After the murder of Tyre Nichols in Memphis, Dr. AR Bernard got together with other pastors and leaders to pray over what is happening in our nation. Each citizen has a role and a function that they are responsible for, not just for this generation, but for the generations to come. There was a time when black people were not allowed to be police officers. For five civil servants to beat a colored citizen to death, discourages people of color from trusting police officers and even joining the police force themselves. The hope that getting individuals of color into the Police Department would help to change the negative narrative within society about police officers which has been tainted by the incident. It seems that the officers from Memphis adopted a culture that requires dismantling. Competent credible individuals who could go into law enforcement don't want to, because of negative public sentiment about being a law enforcement officer. Some people of color want to, but don't take on the job because in context of their color, they feel they are betraying their community. AR Bernard relates Daniel from the bible to people of color today, he says, "Daniel and his men were 10x better than the others in that same position in the King's court, so is it when you are a minority coming into the dominant culture, you must work harder. You must be 10x better because you are being judged by a different standard. The bar is higher when you are a minority in any context."

If one has an eschatology that is collective, which includes the impact on the whole body, this person could be more socially and politically engaged, because they believe they have a responsibility to manifest God's justice in the earth.

When she was 14 years old, she was sent to juvenile and later was placed in a reform school called White's Residential and Family Services. Billy Ballenger was given up for adoption and struggled to fit in causing him to run away from home at an early age. He too was sent to White's Residential and Family Services where he met Jodie. After being released from reform school, Billy moved in with Jodie and they became pregnant, so they decided to get married at the age of 17 & 18. By the time they were 18 & 19, Billy and Jodie had a flow of known felons in and out of their home (known as the party house). One day a SWAT team raided their house and took away their baby girl because of the violent atmosphere. At this time, they were arrested and faced many trials. In 2015, 3 men were on a crime spree in the city of Indianapolis. They broke into the home 3 doors down from the Blackburn's house. After seeing Davey Blackburn leave the house, the 3 men took this opportunity to continue their spree, but now in Davey's home. Davey came back home to his wife, Amanda, lying in a pool of blood on their living room floor laboriously breathing, unconscious, and unresponsive. Amanda, at the time, was pregnant with their second child and Davey originally thought that there was an issue with her pregnancy until he realized that his wife had suffered 3 qunshot wounds. Four years to the day of Amanda's murder, they moved to Indianapolis in hope to continue their ministerial passions in a new city. After the murder of his wife, Davey's faith was tested, and he was unsure of how he could move himself to forgive and started to become numb and suppress the pain that he was enduring. Davey's redemption story begins when he receives a text from Pastor Levi Lusko who lost his daughter only a few years earlier. Levi spoke to Davey about running towards the roar. Levi encouraged Davey to rather than suppress his emotions, to instead lean into his emotions and see them as something that was given to him from God as well as an invitation from God into deeper healing and forgiveness. An urgency kindled inside Davey's heart after receiving this advice and he was moved to intercept kids and teenagers in the inner-city Indianapolis area before they could step into a life of crime and drug-related activity. During this time Davey began to heal and forgive. Davey receives a sign from God that all is working for good when he meets a woman at his gym who eventually begins to attend and serve at the church he is pastoring. She shares that she knows his story and that her stepfather is assigned as the Chaplain for the prison where his wife's murderers are serving their sentence and preaches the gospel to them every week. Davie eventually remarries to this woman. Together they have acquired a deep purpose to help people heal and seek an even deeper redemption through unforgiveness towards their enemies. Their ministry is called Nothing is Wasted Ministries.

Tammy Trent speaks with Life Outreach International Missionary Partner, Carol Hart, who Co-Founded Zoe International. Carol and her husband, Mike, moved from Hollywood to begin doing missionary work in Southeast Asia and have been doing it for 20 years. Her heart was broken when hearing from a missionary that in Southeast Asia a person can rent a little boy or a little girl from a menu on the street corners to do anything they want, even sexual acts. Research shows that a child who is trafficked by the age of 12 has been raped at least 5000 times. Even though they were unqualified, Carol and her husband, Mike, heard the call from God to help the trafficked children in Southeast Asia and obeyed wholeheartedly. Not knowing how they were going to combat the evils of human trafficking; they came across an opportunity to partner with Life Outreach International. Carol and Life Outreach came together to purchase a house in Southeast Asia where they now house the rescued children and provide them with the restoration they need. Within this house they serve many who are in need, from orphans who are in danger to children who have been trafficked. If the trafficked survivors do not have a family to go back to, they are then raised long-term in this facility until they are age appropriate to live on their own safely and freely. Once rescued the inner work of healing and freedom begins. Zoe International works with children who have experienced severe trauma repeatedly causing them to become angry, frustrated, and sometimes violent. They help to heal the children from complex trauma and patiently wait until the child is ready and willing to move on in a positive direction. The short-term solution is getting the children out of the trafficking system. The children will first arrive at their safehouse, Child Rescue Center, until their perpetrators' trial or until they can safely go home. If the child does not have a safe place to go home, the child will then move into long-term housing. Once they are age appropriate, they are free to leave (when they feel they are ready to survive on their own). Zoe International will assist the survivor with whatever they may need for a smooth transition outside of the Outreach Housing. To ensure a successful transition, Zoe International makes sure that the child survivor is truly free from the trauma and brokenness they encountered. The long-term solution is teaching the survivors the gospel to help them open their hearts to Jesus.

Over the next hour I'll be joined by a group of experts who studied this disturbing movement in depth. They say it's all too real and that it's not a conspiracy theory if the people behind it are saying out loud what they intend to do. Imagine a world with no paper money or coinage where all currency is digital and transactions can be made with the wave of a hand. That's the vision of the great reset. It all sounds very convenient, but what happens if you oppose the policies of the powers that be, whether on say climate change, human sexuality, or abortion? In a world of digital currency, could your ability to buy and sell be cut off if you don't fall in line? From Pharoah to Rome, from Napoleon to Hitler. Many empires have tried to impose their will on the world, but none of them had the advanced technology that we have today. With everything from the internet to A.I. it's technology that in many cases can is used for good but can easily be misused by those who have an obsession with control. For supporters of the great reset, China serves as a model. The communist regime in Beijing has imposed a surveillance state where every move is tracked. Every citizen is given a social credit score based on their loyalty to the regime and its agenda. Reggie Littlejohn is an expert on China's one child policy of forced abortions. She's seen the tyranny of China's government up close and she's sounding the alarm that it could come here courtesy of the great reset. Amid all the sweeping changes that the World Economic Forum and other proponents of the great reset have put forward, one name is never mentioned God. How should Christians view this great reset and does it seek to place man above the Almighty? A one world government and uniting mankind under one all powerful regime is an idea that's as old as time itself. The Bible tells the story of the tower of Babel of Nimrod and his attempts to subjugate the world under his rule and build a tower that would reach to heaven. God had other plans. Yet that still hasn't stopped a long line of tyrants throughout history from driving towards the same goal. Could the great reset be laying the groundwork for a future tyranny where technology enables a group of global elites to wield the kind of power and control that tyrants of the past could only dream of? The Bible says the one final leader will arise to rule the world. At least for a short time until God directly intervenes, just as He did in the time of Nimrod. Because while earthly kingdoms come and go, God still sits on the throne. The architects of the great reset would be wise to remember that and as followers of Jesus that fact should give us encouragement and the strength to face whatever the future may bring. Kim Jong-un's forces have already test fired dozens of ballistic missiles this year and are working on intercontinental missiles; ICBMs that could one day reach the United States. Meanwhile in the Middle East, the hour is late to stop Iran's nuclear program. At this point, perhaps, only Israel will prevent Iran's Ayatollahs from acquiring the world's deadliest weapons. Russia, China, North Korea, and Iran. Four governments with serious ideological differences that are nonetheless united by their hostility toward the U.S. and their desire to see America toppled as the world's superpower. How should we respond to these unprecedented challenges? These wars and rumors of wars. Is our leadership up to the task? In 2 Timothy 3, one of the big signs in end times culture that will precede the coming of Christ is that children will become disobedient to their parents because they will be trained and empowered by culture, instead of by God-fearing parents whose parental rights will be limited by law. Anti-Biblical values are now being taught to children within schools and universities beginning as early as elementary schools. This use of the schools and universities was predicted and prophesied by many of the early founders of today's most prestigious universities. Timothy Dwight, the President of Yale from 1795-1817, said. "To commit our children to the care of irreligious people is to commit lambs to the superintendency of wolves." In 1823, A. Hodge, The Principal of Princeton Seminary and Professor, predicted the U.S. school system would be the most efficient and widespread instrument for the propagation of atheism, which the world has ever known. Since then, the banning of prayer has been removed (1962) and now even the mention of God has been forbidden. There has even been an addition to the last amendment of Title Nine, which strips parents of their God-given parental authority, making it legal for schools to not seek parental permission for children to participate in lessons on choosing and changing one's sex. The rules also grant children an absolute right to use school facilities and participate in activities consistent with their gender identity regardless of whether their parents agree or are even aware of their child's choices. In Brookfield, Connecticut schools, there is an uproar because kids are freely able to walk into any facility and bathroom that they want to without the parents being aware that this is occurring. Schools are claiming legal authority to socially transition children without parental consent or knowledge. Schools in Alaska & California changed a child's name and pronouns without the parent's permission. If parents were to disagree, the schools then have the legal authority to prove that they are endangering the child and can file a report with Child Protective Services and have the child removed from the parent's home. A daughter was removed from her parents' home several years ago because the teacher thought that the reason the daughter was so respectful to all the teachers and students in school was because she must have been abused at home. DCF eventually removed the child from the home and prohibited the parents from being able to see her. It took 2 years for the parents to convince the judge that she was respectful because they raised her to be a Christ follower. Pastor Santora encourages parents to train their children in the Lord.

Founder and President of Mercy Multiplied, Nancy Alcorn, helps desperately broken young women ages 13 -32 suffering from addiction, eating disorders, physical and sexual abuse, depression, suicide, crime, and self-harm find real transformation. While working as an Athletic Director for a Female Juvenile Center, Nancy discovered that there was less than a 3% success rate for young girls surviving after they entered the prison system. Nancy was eager to help the young women by introducing Christ to them, however due to separation of church and state, she was unable to share the gospel with them. Nancy was so inspired to help them that she created the ministry, Mercy Multiplied, which has helped over 3000 girls find lasting freedom and hope in Christ. The average stay for an attendant is about 6 months, but for those who have dealt with severe situations like being sex trafficked, stay for 9-12 months. During their time at Mercy Multiplied, the young women are equipped to succeed in the world mentally and spiritually, dealing with any traumas that could prevent them from moving forward in life. Attendees have left the program and become doctors, college graduates, missionaries, and even employees for Mercy Multiplied.

By the age of 13, Caitlin Hawk, a young girl that grew up in the church, nationally ranked in the top 100 in sports, began experimenting with sexual immorality and alcohol. She didn't know how to get help, but she knew she needed to seek help somehow. While being 5 months pregnant at 5am, after a night of partying at a local college, she finally cried out to the Lord and gave her life over to Christ. After seeing the transformation of a friend of hers who attended Mercy Multiplied, a ministry that helps struggling young women, Caitlin decided to attend the same program and seek help. It was at Mercy Multiplied that she received the tools to overcome the destructive thinking that led to her life spiraling out of control. She realized her identity in Christ and replaced the lies that she had been bound by for many years with the truth of God's word. Caitlin stayed at Mercy Multiplied for about 8 months and was able to find a family to place her twins for adoption. She graduated from Mercy Multiplied in 2008. She is now delivered from alcohol and drug abuse, married with 2 children, an entrepreneur, and has helped free many other young women who experienced similar hardships that she faced.
