Lt Colasso outlined potential citations, Nick Rotando outlined what is needed to make golf cart "street legal": headlights, taillights, windshield, mirrors plus DMV Registration, insurance & VIN #. Stressed the dangers of sometimes fatal golf cart/motor vehicle accidents.

Described effort to create Highwaymen license plates to help preserve their history.
