Program: On Delmarva

Airs: Sunday mornings 6-6:30am

ISSUE: Community Activities Airdate: Sunday, October 2

Spoke with Jimmy Sweet about the Delmarva Shorebirds Halloween Movie Night and Trick or Treating event set to take place at Arthur W. Perdue Stadium on October 22nd. This event is a fun night out for all ages which features trick or treating on the concourse and the showing of The Ghostbusters movie.

Airdate: Sunday, December 18

Spoke with Carrie Samis, director of Main Street Princess Anne about their New Year's Eve Muskrat Dive. This event features oysters, FREE Smith Island cake, music, and the featured DIVE of the Muskrat. Marshall the Muskrat is a stuffed critter dressed in a tuxedo, and he has the honor of ringing in the new year.

ISSUE: Catastrophic Childhood Illness

Airdate: Sunday, October 9

Spoke with Wayne Littleton, director of the Believe In Tomorrow Children's House By The Sea about their upcoming prom for adults fundraiser, as well as the many events leading up to this event slated for February 4, 2023. The Believe In Tomorrow Children's House By The Sea is a non-profit organization that provides vacation getaways to critically ill children and their families free of charge. The prom event is one of their biggest fundraising events.

Spoke with Maria McEvoy, chairperson for the Jingle Balls Bash event set for December 17th in Ocean City. ISSUE: Developmental Disabilities Airdate: Sunday, October 16

Spoke with Janine Lis of the Benedictine School about their upcoming golf tournament. The Benedictine School helps those with developmental disabilities live their best life in the community. It assists them with learning, finding jobs and thriving in everyday life. The Benedictine School is in Ridgely, MD.
