Using hidden cameras, "What Would You Do?" establishes everyday scenarios and then captures people's reactions. Whether people are compelled to act or mind their own business, John Quiñones reports on their split-second and often surprising decision-making process.

Friday, May 23, 2014 (*Season Premiere*)

- **Racial Profiling While Shopping:** Will anyone shopping at an upscale clothing store come to the defense of an African American man wearing a hooded sweatshirt who is being scrutinized by a salesperson and a security guard simply because of the color of his skin and his attire? "Shark Tank" star and entrepreneur Daymond John plays the role of the hooded-sweatshirt-wearing man.
- **Boating Under the Influence:** While dining at a dockside restaurant, a clearly intoxicated couple talks about how they are going to spend the rest of the day cruising around the bay. They eventually pay their bill and head back toward their boat with their child. Will anyone step in and stop them from boating under the influence – with a child? (OAD: 5/31/13)
- **Gay Athletes:** Just this month the first openly gay football player was drafted by an NFL team. But what will happen when a teenage basketball player is with his teammates getting a pair of sneakers in the store when he decides to come out to them? His teammates express anger and disgust. Will anyone in the store come to the gay athlete's defense? What will happen if it is his coach expressing negative thoughts? (update of a scenario that originally aired 6/7/13)
- **Hungry Diner:** A restaurant customer eats food from the plate of someone at another table when they step away. Will any of the other customers say anything? (OAD: 12/3/13)
- **Homeless New Orleans:** The devastating impact of Hurricane Katrina nearly quadrupled the New Orleans homeless population - almost a decade later, the numbers are still double pre-Katrina levels. A homeless man is brought into a bar/restaurant by a good Samaritan, and given \$20 for anything he'd like to eat. When the Samaritan leaves, however, the bartender decides he can't have a homeless person sitting and eating next to other customers. As he berates and eventually asks our homeless man to leave, will anyone stand up and defend him?

Traveling down the Mississippi...John Quiñones reports

- A white female hairstylist begins flirting with her white male customer. But when his black girlfriend walks in to meet him, the white hairstylist can't stop herself from voicing her displeasure that he's with a black girl. Will anyone else at the hair salon speak up? And whose side will they take?
- What will patrons do when confronted with Memphis's most absent-minded and incompetent waiter?
- How will people at a restaurant react to a gay couple engaging in a public display of affection? What will reactions be when the couple is straight?
- In broad daylight, a thief approaches an unlocked car, reaches in and begins stealing everything he can grab. Will anyone confront him on his blatant attempt at stealing? We try it with a black thief, and then a white thief. What happens?
- There is no shortage of psychics in New Orleans willing to offer advice and details about the future. But sometimes those details come at a very hefty price. What will bystanders do when they witness "What Would You Do's" fake psychic asking for more and more money for a forecast of the future that might best be described as "cloudy?"

- While checking out at a supermarket, a man, pretending to be in a hurry, asks to cut to the front of the line. But when he is crowned the five millionth customer total and told he will receive a free Hawaii trip, how will the customer he cut react?
- Does anyone speak up when someone is intentionally embarrassed in public? "What Would You Do?" is behind the scenes at "The Bethenny Show" as a security guard searches audience handbags before they can enter the show taping. But when the guard starts pulling out personal, intimate products from one woman's bag, making comments, will anyone else in the line stand up for the embarrassed audience member?
- What would you do if you witnessed two college kids spike a girl's drink? Will anyone in the bar take a stand?
- When a fed-up mother leaves her young child outside the restaurant on "time out" because the kid has been misbehaving, will anyone intervene? (OAD: 12/3/13)
- A lady getting a pedicure is talking to a friend on her phone when she realizes the woman performing the service speaks very little English. The customer starts making derogatory comments about the nail technician to the person she is on the phone with. Will any fellow customers confront the rude lady about her behavior? (OAD: 6/7/13)

Obese customers are heckled and harassed at a buffet just because they are overweight. As other customers watch what is happening, will they step in to help and/or defend the overweight customers?

She's sweating, her mascara is running, and she looks completely distraught, explaining she is having cold feet and does not know if she can spend the rest of her life with her fiancée – and that she's supposed to be at the altar in 15 minutes. Will complete strangers give advice? What if it's the groom having cold feet? (OAD: 5/31/13)

Friday, June 20, 2014

- When a man tries to weasel his way out of paying off a big bet made while shooting pool, will witnesses make him stick to his word?
- What happens when a young man is told that he shouldn't be buying clothes at a Newark, New Jersey fashion boutique specializing in urban wear — just because he's white? Will fellow shoppers intervene?
- You can order just about anything off the Internet: food, clothes, and now even a used pregnancy test. What will happen when fellow diners first overhear a female actor buying a positive test from a pregnant woman — and then see our actress show it to her boyfriend in the hopes it will force him to propose? (OAD: 12/3/13)
- A street musician is playing his guitar and singing songs on a crowded seaside pier. Only he is not your typical singer/songwriter. Instead, he makes his living insulting people, making fun of people listening to the show. When his tunes hit a sour note and the ballad becomes bullying, will anyone tell him the show's over? (OAD: 5/31/13)
- A belligerent restaurant manager tells his verbally and financially abused busboy he has no right to complain because he could get fired — or even deported. Will any diners intervene to tell the manager he's now crossed the border between right and wrong? (OAD: 12/10/13)

Friday, June 27, 2014

- The average cost of a wedding is over \$28,000 and the wedding dress can be a big piece of that pie. What will happen when a bride-to-be and her bridesmaids spill red wine on a dress at a bridal store?
- Often times, people give waiters and bartenders their credit cards when they want to open a tab or when it's time to pay the bill... and frequently, those cards are out of the customer's sight for a few minutes. But it only takes a few seconds for a criminal to steal the information that will allow them to hack into the credit card account and make purchases, using a credit card skimmer. "What Would You Do?" is at a bar when a thief uses a credit card skimmer to steal the customer's credit card information. Will people stop him? Will they tell the customer?
- Recently a pre-school teacher was accused of putting sedatives in the sippy cups of toddlers. So what would happen when a nanny, out to lunch with a toddler-aged child who is running around and misbehaving, threatens to, and then gives the child what looks like medicine to calm him down? Will anyone approach the nanny? (OAD: 6/14/13)
