30 minute program

Issues: Veterans Support and Mental Health Awareness for Veterans

Guests: Nekima Horton the Chair of the Veteran’s Coalition of North Central Texas and Janie Metzinger with Mental Health America of Greater Dallas.

Topic: 4th of July week end in North Texas and as we celebrate our country’s independence we are highlighting the work that the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas does to support the men and women who have fought for our country. Nekima Horton joined me to talk about the work that VCNCT does to build bridges between local community resources, national resources and veterans and their families so that they can rebuild their lives in the aftermath of war. Nekima and Janie Metzinger with Mental Health America talked about the work of Operation Healthy Reunions in dealing with the invisible scars of war and how the program helps veterans dealing with post-traumatic stress and also how they help the spouses and children of veterans. We talked about the high suicide rate amongst our veterans and even active duty military and how we need to make sure these men and women know that it is okay to ask for help and that they are not alone. We also promoted our company’s Show Your Stripes campaign which helps connect employers looking to hire vets with vets in our area in need of employment.

Topic: Todd Mark with Navicore Solutions, the national leader in the field of nonprofit financial counseling, joined me to talk about the work that Navicore does to help people with gain their financial independence. With vacation season upon us and school getting ready to start up again Todd talked about ways to manage your finances so you don’t go into debt and if you are in debt how to get out of it. We talked about bankruptcy protection and also about saving for financial emergencies and planning for college education and protecting yourself from financial scams that say they will help you get out of debt but then charge you thousands of dollars you don’t have. Bruce Bleakley with the Frontiers of Flight Museum joined me to talk about the upcoming Moon Day at the museum which take place on Saturday, July 16th and will offer hands on exhibits for kids and adults alike. Moon Day will highlight the education programs offered by the museum in science, technology and math and we talked about the other educational programs offered by the nonprofit museum.

Guest: April Mitchell the Chief Executive Officer of the Dallas Area Rape Crisis Center.

Topic: Recently the issue of rape on college campuses has been front and center as ramifications from the way Baylor University in Waco handled the sexual assault of a student by a student athlete came to light with the resignation by Baylor’s President and the firing of Baylor’s Head Football Coach. April Mitchell joined me to talk about the work that the Dallas Area Rape Crisis Center does to help the victims of rape and their family and friends as well. DARCC helps victims navigate the criminal justice system from the first outcry to seeking justice against the perpetrator of the rape. DARCC offers emotional support thru group therapy and one on one therapy and they offer educational programs for schools as well working with high schools and colleges to offer up prevention tips and ways of dealing with sexual assaults on campus should one occur.

Guests: April Martin Nickels the Public Affairs Director for Kroger North Texas and Crystal Schanio with the Irving Independent School District.

Topic: As parents and kids get ready for back to school Crystal Schanio with the Irving Independent School District and April

Martin Nickels with Kroger joined me to talk about our stations Back to School Supply Drive “Backpack Boosters” for needy families in North Texas. Crystal talked about the importance of helping kids who may not be able to afford back to school supplies because their families are already barely making it month to month with rent, car insurance and buying groceries. She talked about the reality of what faces children today in low income zip codes and how these school supplies help the children focus on their education rather than their need. April Martin Nickels talked about outreach efforts by Kroger to help schools in North Texas and how communities and neighborhoods need to do their part to volunteer to help out their area school districts especially now that the economic state of our country has forced so many school districts to cut funding to programs.

Topic: With the school year set to start in a month David Hyslop and Paulette Hopkins joined me to talk about the importance of arts education and how Dallas Summer Musicals helps to promote the arts in our community thru their seats for kids program that introduces Broadway musicals to youth in our area. We also talked about the nonprofits other education programs aimed at helping at risk youth. David and Paulette also talked about the new season of Dallas Summer Musicals which will kick off in November. Bill Chin joined me to talk about Big Brothers Big Sisters the nation’s largest donor and volunteer supported mentoring network. Bill talked about the impact that mentoring has on the life of a child and shared his own personal experience as a mentor to a young man who is now about to graduate from high school. Bill talked about what it takes to be a Big Brother or Big Sister and how people can sign up now ahead of the new school year.

Guests: Dallas Police Major Max Geron and Officer Kevin Masters with the Dallas Police Department

Topic: Today marks one month since the deadly attack on Dallas Police that claimed the lives of 5 police officers and as the community continues to heal Major Max Geron and Officer Kevin Masters joined me to talk about how the Dallas Police Department is coping and how the department is focused on helping to prevent further acts of violence against police and to mend relations within the minority community. We talked about community policing and people coming together to help battle crime in their own neighborhoods and how the outreach that the Dallas police department has done over the years thru Coffee with a Cop has actually helped to reduce the number of officer involved shootings and helped to close cases. We also talked about crime prevention tips for neighborhoods and the upcoming National Night Out which will take place in Texas in October and how neighborhood watches work.

August 14, 2016

Issues: Economy and Veterans Support

Guest: Dennis Luellen with Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas

Topic: Dennis Luellen with Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas joined me to talk about the upcoming Operation Freedom event that will take place starting on September 11th and ending on Veteran’s Day November 11th. Operation Freedom aims to fix up the homes of deserving veterans and first responders every day between September 11th and Veteran’s Day as a way of honoring those who have given so much to protect our country and to serve our communities. Dennis talked about the work that Rebuilding Together does to help those in need who can’t keep up with home repairs from senior citizens, the disabled, the poor and veterans and first responders in need and we also talked about how by helping to fix up these homes and allowing families to stay in place we are combatting homelessness and improving communities. Dennis talked about ways the community can volunteer and help out Rebuilding Together Dallas during Operation Freedom.

Issues: Health Issue, Education and Rights for the LGBTQ Community.

Guests: Kimberly Martinez the Executive Director of the Elisa Project, Rafael McDonnel the Communications and Advocacy

Manager for Resource Center and Leslie McMurray a Transgender woman who works with Resource Center.

Topic: With School set to start tomorrow for many North Texas students Kimberly Martinez joined me to talk about eating disorders and about the work that The Elisa Project does to raise awareness about eating disorders like anorexia nervosa, bulimia, overeating and binge eating. The Elisa Project is a nonprofit dedicated to the prevention and effective treatment of eating disorders and Kimberly talked about how the start of school is a stressful time and how many eating disorders arise at the beginning of high school and college but also students in junior high have been diagnosed with eating disorders as a way of dealing with stressful situations. We talked about the effect of social media on eating disorders, what parents should know about signs of eating disorders and resources available to help families. Rafael and Leslie joined me to talk about the work that Resource Center does to help those who are in the LGBTQ community especially young people who may be coming out for the first time and dealing with family rejection or bullying at school. Leslie shared her story of being a transgender woman and the prejudice she has encountered and how Resource Center helps those who are Transgender in our community.

August 28, 2016

Issues: Health and Education and Support for First Responders

Guests: Sarah Harris with the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition, Gerrard Friend a Denton Firefighter and the Chair for this Year's Sons of the Flag Climb For a Calling and Matt Jelinski with the Fraternal Order of Leatherheads.

Topic: The month of September is Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month and Sarah joined me to talk about the work that the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition does to raise awareness and to raise money for research into this deadly gynecological disease that claimed the life of Sarah's grandmother. Sarah shared her grandmother's story and talked about what every woman should know about the disease because early detection is key despite the fact that symptoms are not that apparent. We also promoted the Ovarian Cancer walk that will take place on Sunday, September 25th at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie that will raise funds for research. Gerrard Friend and Matt Jelinski joined me to talk about the upcoming Sons of the Flag Climb for a Calling that will take place in Fort Worth on Sunday, September 11th that will benefit Sons of the Flag a nonprofit that helps burn victims. The Climb for a Calling is open to everyone who would like to honor first responders on September 11th. The event will take place at Burnett Plaza with participants climbing up 110 flights of stairs to simulate the climb that September 11th first responders did in 2001 when our country came under attack. Gerrard and Max also talked about the work that Sons of the Flag does to help burn victims and to raise research dollars into burn therapy.

Issues: Criminal Justice System, Crime and Law Enforcement, Education and Economy

Guests: Michael Cohen and Steven Halbauer attorneys, who volunteer with the Alzheimer's Association of North Texas to provide elder legal advice and Lynn Davis the CEO of Dallas Children's Advocacy Center,

Topic: This past week actor Gene Wilder died of Alzheimer's Disease. He had been battling the disease for three years but had not made it public because he did not want for people to think of him as frail. Unfortunately the number of cases of Alzheimer's continues to rise as our population ages and with the diagnosis come all sorts of legal questions for families. Michael Cohen and Steven Halbauer are two Dallas attorneys who volunteer with the Alzheimer's Association of North Texas to offer up free elder law advice to families who have a loved one with Alzheimer's so that the families can plan for the disease and make sure that someone has power of attorney and can make medical and financial decisions so that their loved one does not become the victim of a scam. Michael and Steven both have loved ones who died of Alzheimer's and they shared their own journeys as well as information on the services and programs offered by the Alzheimer's Association. They also talked about the upcoming Walk to End Alzheimer's that will take place on Saturday, October 1st in The Colony and in Dallas to raise awareness about the disease and to raise research dollars. Lynn Davis with Dallas Children's Advocacy Center joined me to talk about the upcoming Encore for Advocacy an event that will take place at the Majestic Theater in Dallas on Friday, September 16th and that will benefit the work that DCAC does in our area to protect children who have been abused. Lynn talked about what the community needs to know about the issue of child abuse, how to spot it, how to report it and how to educate ourselves on preventing child abuse.

Guest: Anita Foster with the American Red Cross of North Texas.

Topic: Today marks the 15th Anniversary of the September 11th attacks on our country and as we mark such a tragic day we highlight the work that First Responders did on 9/11 to help the victims and communities. September is Emergency Preparedness Month and Anita Foster joined me to talk about what everyone needs to know about emergency preparedness whether it's being prepared for a terrorist attack or a flood or tornado or hurricane or house fire. Anita highlighted the programs offered by the Red Cross to help people put together emergency kits for their home, how to put together an evacuation plan for your home or business and what to do in case of a disaster. We also talked about the recent flooding disaster in Louisiana and how North Texans can help and the work that the Red Cross does year round to help people not just from disasters but thru their blood donation centers and their training and certification classes for CPR and first aid.

Topic: Our station is once again a presenting sponsor for the upcoming Lifewalk which will benefit AIDs ARMS and the work that they do here in North Texas to help those with HIV and AIDs. Dr. Carlo joined me to talk about the need for the entire community to understand that if you are sexually active, if you are having unprotected sex you are at risk of HIV and AIDs. So many of those who are newly diagnosed never thought they were at risk because they thought that this is a gay person's disease not thinking that if a spouse strays or a partner cheats you are at risk. Dr. Carlo talked about the programs offered by AIDs ARMS and we promoted the upcoming Lifewalk which will take place Sunday, October 4th, at Lee Park in Dallas.
