Issues/Program List – 2nd Quarter 2012

The 1st Consolidated Fire District Continued to wrestle with pressure from residents in their district on why they had suspended Chief Clint Canterbury with little explanation and no resolution to what actions would be taken to replace him as chief.

Several meetings were held and attended by TV-22 in order to keep the public informed of the issue. Coverage continued until a resolution was found, which was no further action against chief Clint Canterbury and his reinstatement as fire chief.

Law enforcement, the lack of funding, and how to restore those departments were still of major concern to residents around the area. It was at this time the City of Marion now considered an increase in taxes to its residents in the form of a 0.25% income tax increase to fund police and fire services.

Tv-22 outlined the various plans and covered meetings of city council to keep viewers up-to-date on where the issue stood and what it might mean.

Increases were not the only changes residents were concerned about in Marion. The city council also voted to make changes to their income tax code which both cut the tax credit in half for those living in the city, but working elsewhere from 100% to 50% to generate extra revenue.

The city also implemented a mandatory income tax filing for those who live and work in the city.

TV-22 provided programming and news coverage on these issues, allowing for officials to explain their positions and explain the changes to residents.

All Other public interest and public service announcement material was handled on a “per-case” basis and handled appropriately within in means of this TV station.
