Stuck hundreds of feet from shore on a mostly frozen lake, witnesses quickly grew concerned about the deer. Officials attached a safety rope to a man and sent him about 500 feet onto the ice, which was about 2-3 inches thick. The ice did not break through during the rescue, and the deer was successfully rescued to shore and set free.

The latest reports is that one of them is an adult female. Police at this time are not releasing the identities or ages of the other two victims. Autopsies are likely to gather more information. The deaths have been labeled as "suspicious."
