• July 1, 2023

Kearney, NE - An Alliance native and University of Nebraska Kearney student recently earned a 1st place award at a National Leadership Conference. Courtney Cox of Alliance was one of eight UNK students who earned ten awards at the Future Business Leaders of America National Leadership Conference from, June 22-25 in Atlanta Georgia. Courtney won the first place award in the Foundations of Finance category and the Alliance native also took Fourth place in the Finance Case Competition.

The annual conference gives FBLA members from colleges and universities across the country an opportunity to network, attend leadership workshops and compete in events testing their business knowledge and skills. The top 10 performers in each event were recognized June 25 during the Awards of Excellence Ceremony.

July 6, 2023

Scottsbluff, NE - The Nebraska Department of Transportation announced projects to done in the Nebraska Panhandle through 2028 and 2029 recently. The Star Herald reported on Wednesday that there was a 40.9 million dollar project for District 5 that includes 11 counties in the panhandle.

That project will be working to resurface 9.1 miles of Nebraska Highway 71, north of Scottsbluff in Sioux County. Another project with be south of Watson Ranch and will run toward Box Butte County. More details about the NDOT projects can be found in their Surface Transportation Program book.

AllianceThe Alliance Police Department has focused their efforts in the last couple of years on lowering the crime rate in town and Police Chief Phil Lukens says that the evidence and numbers point to that happening.

Lukens says that when he was hired in December of 2020, in March of 2021 there was an article that Alliance was in the Top 10 Worst Cities to live in State of Nebraska, and Lukens explains what the Alliance Police Department has done and what the results have shown. "In our Strategic Plan, we have worked very hard at implementing a lot of programs, working with the community and really having a dialog together," Lukens said. "At the end of the day, this last march 2023 Alliance was rated in the top ten safest cities to live in Nebraska."

Lukens says that with the current rate of improvement, he envisions Alliance being the safest city in Nebraska at some point in the near future. Looking at the numbers, overall crime in Alliance was down 31% in 2022 compared to 2021, and 2023 could be a record low year if trends stay the same. Alliance, NE - A man is lucky to be alive after his truck and trailer struck a train in Box Butte County on Friday afternoon

Authorities say the incident happened a 4:14 p.m. Friday when a man driving a white pick up truck and trailer was going over Madison westbound and struck the train.

No details have emerged about what caused the accident, but law enforcement officials say the man is fortunate to not have any injuries, though the truck did sustain some damages.

Nebraska State Patrol and the Box Butte County Sheriff's Office were on scene and were assisted by the Alliance Police Department.

• Aug 21, 2023

Alliance, NE - PPHD announced their their first West Nile Virus death for the 2023 season.

The name of the deceased individual has not been released, but the PPHD said in a statement that since 2002, there have been 101 reported deaths in Nebraska according to the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (NDHHS).

Melissa Haas, Environmental Health Coordinator with PPHD says that there are certain precautions people should take.

"As school is back in session, we know people are excited for activities like football, but please be mindful that mosquitoes primarily feed at dawn and dusk so as Panhandle residents go to support their favorites athletes, it is particularly important to take important precautions." Haas said. "Put on bug spray until it freezes for the first time."

Chadron, NE - A Wyoming man was arrrested following a pursuit in Dawes County on Monday night. The Nebraska State patrol were informed that Fall River County Sheriff's Deputies were pursuing a vehicle traveling South towards Nebraska on Highway 385 at 8:40 p.m. MT.

Alliance, NE -The City of Alliance announced on Thursday that Phillip Lukens has submitted his resignation as Police Chief of Alliance.

Lukens has held the position since Dec. 2020, and his resignation is effective beginning Sept. 15, 2023.

Lieutenant Kirk Felker has been appointed Interim Police Chief while the city completes their search for a new Chief.

Alliance City Manager Seth Sorensen issued a statement on Luken's resignation stating: "On behalf of the City of Alliance, we wish Chief Lukens the very best in his future endeavors."

As of this release, no reason for Lukens's resignation has been made known to the public and he has not issued a statement on his resignation at this time.

Terrytown, NE Terrytown native was arrested on Tuesday night after striking a man at Short Stop on 2002 Ave I. Scottsbluff Police arrived on scene at 7:20 pm where they found a 1992 green Honda Goldwing lying on its side and a 2005 green Ford Freestyle parked on a gas pump.

An investigation by Scottsbluff Police determined that the Ford Freestyle driven by 62-year Renee Mueller Fieck, continued backing in a circle when she struck 49-year-old Brent Kreiling, a pedestrian from Terrytown who was standing next to the Honda Goldwing.

Kreiling was transported to Regional West Medical Center by Valley Ambulance for treatment of his injuries. Fieck was subsequently arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol Resulting in Serious Bodily Injury, Disorderly Conduct, and No Operators License.
