Section I. Issues

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Crime/Public Safety:** Recent thefts, robberies, drug crimes, and violent crimes affecting the Magic Valley with police seeking the public's help in catching the suspects.
- B. Military:** Information updates about a local soldier and his upcoming military trial and other military and veteran information.
- C. Highway/Utility Repairs:** The status of highway, freeway, and utility repairs and improvements in our areas, including bridges. Utility repairs may affect customers and/or affect traffic patterns.
- D. Traffic Accidents:** Increase number of traffic accidents as the community heads into the summer, including road closures due to accidents, causes, and possible preventions to avoid injury and/or death.
- E. Education:** Issues relating to public school education in our community.
- F. Growth:** New businesses opening in the Magic Valley.
- G. Politics:** Local politics affecting the public and voter information for the March presidential primaries and democratic caucus; statewide politics relating to Idaho's legislative session; national politics affecting rights to citizens.
- H. Fish and Game:** Seasonal road closures by Idaho Fish and Game due to migration, fish stocked in local waters, and Fish and Game phone scam warning.
- I. Local Commendations:** Local citizens have made positive impacts in their community.
- J. Medical/Fire/Emergency Services:** Local medical issues affecting the public and animals, such as influenza outbreaks (humans, parvo outbreaks (animals), change in hospital procedures, and hospital happenings, plus fire information for the area, residential and/or wildfires affecting the public.
- K. Community Events:** Local non-profit organizations and the College of Southern Idaho frequently place public service announcements on our station. These events are fundraising events, free to the public, or an event that raises awareness for the community.
- L. Consumer Recalls/Information:** Issues relating to consumer product recalls and other information on products that may affect the community.
- M. National News:** National news stories which directly and indirectly affect the community.

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station broadcasts news and public announcements with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

A. Crime/Public Safety:

News Report April 1, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Twin Falls BASE jumper Miles Daisher was arrested Thursday in southern Georgia after a fellow jumper died earlier that morning. Brandon Jackson, a retired master sergeant of the Army, died in a jump from a 2,000-foot television tower near the unincorporated town of Metcalf. Daisher and Tom Baker from North Carolina were charged with criminal trespassing and each released on \$550 bond.

News Report April 1, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Magistrate Judge Daniel Dolan ruled yesterday that by accelerating through the intersection and driving a car she knew might have faulty brakes, there is enough evidence to prove Cynthia Martinez should stand trial for felony vehicular manslaughter. Martinez is accused of causing the crash in July of last year at 300 West and Bob Barton Road that killed 19-year-old Alec Humbach. Martinez is scheduled to appear for a district court arraignment April 18th. If convicted, she faces up to 10 years in prison and a fine up to \$10,000.

News Report April 4, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Jason Ivey, of Hazelton, who fled police in February while on probation for brandishing a knife at his mother and kicking sheriff's deputies has pleaded guilty to a new felony and will be sentenced today. Ivey was wanted for violating his parole when he ran from Jerome County Sheriff's deputies Feb. 28th and led them on a two-hour chase in a stolen truck and on foot before finally surrendering. He was charged with three felonies stemming from the chase, including eluding police, grand theft and operating a vehicle without the owner's consent.

Miguel Alarcon, of Jerome, who pleaded guilty to leading a high-speed chase from Jerome to Wendell and brandishing a shotgun during a January argument at a Jerome grocery store is wanted after he stopped showing up to court-ordered drug classes and missed a court appearance. A no-bond warrant was issued Tuesday for after he failed to appear for a status conference Monday in Jerome District Court.

News Report April 4, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Abraham Cervantes, of Hazelton, who is accused of leaving the scene of a crash that killed his passenger, Ricardo Lopez, now has a trial date after a district judge rejected a sentencing agreement for being too light. Cervantes was originally charged with vehicular manslaughter from the February 2nd 2015 accident. A jury trial is scheduled for July 6th, and Cervantes is next due in court June 27th for a pretrial conference.

News Report April 4, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Michael Kellis, of Jerome, accused of molesting a young girl over several years is set for sentencing today. Kellis pleaded guilty earlier this year to a felony count of injury to a child after originally being charged with two counts of lewd conduct with a minor. He faces one to 10 years in prison. Kellis signed a plea deal in January in which he agreed to pay a \$2,500 fine and victim restitution.

News Report April 5, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Joshua White, of Twin Falls, who was released from prison Wednesday, was stopped by police the next day on suspicion of drunken driving. Reports say, White allegedly admitted to drinking rubbing alcohol, tried to bribe and officer, threatened an officer, and spit in another officer's face. White was arraigned Monday in Twin Falls County Magistrate Court on a felony count of bribery in official matters and misdemeanor counts of battery on an officer, assault on an officer and driving under the influence.

News Report April 5, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Christina and Reymundo Lara have been charged with felonies after allegedly using “a large bat-like object” to hit a man who came to their Burley home to collect a debt on March 18th. Christina is charged with felony aggravated assault with a deadly weapon without the intent to kill and aggravated battery with the use of a weapon. Reymundo is charged with felony aggravated battery with the use of a deadly weapon. They each waived preliminary hearings Friday and no hearings are scheduled in either case.

News Report April 5, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

James Kassner, of Twin Falls, was charged with grand theft after allegedly stealing and pawning items from the College of Southern Idaho automotive program. Charges were filed on March 9th, from alleged thefts between Oct. 16th and Dec. 11th. Through the course of the investigation, Twin Falls police found several items belonging to the CSI automotive program that had allegedly been pawned at different pawn stores across the Magic Valley. The value of the items allegedly stolen from the CSI program was about \$9,500.

A resident of the Fawnbrook Apartments was found dead in his apartment yesterday but according to reports, police do not suspect foul play. The man’s name has not been released pending notification of next of kin. Reports say that it appears an accident occurred involving an oxygen tank and a cigarette. An autopsy was scheduled for later today in Boise.

News Report April 5, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

In Twin Falls County more and more people are dumping trash in canal beds. Not only is dumping anywhere in the county a misdemeanor, but trash in the canal becomes a safety hazard for workers and others. Most of the economy in the Magic Valley relies on canal water. Canal company workers are preparing the canals for the season and ask everyone to dump your trash in designated trash sites.

News Report April 6, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Kugar Parrott, of Twin Falls, who led police on a pursuit, in January, that ended with a rollover crash in downtown was sentenced to five years in prison but could serve only a year if he successfully completes an educational and therapeutic prison program. Parrott pleaded guilty in February to felony counts of eluding police and theft by possession of a stolen vehicle, and a misdemeanor count of leaving the scene of an accident. Parrott’s passenger, Lawrence Johnson, pleaded guilty yesterday to a felony count of possession of a controlled substance.

News Report April 6, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

According to reports, the Twin Falls County Coroner has announced that the man found dead in his apartment at Fawnbrook Apartments on Monday died of flame inhalation some time Sunday evening or Monday morning. Herbert Campbell, of Twin Falls, has been identified as the victim. Evidence showed Campbell was smoking a cigarette and using an oxygen tank, which sparked flames that he breathed in and burned his esophagus.

News Report April 7, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Charges against Ronnie Kincaid III, who has been accused of being an accomplice in the murder of his stepmother, will be dropped. The teen was charged with accessory to murder and concealing or

destroying evidence after police say he helped his father wash blood and DNA evidence from Melissa Kincaid's body. A trial was set to begin Monday. According to reports, Cassia County Prosecuting Attorney Doug Abenroth said in a statement that a judge was unwilling to delay the trial, so he dropped the charges and plans to refile the case at a later date.

News Report April 7, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Clayton Garro, who was charged with fracturing a three-month-old baby's eye socket, causing her brain to bleed, is headed to an educational and therapeutic prison program. Garro was sentenced Tuesday in Cassia County District Court for felony injury to a child and could serve up to eight years in prison if he performs poorly during the program. Garro entered an Alford plea, which means he doesn't admit to all the elements of the charge but acknowledges there's enough evidence to convict him. In a plea advisory form, he admitted to causing the injuries to the child and to failing to report them in a timely manner.

Patrick Jewell, of Jerome pleaded guilty in federal court yesterday to possessing 66 child pornography images on his laptop and cell phone. Jewell faces up to 20 years in prison and a fine up to \$250,000. When his prison term is complete, he'll face up to a lifetime of supervised release and no less than five years of supervision. A sentencing hearing is scheduled for June 28th.

News Report April 11, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Miguel Otaegui of Filer, who, according to reports, police say was hiding drugs, cash and a digital scale in his car Tuesday has been charged with trafficking drugs. Otaegui was arraigned Thursday in Twin Falls County Magistrate Court on a felony count of trafficking in methamphetamine and a misdemeanor count of possession of marijuana. He is being held in Twin Falls County Jail on \$251,000 bond and a preliminary hearing is scheduled for April 15th.

News Report April 11, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Twin Falls Police Chief Craig Kingsbury is requesting the city change its codes regarding transient merchant licenses, in order to address some gaps in the background checks. The proposed changes would allow police to take fingerprints of applicants and submit them to the Idaho State Police Bureau of Criminal Identification. The City Council will review proposed changes at 5 p.m. today in Council Chambers, 305 Third Ave. E.

News Report April 12, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Two Burley men have been arrested following attempted kidnappings yesterday in Cassia County. According to reports, at least two children from White Pine Elementary were approached by the suspects. Melvin Simpson and Vadian Dougal were arrested and charged with attempted kidnapping. They are booked at the Cassia County Jail. The Cassia County Sheriff's Office says if other children were targeted they are encouraged to notify the dispatch center at 878-2251.

News Report April 12, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

According to reports, police and fire officials, in Jerome, are investigating "suspicious circumstances" surrounding an early morning house fire Saturday in north Jerome. Reports say the fire was reported about 12:30 a.m. Saturday in the 900 block of 22nd Avenue East. Nobody was injured, and officials didn't know whether anybody was at the home when the fire started. A woman reported the fire, but it is not known if she was a neighbor or if she lived at the home.

Franklin Echrote, of Twin Falls, has been charged with a felony after wildlife officers said he killed two bull elk and left the meat to waste. Eckrote is scheduled for a preliminary hearing on a felony charge of wasting a trophy elk on April 18th and has already pleaded not guilty to misdemeanor charges of wasting a spike elk and exceeding the bag limit.

Samuel Stewart, of Buhl, was arrested near Jackson's Kountry Korner yesterday after leading police on a high-speed chase. According to reports, the pursuit began in Filer when police clocked Stewart driving at 80mph in a 25mph zone. Stewart allegedly reached speeds of up to 100mph before police arrested him at Jackson's Kountry Korner. Stewart was booked into the Twin Falls County Jail on a felony count of eluding police.

News Report April 12, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Reports say, two masked brothers armed with handguns and upset over a debt owed to their mother invaded a Buhl home in October where they pistol-whipped, robbed and threatened to kill a man. Ricardo Garcia of Jerome and Vicente Borja, of Twin Falls, were arraigned Monday in Twin Falls County Magistrate Court on felony counts of robbery and burglary. Both are scheduled for preliminary hearings April 22nd.

News Report April 13, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Austin Gardner, of Twin Falls, was charged with felony concealment of evidence, eluding a peace officer and possession of a controlled substance after leading an officer on a pursuit Sunday when police tried to pull him over for allegedly running a red light. Gardner was arraigned in Twin Falls County court Monday and his preliminary hearing is set for April 22nd, bond is set at \$15,000.

Mark J. Lee, a Twin Falls insurance provider, has had his license revoked after he reportedly deposited consumer premium payments into his personal account. Reports say, on Monday, police used Tasers to subdue and arrest Jonathon Apodaca when he destroyed the cab of a semitrailer and smashed out the windshield with his head outside Glanbia Foods in Gooding. Law enforcement believes Apodaca was on something that caused his erratic behavior. According to reports, Apodaca was taken to North Canyon Medical Center to be treated for his self-inflicted injuries. Apodaca is facing charges of malicious injury, burglary, battery and resisting arrest.

Edgar Flores, of Twin Falls, pleaded guilty Feb. 29th to a felony count of first-degree stalking and admitted to breaking in to his victim's house multiple times to steal the woman's underwear and pictures of her family. District Judge Richard Bevan sentenced Aguilar on Monday to five years in prison with eligibility for parole after 2 ½ years.

News Report April 14, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

A routine traffic stop, in Twin Falls, took a dangerous turn when Spencer Kemp, of Burley, allegedly swallowed heroin, refused orders to drop a bag, and pushed and kicked two officers. Kemp was

arraigned yesterday in Twin Falls County Magistrate Court on three felony drug charges and two misdemeanor counts of assault or battery on an officer. He was also charged with a felony count of destroying evidence and a misdemeanor count of resisting arrest.

News Report April 14, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Prosecutors will not file charges against a man who may have been the get-away driver during a December robbery at Dick's Pharmacy. Danial Quintana, of Jerome, has pleaded guilty to a felony count of possession of fentanyl, the synthetic opiate that was stolen during the December 14th robbery. But according to terms of a plea agreement on the drug charge, Quintana won't face charges for the robbery.

An attempted kidnapping Monday at a Burley school has the Magic Valley placed Magic Valley schools on high alert, prompting schools to talk with students and re-examine security procedures. School officials are encouraging students and employees — as well as parents and community members — to be extra vigilant and report anything suspicious.

News Report April 15, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

The trial for Keith Blankenship, of Hailey, who is accused of second-degree murder, ended in a mistrial an hour after the first witness took the stand when she accused the defendant of committing another crime. District Judge Jonathan Brody said the accusation was impermissible evidence, created prejudice against the defendant and was "an error or legal defect ... that deprives the defendant of a fair trial." Blankenship must now await a new trial back at the Blaine County Jail, where he's been held since May 2014 when he confessed to killing Steven Romanchuk. He's charged with second-degree murder and felony destruction of evidence.

The president of Idaho State University and the U.S. attorney are speaking out after a rash of home invasions targeted students from the Middle East. ISU President Arthur Vailas is promoting unity after he says nearly 50 international students from Kuwait and Saudi Arabia were burglarized. Pocatello police say no arrests have been made in the burglaries.

News Report April 18, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

The Blaine County murder trial for Keith Blankenship has been rescheduled for September and will likely be moved to a different county. On Thursday, a judge granted a mistrial just hours into the trial when a witness introduced impermissible evidence. The decision of where to move the case will be made by District Judge Jonathan Brody during a May 3rd hearing. A pretrial conference is scheduled for Aug. 16th and the jury trial is set to begin Sep. 13th.

News Report April 18, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Reports say a Twin Falls County Sheriff's deputy came upon a party in Buhl around 2am yesterday morning. ISP, Filer and Buhl police departments assisted in the call where five people were arrested on warrants, eight vehicles were towed, and 21 people were cited for minor consumption of alcohol. One male was airlifted to St. Luke's Magic Valley for medical attention.

News Report April 19, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Prosecutors dismissed a bribery charge against Joshua White, of Twin Falls, because of insufficient evidence. White was reportedly stopped by Twin Falls police on the evening of March 31st on Blue Lakes Boulevard on suspicion of driving under the influence. Reports say a police officer wrote in his report that White admitted to drinking rubbing alcohol and offered him \$1,000 if he would let him go. White allegedly also threatened one of the officers and spit on the other officer. He is still charged with

the three misdemeanors and pretrial conferences are scheduled for May 17th on the assault and battery charges and May 24th on the driving under the influence charge.

On Friday, Twin Falls police went to a home on the 300 block of Jefferson Street to arrest a person with an active warrant and found Tirzo Muro, of Buhl, a convicted felon, at the residence. Muro was allegedly in possession of a handgun, two glass pipes and a crystalline white substance believed to be methamphetamine. He has been charged with felony possession of a controlled substance and one felony count of unlawful possession of a firearm.

News Report April 20, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

A Jerome teen who police say fired three shots at a farmer last month has been charged as an adult with attempted murder and faces up to 30 years in prison. 17-year-old Juan Suarez was arraigned Thursday in Jerome County Magistrate Court on a felony count of attempted murder in the second degree. He faces five to 15 years in prison if convicted, with an additional 15 years that could be tacked on for use of a deadly weapon.

News Report April 20, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

The Idaho Supreme Court suspended Burley attorney David Peña on March 15th for six months after it found he violated multiple conduct codes. His suspension means Jesus Valdez, who pleaded guilty to sexually abusing two boys in Burley and Heyburn, will be sentenced another day. Valdez was to be sentenced at the Cassia County District Court yesterday, and was to be represented by Peña. Judge Michael Crabtree moved the sentencing to May 17th.

News Report April 21, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

The Mini-Cassia Drug Task Force has arrested three people in a methamphetamine sting for allegedly conspiring to traffic a quarter-pound of meth. Julie Marie Dewitt, of Filer, Ozvaldo Ramirez, of Twin Falls, and Doug Nelson, of Pocatello, were arrested Tuesday by law enforcement officers from the Minidoka County Sheriff's Office and the Cassia County Sheriff's Office. All three were charged with conspiracy to traffic methamphetamines and failure to purchase a drug tax stamp.

News Report April 21, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Loyd Wehrli, of Jerome, who turned himself in after being listed as Jerome County's most wanted earlier this month, has been charged with molesting an 11-year-old girl. Wehrli was arraigned Monday in Jerome County Magistrate Court on two felony counts of lewd conduct with a minor under 16 years of age. He is out of custody after posting \$5,000 bond April 5th.

News Report April 21, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

The Ada County Sheriff's Office is investigating the death of Gabino Villa, of Shoshone, who collapsed Sunday night at the Idaho State Correctional Institution in Boise and later died at a hospital. Villa was sentenced last March in Canyon County District Court to five to 20 years in prison for driving under the influence. His sentence was enhanced for being a persistent violator.

News Report April 21, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Krystal Meyer, of Twin Falls, has been charged with eight felony counts of insufficient funds following about a six month period of purchases exceeding bank deposits and returned checks to area retailers. According to reports, more than \$5,000 worth of checks were returned with "not sufficient funds" or a closed account. Meyer's preliminary hearing is set for April 29th and bond is set at \$10,000.

News Report April 21, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Dustin Andresen, of Filer was arraigned Wednesday in Twin Falls County Magistrate Court on a felony count of aggravated battery. According to reports Andresen was involved in an early-morning fight Feb. 7th outside The Pocket and punched a man in the head who later had blurred vision and needed surgery on his eye.

News Report April 21, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Ricardo Tobias Jr., of Buhl, one of two men charged with robbery in a bizarre pre-Christmas attack at the Magic Valley Mall pleaded guilty to a lesser charge Wednesday and agreed to a five-year prison term despite a judge questioning his acceptance of the “pretty heavy” sentence. As part of the plea deal, prosecutors reduced his felony robbery charge to a felony burglary charge and Tobias agreed to serve all five years in prison without eligibility for parole.

News Report April 22, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Police arrested William Walker and James Jones both of Twin Falls, Wednesday morning during a raid near the airport as part of an investigation that included confidential informants, undercover officers, secret tracking devices and thousands of dollars’ worth of methamphetamine. Walker and Jones were arraigned Thursday in Twin Falls County Magistrate Court on two felony drug charges. Walker is charged with trafficking in methamphetamine, Jones is charged with possession of a controlled substance and both are charged with conspiracy to traffic in methamphetamine.

News Report April 22, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

According to reports, an individual broke into Simerly's Market in Wendell. The suspect, who management believes is a female around 5'4, broke in through an office, and spent time looking around multiple parts of the store. The suspect only got away with a little bit of cash. Simerly is also looking for information about a car seen nearby. The store is considering a \$1000 reward for anyone with information that leads to an arrest in this case. The Gooding County Sheriff's office is also investigating the burglary.

News Report April 22, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

A Burley parent has voiced concern about the way White Pine Intermediate School and the school district handled an apparent attempted abduction last week. Two men have been arrested on attempted kidnapping charges after three girls on the playground reported being grabbed by a man and a fourth child said she was grabbed by the arm as she walked to school. According to reports, the district posted a warning to parents on Facebook late in the day, but no emergency notification was sent out to parents. Officials at other schools said they did not receive the notification until after school when they checked their email.

News Report April 25, 2016 – Broadcast at 6AM, 7AM, and 8AM Duration 1 minute

Melvin Simpson and Vadian Dougal are accused of attempting to abduct White Pine Intermediate School students on April 11th, in Burley. Simpson is charged with two counts of misdemeanor battery and two counts of felony second degree kidnapping. The school was already on high alert after receiving more than 150 phone calls and numerous emails — some threatening — after the lawsuit story broke. The suit accuses the school of fostering a climate of abuse and racism, turning a blind eye as the boy was abused for months.

You can look to see if an organization is registered with governmental organizations to be safe, like the attorney general's office.

Hastings' parent company, Draw Another Circle, announced Monday it is in a 30-day sales process following filing for Chapter 11 bankruptcy. The future of the company is uncertain. According to reports, several policy changes have already taken effect, including a July 13th expiration date on gift cards; Hastings will not accept or honor customer deposits for future movie purchases; existing deposits may be applied toward additional purchases in the store; game rentals will no longer be available; and Hastings' buyback program has been suspended.

Omar Mateen, of Fort Pierce, Florida who pledged allegiance to ISIS gunned down 50 people early Sunday at a gay nightclub in Orlando, the deadliest mass shooting in the United States and the nation's worst terror attack since 9/11. According to reports, Mateen carried an assault rifle and a pistol into the packed Pulse club about 2 a.m. Sunday and started shooting, killing 50 people and wounding at least 53. After a three hour stand-off with people trapped in the club, police crashed into the building with an armored vehicle and stun grenades and killed Mateen. There has been no claim of responsibility for the attack on jihadi (gee-hah-dee) forums, but ISIS sympathizers have reacted by praising the attack on pro-

Islamic State forums. Authorities are saying that Mateen with highly organized and well prepared, but it appears as though he was acting alone.
