Severe Weather: Coverage of Dec. 23rd blizzard and subsequent snow alert for the city of Huron on Dec. 24th.

City: Reported on mask mandate for city of Huron

Public health: Reported on plan to continue operations of the Beadle County COVID 19 testing site and call center through the end of the year and into 2021.

Politics: Reported on results of Nov. 3rd elections including races for president, U.S. House and Senate, and state house.

Healthcare: Air Well One Connection, featuring interviews with healthcare professional, each Monday at 10am.

Philanthropy: Reported on 2020 United Way Heartland Region campaign goal progress.

Oct. 8th Made public aware of a free grant webinar hosted by Greater Huron Development Corporation on October 9th. The purpose of the webinar was to review the details of the SD CARES Small Business & Nonprofit Grant Program. The SD legislature passed funding authority for the Governor's proposed Small Business Grant Program in a Special Session on October 5. This program provided direct grants to businesses and nonprofits negatively impacted by COVID-19.

Investigators ruled that the fire was accidental in nature.
