## Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this guarter:

- COVID-19: People's lives continue to be affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Many people are still out of their pre-pandemic routines. Staying home with children who are remote learning and continuing to work from home. So many aspects of our lives continue to be a challenge. Tracking the progress of how the Hudson Valley is reacting to the Coronavirus and the ability to get vaccines has been highly important.
- Veterans Assistance: Veterans continue to be a vulnerable population in our community. Getting them the services, they need is a priority for many organizations in the Hudson Valley region. The COVID-19 pandemic has had a direct effect on our local veterans. It has led to some becoming unemployed which has caused increases in isolation and financial insecurity. Making people aware of help that is available in our community continues to be a necessity.
- Environmental Awareness: The Hudson Valley region is an area well used by its resident and visiting population. This year there have been many topics that have become news worthy due to environmental concerns. Wildlife management, weather patterns, restatement of the Bring Your Our Bag Act along with other concerns have put our local environment front and center.
- Local Economy: This quarter the local economy was directly affected by the COVID-19
   Pandemic. Unemployment in the Hudson Valley remains an issue. Business closures and people
   working from home caused spending habits to change resulting in a shift in the local economy.
   Many people are experiencing personal economic hardships. New York's restricted opening has
   had a direct effect on local business and dollars.
- Youth Education and Development: The Hudson Valley is an area with a growing youth
  population. Programs that help educate and improve our local youth are becoming more
  important for not just for the younger population but also for youth relations in the community.
