November 20, 2021	Climate Change & the Christian Response in Toledo	<p><u>Host:</u> Jenny Burkhiser_</p> <p><u>Guest:</u> Tom Hennigan, Associate Professor of Ecology and Organism Biology, Truett McConnell University (Cleveland, GA). www.truett.edu</p> <p><u>Description:</u> Glaciers melting, sea levels rising, and some say the earth will soon be destroyed due to climate change impacts caused by human beings. Our guest believes Christians should be concerned with planet health as the Bible mandates care for the Earth and the people within it but to do the research. Carbon dioxide, a plant nutrient, has increased by a hundredth of a percent but satellite imagery shows that the planet is greening due to the increase. While ice has melted in the North and South Poles, there are some instances of glacier growth and former forests uncovered. Tom encouraged research of cyclical climate changes through the centuries and access to Biblical earth stewardship resources from the Cornwall Alliance for the Stewardship of Creation.</p>

The man-centered environmentalist perspective believes the Earth is our only home and may create policies that hurt the poor. While some Christians reason the Earth will end anyway, the Biblical mandate to care for God’s Creation is still in place. Christians should care for the Earth, maintain systems wisely, and help people. Christians can enjoy God’s Creation with family and their local church body, reduce use of plastics by bringing cloth and permanent bags to shop and store, create community or church gardens, or organize trash cleanups, always glorifying Christ for His Creation gift.</p>

He talked about his background as a missionary and pastor and how this allowed him to understand firsthand how crucial it is for the Church to gather in prayer for those suffering around the world.</p>

As America emerges, churches across America now face another unique challenge: being relevant in an ever-changing environment that seems increasingly distanced from Christianity. Alistair Begg shared his thoughts on what it means to be God’s people and living it out in daily life can help bring revival throughout America. Candace Gregory gave statistics on the homelessness situation, the causes and how the problem is worsened when people give money to panhandlers rather than local missions that have accountability and oversight for the clients. Candace also shared stories of inspiration about homeless people they have helped and also talked about the importance of sharing the Gospel to these individuals who are in these unfortunate situations.</p> <p>Pastors Joey Tomassoni and David Bempong gave some examples of how their church, <i>Downtown Hope</i>, has provided food pantries and distribution this past year, thus sharing ways the community can show God’s love by reaching out to the poor and homeless. October 4, 2021	Wildfire Recovery Assistance	After wildfires burned through California earlier this year, destroying thousands of homes, a father and daughter are bringing hope to victims with donated RVs! Woody Faircloth and his 9-year-old daughter “Luna” started the nonprofit website, EmergencyRV.org, which fills a gap for victims who often wait months for emergency housing. Recently the father and daughter delivered a 35-foot RV to a volunteer firefighter who lost his home in the Dixie Fire. It was the 95th RV delivered in the past two years.
October 5, 2021	Police Engagement with the Community	A Police Department outside Cleveland ditched its uniforms for jerseys, shorts, and sneakers over the weekend in a mission to get people in the neighborhood more comfortable around them! As confidence in police dropped to 48% last year in Cleveland, Officers Scott Meyer and Vashon Williams say their community basketball tournament is part of an effort to bridge a gap between officers and youth. Police even awarded an \$800 cash prize to the winning team.
October 6, 2021	Strengthening the Veteran Community	Now many of our veterans’ struggle with issues leaving the service, including PTSD, but an event this week is helping our heroes overcome those issues TOGETHER! The <i>War Heroes on Water</i> Fishing Tournament is giving veterans a chance to connect with fellow heroes to build lifelong bonds that will enable them to continue healing from the wounds of combat. With lots of time together on a boat out in the water, the idea is to create a comfortable setting where combat friends can share their experiences. War Heroes on Water is expecting to have their biggest fishing tournament to date, with 100 veterans signed up to fish on a fleet of 40 sport fishing yachts as they have raised over \$1.2 million.
October 8, 2021	Remembering Our Servicewomen	A group of 100 female veterans were given a long overdue “thank you” for their service with a trip to Washington DC! Nonprofits <i>Operation HerStory</i> and <i>Honor Flight Chicago</i> took 93 servicewomen on a trip to the nation's Capital, free of charge, to honor their service. The group, who was escorted by current female service members, toured monuments, and celebrated their service. Even though they served more than two decades ago, the women say the memories of that time are still very real and they’ll never forget the sacrifices made from those who came before them.
October 11, 2021	Giving the Gift of Community Spirit	Christmas came early for a young father who was recently diagnosed with an incurable brain tumor. Matthew Sandbrook, a father of three, was expecting a small gathering to celebrate his last Christmas with

October 13, 2021	Animal Rescue	A Minnesota high schooler with a passion for disabled animals has made giving them mobility her mission. Two years ago, after studying some YouTube tutorials online, 16-year-old “Shaine” took up the challenge of making hand-crafted pet wheelchairs for animals in need. And these mobility devices offer much more than mere creature comfort.... they are changing pets’ lives for the better, and even saving animals that might otherwise be “put down.”
October 15, 2021	Surviving Cancer	There’s nothing like a grandchild’s wedding to help you win that last battle against cancer! When 97-year-old Tennie Ivy was diagnosed with breast cancer last November, she wondered if this was going to be the end for her. But one thing prevented her from quitting – her grandchild’s wedding!
October 18, 2021	Supporting America’s Restaurant Workers	Two brothers made the 3,200-mile trek across America ON FOOT to support restaurant workers stuck at home during the COVID-19 pandemic, hoping to raise money and share their stories along the way! Aiden and Louis Ardine have just completed their five-month walk which started on the Asbury Park boardwalk in New Jersey and ended at the Redwood National Forest outside of San Francisco. They hoped to raise \$30,000 but ended up making \$70,000—which they distributed to the <i>Restaurant Workers’ Community Foundation</i> .
October 20, 2021	Homelessness	Since the start of the year, one Ohio woman has been making bag lunches – dozens at a time before delivering them to people experiencing homelessness. 64-year-old Miranda Heard has made it her life’s calling to give of her time and paychecks in the service of others. Her bags are filled with chips, cookies, and even a special homemade chicken salad. She said, “Normally I do 50, but I had more people so now I’m doing 100! As I see it grow, then I will grow with it.” Ms. Heard has been paying for all the food herself but with limited funds, she can only afford to make the lunches once a month. Although she wishes she could do more, she makes sure to always save up enough to do this since she doesn’t consider her paychecks her own!
October 22, 2021	Youth Literacy	Still bandaged and in her hospital bed, one teacher wanted her students to know how much she cares for them. Just one day after K.D. Meucci had surgery to remove a brain tumor, she hopped on Facebook Live to read her elementary school students a bedtime story. K.D. is a 4th grade teacher at Benjamin Franklin Elementary School in Bethel Park, Pennsylvania. A few years ago, she started a Facebook page called,

October 25, 2021	Childhood Cancer Awareness	Just how far would you walk for your child? A young dad just completed a 1,200-mile trek from Maine to North Carolina over the course of 45 days – and he did it BAREFOOT! Army Major Chris Brannigan’s walk was part of an effort to raise money and awareness for a rare genetic disease with which his 9-year-old daughter, “Hasti,” is diagnosed. He and his wife also operate the charity, Hope for Hasti. Brannigan’s feet are badly blistered, callused, and he suffers some nerve damage, but he said it was all worth it to educate people about the Cornelia de Lange Syndrome. The barefoot walk raised \$125,000.
October 27, 2021	Helping Veterans Regain Mobility	For many of our wounded warriors, regaining mobility can be one of the difficult barriers to overcome. Well, a veteran who was severely injured in Afghanistan is working to change that. Marine veteran Josh Himan teamed up with his occupational therapist and driving rehab specialist to help ALL people with disabilities get back into the driver's seat. Together, they’ve developed the <i>Driver Rehabilitation Center of Excellence</i> (DRCE). Located in Fairfax, Virginia, DRCE will evaluate a driver and help them find auto-adaptive equipment to get them comfortably back on the road.
October 29, 2021	Job Training for Trauma Victims	Life on the street hasn’t been easy for Scott Mitchell. Four years of homelessness and drug use eventually landed him in a Las Vegas prison after stealing a car one cold February day to stay warm. That’s when he decided to make some better choices... one of those choices was signing up for the <i>Chosen for Success</i> job training program. It is a nonprofit that provides four days of job training and other support including “Emotional Intelligence” training, which helps participants deal with past trauma and work through their emotions.
November 1, 2021	School Safety	When a call for help went up at a Louisiana high school plagued by violence, who was there to answer the call? A group of concerned dads! A coalition of fathers stepped up at their local high school in Shreveport after a series of disturbing fights broke out over the course of a week. To help stop the violence, about 40 fathers came together and formed a support group called <i>Dads on Duty</i> . They take turns spending time at the school greeting students in the morning and helping maintain a positive environment for learning, rather than fighting. So far, the effort is working. There hasn't been a single incident on campus since the dads showed up.

It wasn’t the career turn Mike Mason had imagined for himself. November 12, 2021	Animal Welfare	Eleven-year-old “Evan” leads a busy life in the Bronx, but he doesn't let his many interests — or even a pandemic — discourage him from his primary passion: helping socialize adoptable dogs by reading to them regularly. Evan is this year's <i>American Society of People Against Cruelty to Animals</i> ’ “Kid of the” Year because of his efforts at the Animal Care Centers of New York City. Always eager to help animals in need, Evan also creates fun animations of the animals and will even interview them in front of potential adopters so that they get placed in safe and loving homes.

After being released for the crime of drug trafficking, Hector Guadalupe had trouble finding a job on the outside because of his past. But thanks to his passion for fitness, he eventually prevailed making name for himself in the New York fitness scene... now he devotes much of his time helping others do the same. His non-profit, <i>A Second U Foundation</i> , helps formerly incarcerated men and women get certified as personal trainers and build careers in the fitness industry.
November 23, 2021	Animal Companions for Veterans	He spent most of his life serving in the Navy, now this veteran works as a volunteer to connect other veterans with life-long pets. Veteran Tom Lennon spent nearly 30 years in the Navy working as a pilot and a ship’s officer. The 72-year-old now works as a volunteer with <i>Veteran Companion Animal Services</i> , a Central Ohio organization that works with local shelters to pair veterans with a companion dog. Lennon said many of the veterans who apply suffer from PTSD or depression.

December 8, 2021	Developing Food Assistance Networks Amidst COVID	As the COVID pandemic continues, church-run food pantries are determined to adapt and expand. Despite the temperature hovering near freezing in Woodstock, Illinois, over two dozen volunteers brave the cold outside Grace Lutheran Church carrying boxes of groceries as cars drive up to their mobile food pantry. Best of all, they’re doing it with a smile. “If it stays like this all winter,” one volunteer said, “it will be great.” The pandemic has pushed the church to collaborate with other ministries to develop a food assistance network. So, with the help of Northern Illinois Food Bank, they set up an online program. Called <i>My Pantry Express</i> , it allows people to order groceries like fresh produce and staples online and then pick them up at distribution sites.
