community Center to join me to talk about their programs in the Vickery Meadow area of Dallas to help refugees that come to our area. Liz talked about the reality of how refugees end up in the US and the vetting process that can take upwards of two to three years and how families are not coming to our area because they want but because they are fleeing war, famine or persecution and how the United Nations works with partner countries to find placement for the refugees. Jean shared his story of coming to North Texas after fleeing war in several African countries and how it took his family three years of waiting to find out where they would end up. He talked about the difficulties of being a refugee. Learning to adapt to new cultures, a new language and learning new job skills. We talked about the services and programs the Community Center which was started by Northwest Bible Church offers to refugees including English classes, job skills training and ministry and mental health services. We also talked about ways that the
