Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Dangerous Tik Tok Trends. In 2021, Albany schools warned parents about the "devious lick" trend which challenged students to steal or damage school items and post the video of it online. In 2022, the "shooting" trend people were being shot by pellet guns. For 2023, there have been several Tik Tok trends involving home cleaning product/chemicals resulting in accidental poisoning.
- B. **Healthcare.** We focused on awareness/information and services for health and well-being and education on including stroke, fetal alcohol spectrum disorder, ovarian cancer, and Alzheimer's.
- C. **Veterans Services.** There are approximately 700,000 Veterans living in New York State. Locally, there are several organizations who provide services and support to our Veterans and their families to help adjust to life after service.
- D. **Mental Health.** According to the CDC, youth and young adults, ages 10-24, make up 15% of all suicides. Those numbers have increased more than 50% over the past three years. Always a serious issue in our community, we focused on addressing mental health and support and suicide awareness.
- E. **Blood Donations.** Donors of all blood types are urgently needed. Albany High School is doing its part to overcome the critical blood shortage by hosting a blood donation drive in the school during September.

Section II. Responsive Programs

Capital Region Sunday is a public affairs program where we address issues of local concern. This program airs every Sunday morning at 6am on WGNA, WTMM, WQBK, WQSH and WPBZ and at 7am on WQBK-HD2.
