Issues Covered: Health, Economy, Education and Transportation

Guests: Joy Donavan Brandon with the American Cancer Society, Dr. Vihn Trang with Texas Oncology and Sandra Aguilar a breast cancer survivor.

Topic: It is the first Sunday of October and since October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month I was joined by Joy Donavan Brandon with the American Cancer Society and by Dr. Vihn Trang with Texas Oncology and Sandra Aguilar a breast cancer survivor who shared her own personal journey with us. We talked about the upcoming Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk that will take place October 27th in Dallas and the services and programs offered by the American Cancer Society for those who have been diagnosed as well as signs and symptoms that women and men should be on the lookout for. We talked about research and the impact the disease has on the family as a whole. We talked about the economic impact of chronic illnesses and the health care system.

October 14, 2018

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Education and Learning Differences and Child Abuse Prevention

Guests: Suzanne Stell the Executive Director of the Shelton School and Jacob Eckart a student from Shelton who has dyslexia and Lynn McLean the CEO of the Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County and Al Eli with Harley Davidson Financial Services.

Topic: October is Learning Differences Awareness Month and Suzanne joined me to talk about how Shelton leads the way nationally in helping students with learning differences from dyslexia to ADHD. She talked about the research that goes on at the lab at the school to find new ways of teaching students with learning differences and Jacob Eckart talked about dealing with dyslexia, when he was diagnosed and how it has impacted her life. Suzanne talked about community outreach programs that Shelton has to help parents teach their kids if they don't go to Shelton and we talked about what all parents should know about

signs of learning differences and the importance of early intervention so that students don't fall behind or begin to show signs of mental health issues because they feel less than when the truth is they just learn differently. Lynn McLean the CEO of the Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County and Al Eli with Harley Davidson Financial Services joined me for the second segment of the program to talk about upcoming Teddy Bear Ride that will benefit the Advocacy Center and their work with abused and neglected kids in Collin County. The ride will take place on Sunday, October 28th and Harley Davidson is the chief sponsor of the ride. Lynn talked about signs of abuse and the services and programs offered by the Advocacy Center to help children in our area.

October 21, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime Prevention, Economic Issues, and Domestic Violence Awareness

Guest: Paige Flink the Executive Director of the Family Place .

Topic: October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Paige joined me to talk about what we should all know about family violence the signs to be on the lookout for and the impact that this problem has on families and on our community. Paige talked about the work that the Family Place does to raise awareness about the issue of domestic violence but also to help the victims and their families. We talked about safety planning, the abuse hotline and ways to help those who are being abused. We also talked about the Partners Card campaign which will raise funds for the Family Place's services and programs including their transitional living and emergency shelters. The show comes on the heels of the death of former Real Housewives of Dallas guest star Donna Alexander who was murdered by her ex-boyfriend earlier this month. He reportedly had abused her for years and had inspired her to become an advocate for those impacted by domestic violence.

October 28, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health, Education and Economic Issues

Guests: Dr. Victoria Manax Rutson the Chief Medical Officer for the Pancreatic Cancer Network and Kenny Anet a pancreatic cancer survivor.

Topic: The mid-term elections are coming up on Tuesday November 6th and once again the issue of healthcare is front and center for a lot of voters. Health care costs continue to soar and treatment can sometimes put a huge financial burden on families. Today the focus was on one of the deadliest forms of cancer, a cancer that this summer claimed the life of the legendary singer Aretha Franklin. Dr. Victoria Manax Rutson and Kenny Anet joined me to talk about the work that the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is doing to help those impacted by the disease like Kenny and also their work raising awareness and raising research dollars. We also promoted the upcoming Purple Stride DFW Walk that will benefit the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network. The event will take place on Saturday, November 10th at Klyde Warren Park in Dallas.

November 4, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program I Heart Media National Program on Diabetes Awareness

November 11, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Veterans Issues and Military Support and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues

Guests: Nekima Horton with the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas and Tamara Gibbs a navy veteran.

Topic: Today is Veteran's Day, a time to honor our nation's veterans and their families for the sacrifices they have made on our country's behalf. Nekima Horton and Tamara Gibbs joined me to talk about the Veterans Coalition of North Central Texas and their services and programs to help our veterans adapt to their new normal when they return with job opportunities, mentoring opportunities, mental health programs, housing and any need a veteran may encounter. We promoted the upcoming Thanksgiving for Veterans and we talked about ways to help veterans and their families not just on Veteran's Day or during the holidays but year round. Tamara Gibb shared her own personal struggles with depression and how Operation Healthy Reunions has helped her and her family.

November 18, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Animal Rights and Education.

Guests: Anna Kurian with the North Texas Food Bank and Al James the Executive Director of the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas and Chastity Saunders a woman with a form of psoriatic arthritis.

Topic: The holidays are a time when we all try to give back to the community and one way to give back is to help out the North Texas Food Bank with canned food drives or online donations. Anna Kurian talked about the work that the North Texas Food Bank does to help feed the hungry in our area and the vast number of services and programs aimed at helping the most vulnerable from children to senior citizens. For the second segment of the program I was joined by Al James with the Arthritis Foundation of North Texas and Chastity Saunders who has psoriatic arthritis. Al talked about the work that the Arthritis Foundation does to help those impacted by the disease and Chastity shared her own story of living with a painful form of arthritis. We talked about the different types of arthritis, what to be on the lookout for, research and we promoted the upcoming Jingle Bell Run/Walk which will benefit the Arthritis Foundation. There will be an event in Fort Worth on December 1st and in Frisco on December 2nd. The event raises awareness and raises funds for programs and most importantly for research.

November 25, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues

Guests: Major John Rich and Major Babara Rich the Co-Commanders of the Salvation Army DFW.

Topic: Majors John and Barbara Rich with the Salvation Army DFW joined me to talk about the issue of helping the needy this holiday season and why the programs offered by the Salvation Army are important and how they help people get back on their feet. With the holidays right around the corner the Salvation Army has kicked off their biggest fundraisers of the year including the Red Kettle campaign which asks people to donate their change to help the needy and the Angel Tree program which provides holiday gifts for needy kids. We talked about the many programs offered by the Salvation Army throughout the year not just during the holidays that help young people, veterans, the poor and homeless and senior citizens and we also talked about the need this year for volunteers to help out at Red Kettle sites around the area. The economy is booming and so the Salvation Army is finding it hard to man the Red Kettle sites this year and so they are asking for people to volunteer their time for one day leading up to Christmas.

December 16, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Community Involvement and Economy and Health Issue.

Guests: Tammy Richards the President of Volunteer Now and Cliff Ackerman with Be The Match.

Topic: It's almost Christmas and as we all search for the perfect gift today we focused on giving the gift of your time through volunteering in your community and also on the gift of life by becoming a registered Blood Marrow donor. Tammy Richards joined me for the first segment of the program to talk about Volunteer Now and how they match up volunteers with nonprofits in our community. With the recent passing of former President George H.W. Bush the founder of A Thousand Points of Lights Foundation which promotes volunteerism I thought it was important to highlight how volunteering helps communities Tammy Richards joined me to talk about the need for volunteers and the impact that volunteer hours have on our community. We talked about all the different ways that people can give back for an hour, a day, or as an ongoing volunteer. For the second segment of the program I was joined by Cliff Ackerman of Be The Match a nonprofit that raises awareness about the need for blood marrow donors to sign up on a national registry. Cliff who received a blood marrow donation that saved his life after he battled leukemia shared his story and the importance of raising awareness about the need for donors and the impact that your involvement can make in saving a life.

December 23, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy and Education and Child Safety.

Guest: Karen Hughes the President and CEO of Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps homeless children in our area.

Topic: Karen Hughes joined me to talk about the upcoming Day 1 Dallas a benefit event that will be held January 1st at Fair Park in Dallas that will raise funds for Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps the youngest victims of poverty in North Texas, homeless

children. Karen talked about all the fun activities that will take place at Day 1 Dallas but also the importance of an event like this to raise awareness about the issue of homeless children since so many people think the homeless are alcoholics or drug addicts and don't think of the youngest victims and their families. Karen talked about the programs that Vogel has in place to help kids from infant to 15 and their families as well so that the parents can get on their feet and break the cycle of poverty. We talked about the importance of early education for homeless children and how the programs offer a mental safety net for the kids so that they can feel safe and loved and not afraid of their financial circumstances or feel less than other kids.

December 30, 2018 Aired 6:15am to 6:45am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Drug and Alcohol Addiction and the Opiod Epidemic, Economic Issues and Justice Reform.

Guests: Kevin Roy the Chief Policy Officer for Shatterproof and Roderick Johnson a Shatterproof Ambassador in Dallas.

Topic: It's the end of the year and one of the top news stories of 2018 was the Opioid Epidemic and it's effects on families and communities. Shatterproof is a national nonprofit that is dedicated to ending the devastation addiction causes families. Kevin Roy joined me on the phone to talk about how Shatterproof began following the death of founder Gary Mendell's son to drug addiction and how Gary felt lost and hopeless in dealing with the tragedy and seeing what other families were going through. Shatterproof works to change policy to better help addicts and their families and they raise awareness about how to help families dealing with addiction. They offer online support and they are advocating with local, state and federal government officials to change the justice system so that our prisons and jails are not serving as rehab facilities but that judges sentence addicts to true rehabs. Shatterproof is also helping families steer clear of facilities that do not offer results based therapies since many rehab centers are now for profit institutions that are bilking customers. Roderick Johnson joined me to share his own personal story of struggling with addiction and his path to recovery and why the work that Shatterproof is doing is making a difference.

KHKS Appearances and Events for non profits

Throughout the year KHKS helps promote morning show host Kidd Kraddick's nonprofit Kidd's Kids. The nonprofit helps send sick kids to Disney World every year.
