WVBZ provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Activities and education for children:** Activities for kids in the new 4-H. Talked about the activities for kids that will be coming up in 2014 including the free summer camp.
- **Child Safety in the home:** The Guilford County Department of Public Health discussed how to detect if there is lead based paint in the home. If it is there how to safely remove it. Lead based paint is especially dangerous for children. Lead based paint is also found in some toys. Discussed how to make sure that your children do not have any of these types of toys.
- **Cystic Fibrosis:** Mark talked about some of the new treatments that have come along due to research into cystic fibrosis. He talked about the physical routine he has to use to keep his daughters lungs clear so she can breathe. Also discussed fund raising for cystic fibrosis.
- **Homelessness:** Partners Ending Homelessness leads a strong, collaborative network that includes over 80 community partners working together to effectively address individual and family homelessness through the system of care in our community. PEH will: CONNECT partners and the local community to resources needed to end homelessness in Guilford County. Unite county-wide community partners Foster collaborations, partnerships and joint initiatives to increase access to services and reduce homelessness Provide public education about homelessness to encourage public involvement Link individuals and families to community resources SUPPORT an effective service system by functioning as the hub for data collection and use, performance improvement, and training. Develop and monitor system wide strategic objectives, data quality, and performance measures Lead annual Point in Time Count Provide training and technical support to partner agencies RESTORE lives in by securing and administering funding and leading initiatives for emergency and permanent solutions to homelessness in Guilford County. Acquire resources for supportive housing alternatives Encourage a system-wide practice to prevent entry into the homeless service system Advocate for stronger policies, supports, and housing opportunities
- **Hunger and Homelessness:** Hunger and homelessness continue to be a problem in the Triad. We talked about how Urban ministry is trying to address these problems with their food pantry and housing for the homeless. They are in need of donations of food and donations of volunteer help to meet the needs.
- **Hunger in the Triad:** Chuck Harmon with 2nd Harvest Food Bank of North West North Carolina talked about the overwhelming demand they have been

facing for providing food for those in need in our area. Donations are down and demand is up. He talked about the need for more volunteers and more donations from businesses and individuals.

- **Local Gardening to benefit the economy and diets:** We discussed Local community gardens and school based gardens to teach the children just where the food they eat comes from. Importance of growing local gardens to nutrition and growing the local economy.
- **Local Politics:** 6th District Republican Congressman Howard Coble is retiring after this term. We talked about how he became North Carolina's current longest serving congressman. What he has experienced over the last 30 years serving in congress and what we should expect in the future. We discussed what he regards as his best votes and his worst votes.
- **Lupus:** Lupus Foundation of Am NC Chapter. The Lupus Foundation of America, North Carolina Chapter (LFANC) is part of a national force devoted to solving the cruel mystery of lupus while providing caring support to those who suffer from its brutal impact. The LFANC is the only statewide lupus organization in North Carolina. The Annual NC Lupus Summit is the largest educational conference on lupus in the state and provides a variety of discussions led by physicians and other experts dedicated to solving the cruel mystery of lupus.
- **Military Families:** Fisher House Foundation is best known for a network of comfort homes where military and veterans (tm) families can stay at no cost while a loved one is receiving treatment. These homes are located at major military and VA medical centers nationwide, close to the medical center or hospital they serve. Fisher Houses have up to 21 suites, with private bedrooms and baths. Families share a common kitchen, laundry facilities, a warm dining room and an inviting living room. Fisher House Foundation ensures that there is never a lodging fee. Since inception, the program has saved military and veterans (tm) families an estimated \$200 million in out of pocket costs for lodging and transportation. Fisher House Foundation also operates the Hero Miles program, using donated frequent flyer miles to bring family members to the bedside of injured service members as well as the Hotels for Heroes program using donated hotel points to allow family members to stay at hotels near medical centers without charge. The Foundation also manages a grant program that supports other military charities and scholarship funds for military children, spouses and children of fallen and disabled veterans.
