ISSUES OF CONCERN TO SAN FRANCISCO, CA 4th QUARTER 2023

- 1. Health/Fitness: Information about exercise, diet, treatment and prevention of disease, including health issues relating particularly to women.
- 2. Family Matters: Information and advice about issues and concerns of the family, balancing work and family life, relationships between parents and children, siblings, and grandparents, dealing with divorce.
- 3. Mental Health: Education about topics relating to mental health and wellbeing.
- 4. Children's/Teens Health and Safety: Information and advice for parents and caregivers about health and safety issues relating to children and teens.
- 5. Drugs/Addiction: Discussion of drug dealing and drug use, information about stop-smoking techniques and treatment facilities.
- 6. Public Safety: Information on ways to make the community safer by choosing the correct car seat for children to protect and prevent injuries or fatalities if car accidents occur.
- 7. Religion/Faith: Discussion of matters of faith, Christianity, and core beliefs.
- 8. Community: Raising awareness about the benefits of community involvement and about city issues, programs and services.

Examples of programs addressing some of these issues are provided on the following pages, as well programs about many other subjects of interest to viewers, including cooking and nutrition and a variety of lifestyle issues, among others.

Uptown Church

Family Matters & Religion
