### Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- COVID-19: People's lives continue to be affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Many people are still out of their pre-pandemic routines. Also access to the vaccine became an important issue this quarter. So many aspects of our lives continue to be a challenge. Tracking the progress of how the Hudson Valley is reacting to the Coronavirus and the ability to get vaccines has been highly important.
- Veterans Assistance: Veterans continue to be a vulnerable population in our
  community. Getting them the services, they need is a priority for many organizations in
  the Hudson Valley region. The COVID-19 pandemic is still having a direct effect on our
  local veterans. It has led to some becoming unemployed which has caused increases in
  isolation and financial insecurity. Making people aware of help that is available in our
  community continues to be a necessity.
- Environmental Awareness: The Hudson Valley region is an area well used by its resident and visiting population. This year there have been many topics that have become news worthy due to environmental concerns. Wildlife management, weather patterns, restatement of the Bring Your Our Bag Act plus the Leave No Trace policy along with other concerns have put our local environment front and center.
- Local Economy: This quarter the local economy was still being directly affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic. Unemployment in the Hudson Valley remains an issue. Business closures and people working from home caused spending habits to change resulting in a shift in the local economy. Many people are experiencing personal economic hardships. New York's restricted opening has had a direct effect on local business and dollars.
- Local and State Legislation: Over the last quarter there were many programs and legislations introduced and adopted at both the state and local level in New York. We focused a few shows on some of the policies that had a direct effect on residence of the Hudson Valley region. Shows included affordable internet, having blood available with Air Paramedics and LBGTQ rights.
