Issues Covered: Health Issue

Guests: Joy Donavan Brandon the Director of Communications for the North Texas Divison of the American Cancer Society, Beth Stavinoha and Janet Kibler breast cancer survivors..

Topic: October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month and Joy, Beth and Janet joined me to talk about breast health, the signs and symptoms of breast cancer, the importance of early diagnosis and the programs and services offered by the American Cancer Society to those affected by breast cancer in our area. Joy talked about the research that continues and the breakthroughs made

thanks to research funded by the American Cancer Society. Beth and Janet shared their own personal journeys of battling breast cancer and what they have learned along the way and why it is important to them to raise awareness and funds to help battle the disease.

October 9, 2016 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education, Economy and Health

Guests: Kirsten Brandt James the Executive Director of Alley's House and Alexis Atchley a teen mom who received help through Alley's House.

Topic: Kirsten Brandt James and Alexis Atchley joined me to talk about the issue of teen pregnancy here in North Texas. Although the teen pregnancy rate is on the decline nationally here in Texas we are still seeing record numbers of teen births and North Texas leads the nation in the number of repeat births by teen moms. Kirsten talked about the services offered to teen moms at Alley's House and their efforts to educate young women so that they can break the cycle of poverty. Alexis shared her story of being homeless and getting pregnant and how Alley's House helped her finish her high school education and become a better parent. She is now studying to be a nurse. We also promoted the upcoming Alley's House Luncheon which raises funds for the nonprofits programs. The luncheon will feature Lucille O'Neal the mother of basketball great Shaquille O'Neal. Lucille had Shaquille when she was a teenager.

October 16, 2016 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime Prevention, Economic Issues, Health and Disabilities.

Guests: Paige Flink the Executive Director of the Family Place and Hugh McElroy the Executive Director of Dallas Lighthouse for the Blind.

Topic: October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Paige joined me to talk about what we should all know about family violence the signs and impact that this problem has on families and on our community. Paige talked about the work that the Family Place does to raise awareness about the issue of domestic violence but also to help the victims and their families. We talked about safety planning, on the abuse hotline and ways to help those who are being abused. We also talked about the Partners Card campaign which will raise funds for the Family Place's services and programs including their transitional living and emergency shelters. For the second segment of the program Hugh McElroy with Dallas Lighthouse for the Blind joined me to talk about the programs they have in place to help visually impaired people here in North Texas. The nonprofit helps employ visually impaired individuals as well as helps those who have been recently diagnosed with life skills. We also promoted the upcoming benefit concert by blind country music star Ronnie Milsap which will be held in Dallas on Sunday, November 3rd.

October 23, 2016 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education and Learning Differences

Guests: Suzanne Stell the Executive Director of the Shelton School and Sam Wiggins a student from Shelton who has dyslexia, also Dr. Edward Hallowell/

Topic: October is Learning Differences Awareness Month and Suzanne joined me to talk about how Shelton leads the way nationally in helping students with learning differences from dyslexia to ADHD. She talked about the research that goes on at the lab at the school to find new ways of teaching students with learning differences and Sam Wiggins talked about dealing with dyslexia, when he was diagnosed and how it has impacted him. Suzanne talked about community outreach programs that Shelton has to help parents teach their kids if they don't go to Shelton. Dr. Hallowell joined me to talk about ADHD what it is and how to deal with it. He talked about the problems for people who live with ADHD but how they can overcome and live with ADHD so that they can thrive. We talked about treatments and other ways of dealing with ADHD.

October 30, 2016 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Crime, Child Safety Issues, Economy, Education and Veterans Issues.

Guests: Erica Greve the Founder and President of Unlikely Heroes and Former Dallas Cowboy Kenyon Coleman who is on the Board of Unlikely Heroes. Nekima Horton with the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas.

Topic: More and more victims of human trafficking are being found in North Texas. Unlikely Heroes is a nonprofit that focuses on ways to end human trafficking by raising awareness about the issue and by helping the child victims of human trafficking who are often times sold in to sex slavery. Erica Greve talked about her nonprofit and Kenyon Coleman talked about why it is important for men to get involved so that we reduce the demand for prostitutes. Nekima Horton joined me to talk about the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas and their upcoming plans for Veterans Day and for Thanksgiving. VCNCT offers up services and programs to help our veterans adapt to their new normal when they return with job opportunities, mentoring opportunities, mental health programs, housing and any need a veteran may encounter. We promoted the upcoming Thanksgiving for Veterans and we talked about ways to help veterans and their families.

November 6, 2016 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues

Guests: Major John Rich the Commander with the Salvation Army DFW and Pat Patey the Communications Director with the Salvation Army DFW and Country Music Star Jimmy Wayne.

Topic: Major Rich and Pat Patey with the Salvation Army DFW joined me to talk about the issue of helping the needy this holiday season and why the programs offered by the Salvation Army are important and how they help people get back on their feet. With the holidays right around the corner the Salvation Army has kicked off their biggest fundraisers of the year including the Red Kettle campaign which asks people to donate their change to help the needy and the Angel Tree program which provides holiday gifts for needy kids. Major Rich and Pat Patey talked about the many programs offered by the Salvation Army throughout the year not just during the holidays and we also promoted the "Doing the Most Good Luncheon" which will be held later this month in Dallas and will feature Country Music Star Jimmy Wayne who joined us on the phone to talk about why the Salvation Army's work means so much to him. Jimmy actually was a foster child who received his first guitar as a gift when he was a child thru the Angel Tree program.

Guests: Anna Kurian with the North Texas Food Bank and Susan Hoff with United Way of Metropolitan Dallas.

Topic: The holidays are a time when we all try to give back to the community and one way to give back is to help out the North Texas Food Bank with can food drives or online donations. Anna Kurian talked about the work that the North Texas Food Bank does to help feed the hungry in our area and the vast number of services and programs aimed at helping the most vulnerable from children to senior citizens. For the second segment of the program Susan joined me to talk about Giving Tuesday which is the Tuesday after Thanksgiving and which is aimed at encouraging people to donate to nonprofits in our area. United Way of Metropolitan Dallas works with a number of nonprofits that target education and children's issues and they are helping to promote Giving Tuesday. Susan talked about how United Way goes about finding the best nonprofits to help. Those agencies who are being good stewards of donated dollars and getting the best results from their services and programs and she talked about how the community can help those nonprofits so that we can help build a stronger community.

the Ronald McDonald House. Jill talked about the work that the Ronald McDonald House does as a home away from home for families who have a child being treated at one of our many children's hospitals and how the house is able to economically help those families who are already spending so much money on their child's healthcare. For the second segment of the program Amy Spawn joined me to talk about the work that the Warren Center does to help children with developmental disabilities in our area. We promoted their holiday gift drive and we also talked about how the Warren Center is in line to receive a donation from Reliant Energy if they become the nonprofit of choice of Reliant Energy with people being asked to vote online for a charity and thanks to listener efforts the Warren Center received a \$100,000 dolllar donation from the energy company.

We talked about how so many of these children are praying for a home for the holidays and we promoted the programs that Jonathan's Place has for people thinking about fostering a child or adopting a child. Stephanie talked about how she and her husband first came to Jonathan's Place and she shared her experience as a foster mom who wound up adopting thru Jonathan's Place. For the second segment of the program I was joined by Adam Levin a cyber security expert who joined me to talk about ways to protect yourself from identity theft during the holidays and how to shop online securely.

December 4, 2016 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Housing

Guests: Carol Kyer the Executive Director of Habitat for Humanity Denton County, Keri Marie Sutherland the Development Program Director with Habitat and Sandra Acevedo a Habitat family homeowner.

Topic: Carol, Keri Marie and Sandra joined me to talk about Habitat for Humanity and nonprofit that helps low income families get into homes by giving them a hand up not a hand out. Carol explained how Habitat for Humanity works and how families must have good credit and show responsibility by putting in classroom hours to learn how to be a homeowner and by putting in sweat equity. We talked about the impact that Habitat has on the local economy, on neighborhoods and Sandra shared her own experience of getting into a Habitat Home and how the experience has helped her be a more responsible citizen to the community.

Guest: Matt Roberts the President of Mental Health America of Greater Dallas

Topic: The holidays can be a time of joy but they can also be a time of stress and for people dealing with depression or loss the holidays can be a particularly tough time. Matt Roberts joined me to talk about ways of dealing with the so called holiday blues and with holiday stress, he discussed when a person should be concerned that the sadness is not just seasonal but can be a sign of a worsening depression. We also talked about the services and programs offered by Mental Health America of Greater Dallas to people dealing with mental health issues in our community.

December 18, 2016 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy and Education and Child Safety.

Guest: Karen Hughes the President and CEO of Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps homeless children in our area.

Topic: Karen Hughes joined me to talk about the upcoming Day 1 Dallas a benefit event that will be held January 1st at Fair Park in Dallas that will raise funds for Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps the youngest victims of poverty in North Texas, homeless children. Karen talked about all the fun activities that will take place at Day 1 Dallas but also the importance of an event like this

to raise awareness about the issue of homeless children since so many people think the homeless are alcoholics or drug addicts and don't think of the youngest victims and their families. Karen talked about the programs that Vogel has in place to help kids from infant to 15 and their families as well so that the parents can get on their feet and break the cycle of poverty.

Issues Covered: Community Involvement and Health and Education

Guests: Tammy Richards the President of Volunteer Now and Loretta Morgan with Carter Blood Care.

Topic. Christmas Day and while many people are giving and receiving presents we focused on those gifts that don't cost a thing, the gift of time and the gift of blood. Tammy Richards joined me to talk about Volunteer Now a nonprofit that connects people with volunteer opportunities here in North Texas and the need for volunteers and the impact that volunteer hours have on our community. We talked about all the different ways that people can give back for an hour, a day, or as an ongoing volunteer. Loretta Morgan joined me to talk about the need for blood donors during the holiday season because typically this is a time of year when the need for donors goes up due to vacation and holiday schedules and due to an increase in surgeries during the holidays. Loretta talked about the work that the Carter Blood Care Centers do in our area to make sure we have an ample blood supply and to educate the public on the need for blood donors.
