I shared health news that the BA.2 sub variant has more than doubled in the U.S. over two weeks and will become the dominant variant in the country. The BA.2 sub variant has been referred to as stealth Omicron because it contains genetic mutations that can make it harder to distinguish from the Delta variant using PCR tests compared to the original Omicron variant. That means that while the test can detect a BA.2 infection, it looks like it is the Delta variant instead.

#### US SUPREME COURT DENIED DISABILITY BENEFITS TO RESIDENTS OF PUERTO RICO

I shared news that the US Supreme court denied disability benefits to residents of Puerto Rico. By an 8-1 ruling, the court said Congress can deny Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits to residents of Puerto Rico (even though they are U.S. citizens) because they don't pay all federal taxes. The ruling was also indirectly tied to a series of Supreme court opinions in 1901 known as the Insular Cases that held, among other things, that citizens of certain Americanheld territories were not entitled to all rights of citizenship.

## FLORIDA'S RED FLAG LAW CHAMPIONED BY REPUBLICANS IS TAKING GUNS FROM THOUSANDS

I shared political news that the Florida 13th Circuit Court Judge Denise Pomponio decides who in Hillsborough County can no longer be trusted with a gun and in just the last two months, she has taken away the firearm privileges of dozens of people. This is Florida's "red flag" law in action. Passed in the wake of the horrific 2018 mass shooting at a Parkland high school, the state law provides police a path to ask a judge to temporarily bar dangerous individuals from possessing or purchasing a firearm. Since its creation, Florida judges have acted more than 8,000 times to keep guns out of the hands of people

In the gun buyback which followed, owners were paid \$146 million in compensation for returned firearms, parts and ammunition.

#### **DEKALB FIRE URGES BEING PREPARED FOR SUMMER HEAT**

I announced for Dekalb extremely hot and humid weather is forecasted, which may increase the risk of heat-related stress and illness when heat pushes the human body beyond its limits. In extreme heat and high humidity, perspiration evaporation slows, causing the body to work extra hard to maintain a normal temperature. Most victims of heat-related illnesses have been overexposed to indoor or outdoor heat or have over-exerted themselves for their age and physical condition. Individuals who are very young, elderly, ill, overweight, or participating in strenuous outdoor activities are most at risk for succumbing to extreme heat.
