SUMMIT COUNTY COURTHOUSE JUDGE THOMAS TEODOSIO RULED LAST APRIL THAT CERTAIN REGULATIONS, INCLUDING REQUIRING A POLICE OFFICER TO BE PRESENT FOR EACH SPEED ENFORCEMENT CAMERA IS UNCONSTITUTIONAL. AND AS A RESULT, WHEN THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR BEGAN IN AUGUST, THE CITY OF AKRON ROLLED OUT IT'S PORTABLE CAMERAS, ROTATING THEM BACK THROUGH SCHOOL ZONES TO CATCH SPEEDERS.

THE STATE, HOWEVER, APPEALED THAT RULING, AND IN DECEMBER THE 9TH DISTRICT COURT OF APPEALS REVERSED HIS DECISION UNTIL JUDGE TEODOSIO COULD GIVE THEM A BETTER REASON FOR WHY HE RULED AS HE DID.

JUDGE TEODOSIO EXPECTED TO ISSUE HIS NEWEST DECISION SOMETIME IN THE NEXT WEEK. THE CITY DOES STAND TO LOSE STATE MONEY IN THE MEANTIME IF THEY USE THE CAMERAS, SO THIS HAS LITERALLY NOW BECOME A WEEK-TO WEEK MATTER, AND NEXT WEEK THE CAMERAS COULD BE BACK IN SCHOOL ZONES.

THERE ARE SEVERAL NEW 'LAWS' TAKING EFFECT HERE IN OHIO THIS NEW YEAR.

YOU COULD FACE POTENTIAL FINES.

DO YOUR CHILDREN SUFFER FROM ASTHMA? H-B 39, WHICH TAKES EFFECT ON FEBRUARY 1ST, REQUIRES SCHOOLS AND CAMPS TO KEEP SUPPLIES OF ASTHMA INHALERS ON HAND FOR USE IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.

WHEN YOU GO TO FILE YOUR STATE TAX RETURNS ONLINE, YOU MAY STILL HAVE TO VERIFY YOUR IDENTITY, VIA 'QUIZ QUESTIONS'. LAWMAKERS WANTED TO LIMIT HOW THOSE QUESTIONS WERE ASKED, BUT GOVERNOR KASICH VETOED THE WORDING.

COMMERCIAL EXCAVATORS, UTILITY OPERATORS, DESIGNERS AND DEVELOPERS WILL HAVE TO CHECK FOR UNDERGROUND UTILITIES BEFORE THEY DIG. A NEW UNDERGROUND PROTECTION LAW HAS VIOLATIONS OF UP TO 25 HUNDRED IN FINES FOR A FAILURE TO DO SO. 'BAN THE BOX' ... MEANS PUBLIC AGENCIES WILL NOT LONGER BE ALLOWED TO ASK JOB-SEEKERS ABOUT PAST FELONY CONVICTIONS AS PART OF WRITTEN EMPLOYMENT APPLICATIONS.

DOCTORS WILL BE ALLOWED TO PROVIDE PRESCRIPTION MEDICINES FOR THE TREATMENT OF CERTAIN SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASE 'WITHOUT' EXAMINING THE INTENDED RECIPIENTS. H-B 124 ALLOWS THE DRUGS TO BE ISSUED TO THOSE DIAGNOSED WITH CHLAMYDIA OR GONORRHEA TO GIVE TO UP TO TWO SEXUAL PARTNERS.

LASTLY, THANKS TO S-B 10, STATE OFFICIALS WILL NOW BE REQUIRED TO DETERMINE WHETHER VETERANS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ADDITIONAL HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE.
