When she didn't see him in his chair, she ran downstairs and found him unresponsive in the water. Still alive, Danny was rushed to the ER and placed on life support. Two days later, he died, leaving Anne with intense grief. A few years later in February 2018, while she was writing this book, her beloved father died at age 99. While his death was not unexpected, the loss was no less profound. Only six months later, in August 2018, Anne was diagnosed with breast cancer. In the past year, she has undergone surgery, radiation, and finished the last of her chemo infusions in Sept., 2019.</p>

Eventually, doctor's diagnosed Peggy with FTD - Fronto Temporal Dementia. An MRI revealed her frontal lobe had shrunk, and there were holes throughout her brain. With a prognosis from the medical community of no hope of recovery, Peggy's family reached out to other relatives and friends for prayer. Since that day, not only did Duane notice a difference in Peggy's cognition, behavior and motor skills, so did the doctors. So much so, that by Christmas of that same year, the doctors and staff of the memory unit agreed that Peggy was well enough to be discharged and sent home. Though a CAT scan shows Peggy still has an abnormal brain, her condition has never regressed and she has never had to return to the memory unit. Her family says they owe it all to God and the power of prayer.</p>

Katherine became rebellious and sought comfort in alcohol at a young age. At 13, she ran away and began living on the streets. Katherine was then sent to live in the young women's residences at Boys' Town, where she lived with a stable, loving family. Katherine got clean, made good grades and was even a cheerleader and prom queen at the high school she attended. Her senior year, she got an unexpected phone call from her mom. The two reconciled for a while, but then their relationship soured, sending Katherine down an emotional spiral again. Several more arrests followed. While she was in jail, Katherine began seeking God. Later, her father introduced Katherine to a friend who was a Christian. Despite the power of this supernatural experience, Katherine was tempted by drugs one last time and sent back to jail. Katherine was once again released to attend a halfway house treatment program. She also began studying scripture, and plugged into a local church. She has reconciled with her parents, and is involved with a messianic Jewish dance ministry in Atlanta, and knows she is finally free indeed.</p>
