Staying active and eating a well-balanced diet are ways to prevent the risk of heart disease. However, a new study found that children and teens are doing their part. An American Heart Association report found far too few children and teens are taking certain healthy habits or steps to keep their ticker healthy. In fact, the study found that the behaviors about food and physical activeness are even worse than previously reported. More than half of children fail to get 60 minutes of recommended physical activity. In teens, the numbers are worse, with only five in 10 percent getting in that minimum activity time. When it comes to eating, the statistics can be alarming. Nine in 10 children and teens are not eating well-balanced diets.</p>

The academy's advice, published in a report Monday in its medical journal, Pediatrics, mirrors warnings from the Food and Drug Administration about using codeine for kids' coughs or pain. Studies suggest it is still commonly prescribed by doctors and dentists despite the risks and lack of evidence that it works to relieve coughs. Doctors and parents should choose another remedy when possible, including acetaminophen and ibuprofen for pain and simple remedies such as ice or popsicles after tonsillectomies, said Dr. Charles Cote, a Boston anesthesiologist and co-author of the report.</p>
