Impact of delayed crabbing season	Coast week public affairs program	1/14/18	5:30am	10 min	Program covers reasons for delayed opening and the impact on the local economy likely if the season were to be closed several more weeks beyond the normal opening

String Of Arson Caused Fires	Coast week Public Affairs program	1/21/18	5:30am	10 min	Station covered townhall called by local authorities to share information on a number of possibly related fires intentionally set at homes in an east Astoria neighborhood
Oil spill on Columbia	Coast week Public affairs program	1/28/18	5:30am	10 min	Program covered details on discovery of a fuel oil spill at property near the Port of Astoria central waterfront docks and the multiple agency response to contain the spill and pinpoint the source.

County Jail replacement strategy	Coast week public affairs program	2/11/18	5:30am	10 min	Program covers discussion of a new strategy to replace the Clatsop County Jail with a new facility that would reuse the now closed Oregon Youth Authority Detention Center in Warrenton.
