WTQR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **4H Programs for Kids:** Peggy talked about the summer plant sale and how it raises money for programs for kids involved in 4H programs throughout Guilford County. She also talked about the different programs that are offered to kids.
