Manager's Memo

As part of KUED's Homeless in Utah Project, KUED presents a new half-hour documentary, **A Home of Their Own**, focusing on homeless families, and an encore of **Homeless at the End**. The programs will air back-to-back on Monday, February 26 beginning at 8:00 p.m.

A Home of Their Own, produced by KUED's Sally Shaum, looks at three homeless families who have been living at The Road Home family shelter in Midvale, Utah. The ultimate goal of the shelter is to help people move into their own home as soon as possible. But, as the film points out, that road to self-reliance is often paved with barriers beyond a family's control. A variety of factors contribute to homelessness, but often it's a single life crisis that can push a family into an emergency shelter.

The film will be followed by a repeat of KUED's **Homeless at the End** at 8:30 p.m. A public screening and panel discussion of **A Home of Their Own** is set for Tuesday, February 20 at the Megaplex Theatres at the Gateway. More than just television, KUED creates awareness and dialogue around important issues affecting our community.

Masters: Maya Angelou about the iconic American writer/poet/activist on Friday, February 16 at 8:00 p.m.; **Independent Lens: We Are Rising: The Story of Black Colleges and Universities** on Monday, February 19 at 8:00 p.m.; and **We'll Meet Again: Freedom Summer** about the reunion of two people who met registering voters during the civil rights movement in the 1960s on Tuesday, February 20 at 7:00 p.m.

Also of note this month are history programs that explore pivotal moments in U.S. and world history. **American Experience: The Gilded Age** on Tuesday, February 6 at 8:00 p.m. presents the compelling and complex story of the convulsive and transformative era in American history during the closing decades of the nineteenth century when national wealth expanded and two classes rose simultaneously. **NOVA: Great Escape at Dunkirk** on Wednesday, February 14 at 8:00 p.m. looks at the rescue of more than 300,000 Allied troops trapped on the beaches of Dunkirk, France. Had Operation Dynamo failed, Britain could have been forced to surrender to the Nazis.

Alta is referred to as a “skier’s mountain” for many reasons. It is known for its scenery, diverse terrain, and for the uncanny quality of snow that it receives season after season. Readers of ski magazines consistently rank Alta at the top in the U.S. for powder, snow quality, terrain, and value.

This year, Alta celebrates its 80th year of providing skiers with the Greatest Snow on Earth. Opening its slopes in 1938, Alta has a rich history that includes the visionaries like Joe Quinney, who created the founding efforts, and Alf Engen, who confirmed in 1935 that the top of Little Cottonwood Canyon was the best place for a ski area.

There is a spirit to Alta. Perhaps it is because generations of skiers have been able to pass on their love for the mountain to family and friends. It may be because there is a bit of a “purist’s” feel. Whatever the reason, Alta is a place that many local and destination skiers choose to call home. It is one of the few places in the country that doesn’t allow other types of winter recreation other than skiing. Alta is one of only three areas in the United States that does not allow snowboarding.
