

The stations at Clear Channel Radio Greensboro, WTQR, WMAG, WMKS, WPTI and WVBZ, feel the following issues are important to the community in the Triad and surrounding area.

1: Safety:

- Woman hit by bullet that may have been fired up in the air during a NYE celebration.
- Lexington Police charged 45 people at the end of a seven-month undercover drug roundup...called operation Street Sweep
- East Forsyth High School resource officer facing criticism after using a taser gun to break up a fight between two students
- New law tracks all of us in an effort to block meth users from buying pseudophedrine.
- More than 200 law enforcement officers from the Piedmont area will be used at the Democratic National Convention in Charlotte
- Candor Police department controversy leaves town without a Police Chief for weeks.
- The Winston-Salem Police Department kicked off it's Chat With The Chief program to give citizens the opportunity to get one-on-one time with the Police Chief to express concerns.
- Graham County woman put in jail for child abuse after a pit-bull attacked her grandson.
- New rules passed by Charlotte City Council gives law enforcement the power to stop and search people.
- Nearly 200 dogs were seized from an alledged puppy mill in stokes county.
- City of King decides NOT to disband it's police department to try and save money
- Greensboro's Parks & Recreation Commission, not enough votes to uphold a ban concealed weapons in city parks with playgrounds or athletic facilities.
- Rockingham deputies seized 1,100 pounds of marijuana, thousands of dollars and a gun from a home.
- Deputies in Alamance county have arrested five teenagers for cyber-bullying.
- A campus security drill, staging a mock shooting and hostage situation was held at Alamance County Community College
- Greensboro & Winston Salem hold drug disposal programs to safely dispose of unused medication
- Chapel Hill voted to become the first city in the state to ban all cell phone use while driving.

2: Health:

- Mad Horse Disease Appears in NC
- State Attorney General cracks down on Medicaid fraud

- A Hoke County preschooler was told her lunch did not meet USDA guidelines, garnering national attention.
- Youth Risk Behavior survey shows 51% of high schoolers in NC have had sexual intercourse & 30% of middle schoolers have tried alcohol.
- Youth Risk Behavior holds a meeting to educate parents on risky behavior of teens.
- Greensboro & Winston Salem hold drug disposal programs to safely dispose of unused medication
- Mayor of Winston-Salem has started a campaign against childhood obesity.
- Smoking ban inside bars and restaurants upheld

- High Point University adding 116 new jobs... the university is the city's eighth largest employer.
- Greensboro College is going to raise their tuition by 2.5%
- The Governor found 9 million dollars to enroll more students for Pre-Kindergarten.
- Youth Risk Behavior holds a meeting to educate parents on risky behavior of teens.
- NC receives praise for improving it's High School graduation rates.
- Plans for a new elementary school in Guilford County move forward
- The State Dept of Public Instruction launched their annual working conditions survey

- DNC leaders announcing that the 2012 convention will be shortened by one day and take place in three Charlotte-area venues
- More than 200 law enforcement officers from the Piedmont area will be used at the Democratic National Convention in Charlotte
- NC Gay Marriage Ban Supporters "Vote FOR Marriage NC" launched campaign to protect traditional marriage rights that defines marriage between a man and a woman.
- A documentary film about a Camp Lejeune Marine was nominated for an Oscar
- ICE officials fined a Burlington based company more than \$400-thousand dollars.
