July

5- 3:30PM (60 MIN) Erin Thompson of Social Security addressed spousal benefits. Including several scenarios, and multiple questions from listeners were answered, helping listeners to understand their benefits as they reach retirement age.

24- 8:10am (40 MIN) Pastor Bill Henderson from L.E.A.D. Community Church discussed the outreach and support they are planning, specifically to East Toledo. He invited listeners to join them as they are planning and identifying needs in that community.
